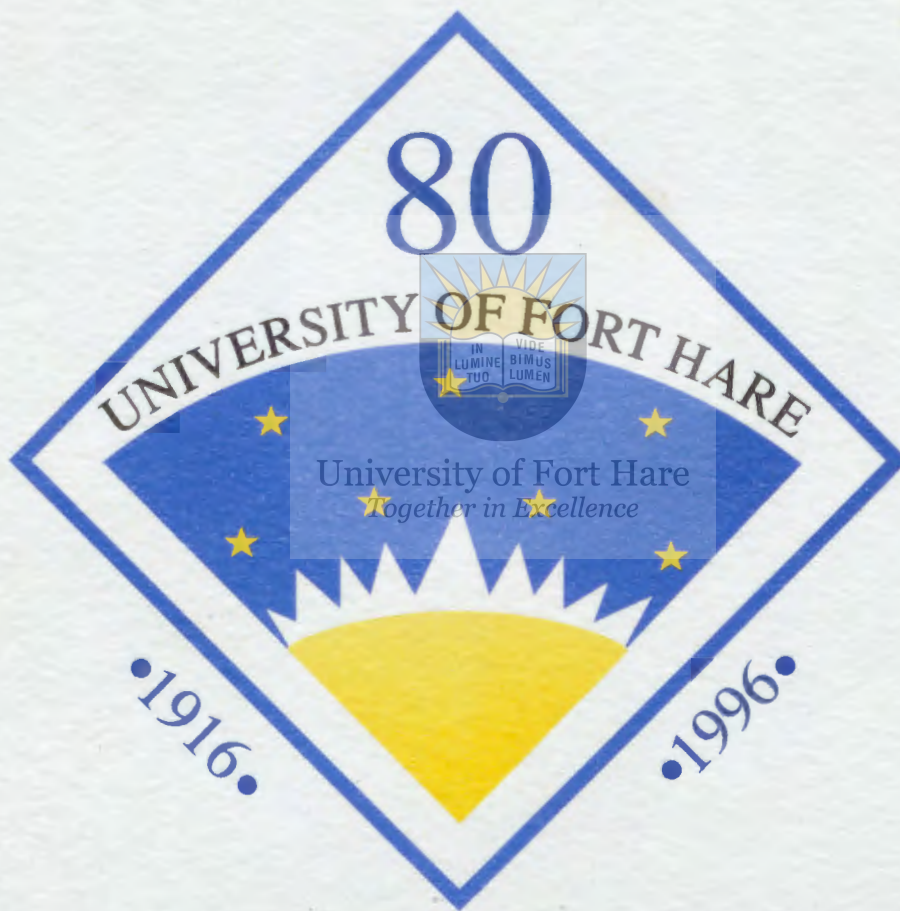

THE UNIVERSITY OF FORT HARE CRUCIBLE OF AFRICAN LEADERSHIP

The University of Fort Hare is the most historically significant institution for higher education in sub-equatorial Africa. Named after Colonel John Hare, lieutenant-governor of the eastern Cape Colony in the 1840's, the original Fort Hare was established in 1846 as a military base for the colonial invasion and conquest of the Ciskeian Xhosa chiefdoms. However, while the Amathole area was the scene of several Cape-Xhosa wars, for over a century and a half it has also been a prominent centre for African education. Beginning in the 1830's, fledgling mission schools were established at Tyume, Lovedale and Burnshill where the Xhosa language was given a written form. Later in the nineteenth century, the famous Lovedale College and the nearby Healdtown institution, both assisted by the Lovedale Press, began producing Southern Africa's first westernized and educated African elite.

During the first decade of the twentieth century, these emerging African leaders including J. Tengo Jabavu, founder of the newspaper *Imvo Zabantsundu*, together with their missionary allies, worked towards the creation of the first university in the sub-continent which would cater primarily for African students. In 1916 the South African Native College was opened near the ruins of John Hare's military post. The first staff member to be appointed was D.D.T. Jabavu, son of Tengo Jabavu and the first black South African to have received a university degree. Renamed the University College of Fort Hare, 1946 control of the institution passed from the missionaries to Rhodes University in Grahamstown.

From the 1920's to 1950's Fort Hare provided Africans from South Africa and beyond with opportunities for social and political mobility. The most notable former students from this period include Oliver Tambo, Nelson Mandela and Govan Mbeki of ANC fame; Robert Sobukwe who founded the PAC; Kaiser Matanzima and Mangosuthu Buthelezi who entered Bantustan politics; Robert Mugabe of Zimbabwe and Tshekedi Khama of Botswana. Not so well known, but also significant within the ranks of the alumni, were Eliud Mathu, who became the first African member of the Kenya Legislative Council, and Herbert Chitepo, a leading member of the Zimbabwe liberation movement who was assassinated in 1975. Up to the late 1950's Fort Hare, which had cultivated academic excellence in both teaching and research produced nearly all of sub-equatorial Africa's black university graduates and many of its early nationalists.

Tragically, in 1959 Fort Hare was taken over by the apartheid regime which broke the university's ties with Rhodes and replaced most of its liberal white staff with government-oriented personnel. Prominent African faculty members such as Professor Z.K. Matthews resigned in protest. Student enrolment dropped dramatically. Within a short time Fort Hare became incorporated into a system of ethnically oriented universities serving South Africa's nominally independent black homelands. Its importance for the rest of Africa had come to an abrupt end.

Throughout the 1960's and 1970's student leaders were moulded less in the classroom and increasingly came to the fore during sporadic protests which were repressed by the police. While both the ANC and PAC were active at Fort Hare at this time, of particular importance was Steven Biko's South African Students Organization (SASO). Following the 1976 Soweto riots, security forces invaded the campus and many students were expelled. Fort Hare erupted once again following the Ciskei's Pretoria-backed independence in 1981.

Protests continued throughout the 1980's and the trade union movement hit the campus with full force. From 1960 to 1990 the State had total control of appointments, promotions, programmes and financial support. However, a revolution of sorts occurred in 1990 when Ciskei President Lennox Sebe was toppled in a coup by Brigadier Oupa Gqozo. The repercussions were felt strongly at Fort Hare where the university council and the six top administrators resigned. For the first time, a black vice-chancellor was appointed.

"The history of Fort Hare cannot be retold as if it were one event", said Oliver Tambo when he was installed as chancellor in 1991. "It was, and is, the culmination of a drama of interpenetrating and at times, contradictory forces. It was moulded by the peculiarities of the history of this region of Southern Africa, and the struggles authored by the history".

PHYLLIS NTANTALA JORDAN

Honorary Doctor of Philosophy

Phyllis Ntantala Jordan was born in Idutywa and went to school in Healdtown. Her BA degree was obtained through UNISA in 1946 and she continued her studies at the University of Cape Town (Comparative African Government & Law) 1958 and Madison Area Technical College (Early Childhood Education) 1972.

Ms Jordan is a Teacher, Social Worker, Linguist and Author having worked in South Africa and the United States of America. Her essays, articles and poems have been widely published and she was the first writer on the "PLIGHT OF WOMEN UNDER APARTHEID IN THE 1950's".

"Ah! Rolihlahla" is an epic poem in Xhosa (with an English Translation) which was published in the anthology "AMANDLA MANDELA" on the occasion of Nelson Mandela's 70th birthday. She has conducted a number of presentations and seminars in the USA on publications by African author and she has also translated works from Xhosa to English and vice versa.

One of her essays "The Widows of the Reserves" first published in Africa South magazine in 1957, was included in the widely acclaimed anthology AN AFRICAN TREASURY; this essay has been translated into French, Dutch and Flemish.

Present work in progress are snippets of African History; a collection of folktales, myths and legends of South Africa for comparative study with those of America, Greece and Ancient Rome. In addition, she is writing short historical sketches of early missionary schools in the Eastern Cape.

Ready for publication are "Black South African Women : "who's who" (from the 19th century to the present) and biographical sketches of Noyi Balfour, JK Bokwe, Adam Kok and Thandiswa Jabavu.

AC Jordan's papers were catalogued by her for the University of Fort Hare Archives. Ms Jordan has participated in numerous conferences and forums in South Africa, Europe and the USA, on South Africa, Women's Issues, Literature and Education.

CURRICULUM VITAE

HONORARY DOCTORATE OF DR NTSU MOKHEHLE, MP

Dr Mokhehle was born in the City of Teyateyaneng in Lesotho on 26 December 1918. After completing matric he enrolled at the University of Fort Hare for a Bachelor of Science degree in 1944. Dr Mokhehle left Fort Hare in 1949 with Masters degree in Science.

During his stay at Fort Hare, Dr Mokhehle was actively involved in student affairs. In 1949 he was elected deputy chairman of the ANC Youth League. In 1952, he joined the Basutoland Congress Party.

He taught at various high schools between 1950 and 1955 and was a teacher's representative in the National Council. Dr Mokhehle flew to London to lobby the British on a new Constitution for Lesotho.

From 1960 to 1963, Dr Mokhehle was the leader of the opposition party Lesotho National Assembly. During this period, he was also a member of the Constitutional Commission Representing the Basutoland Congress Party.

In 1964, Dr Mokhehle was part of a delegation to London to negotiate for the pre-independence Constitution of Basutoland.

Dr Mokhehle won the first post-independence General Elections in 1970. His government was later overthrown and Dr Mokhehle fled into exile for 16 years after being imprisoned for two years.

Through his leadership, Dr Mokhehle has helped Basotho children to obtain scholarship from various overseas countries to advance their education. These subsequently served their country in various government and non governmental departments.

Dr Mokhehle's Basotho Congress Party helped in giving sanctuary to South Africa refugees who fled their country after being persecuted by the past apartheid South African government from 1960.

Dr Mokhehle led the Basutoland Congress Party into 1996 Lesotho General Elections, after 23 years of successive dictatorship, and got a landslide victory. He was subsequently elected the first Prime Minister in a democratic Lesotho.

Dr Mokhehle is married to Maneo and they have three children - Ts'eliso, Topollo and Mosongoa. Dr Mokhehle has written extensively including a profile on the late Lesotho Monarch Moshoeshoe I.

FWANYANGA MATALE MULIKITA

Fwanyanga Matala Mulikita was born on 24 November 1928 and is married with four (4) children and has an interest in writing, reading and farming.

He gained distinctions in English Literature and Science in the Cambridge School Certificate and obtained a Bachelor of Arts degree at Rhodes University in 1954 with a distinction in Psychology. A certificate in Freelance Journalism was obtained through International Correspondence Schools, London. In 1960 he graduated with Master of Arts in Psychology at the Stanford University, USA and in 1964 became an Associate Carnegie Fellow in International Relations and Diplomacy at Columbia University, USA.

His career started as a Clerk Interpreter in the High Court of Northern Rhodesia. After obtaining his Bachelor of Arts degree at Rhodes University became a Secondary School Teacher and in 1956 worked as a welfare officer with the Kitwe Municipality. Subsequently he became a Tutor at Kitwe Teachers Training College and in 1960 was Headmaster of Chalimbana Secondary School.

In 1964 he became Zambia's first Permanent Representative at the United Nations. In 1966 appointed Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Education and in 1968 Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

From 1969 he became a Cabinet Minister, Luapula Province and held the portfolio of:-

1968/1971 Minister of Health & Minister of Labour and Social Services.

1972/1973 Minister of Power, Transport and Works.

1973/1976 Minister of Education.

Thereafter became a member of the Central Committee, United National Independence Party (UNIP) and had been Chairman of the National Council (UNIP) 1972/1976.

In 1978 was Chairman of Council of the University of Zambia 1978/1981 and was Speaker of Parliament 1988/1991.

Other activities included being an Associate Member of the American Society of Clinical Hypnosis and practised at his own Psychological Clinic. In 1989 made an Honorary member of the Minnesota Society of Clinical Hypnosis.

He managed his own business 1982/1988 and is currently a partner of the Mental Health Association of Zambia.

MICHEAL LIBALA MAGWA

Michael Libala Magwa was born in Cape Town. He started his Primary education in Cape Town and completed it in Qumbu, Transkei. He obtained his Junior Certificate with a first class in Dilizintaba Secondary School in Tsolo in 1970. He matriculated at St John's College, Umtata in 1972.

Due to financial circumstances and laws of the country at the time, he could not be enrolled at the University of Cape Town or University of Western Cape. He started to work as a labourer at Petersen (South African Druggists) in 1973 in Epping Industrial Area in Cape Town. After six months, he became an analyst of pharmaceutical material in the same company where he also started a technical diploma in Chemical Engineering through International Correspondence school which was completed in 1975.

In 1975 he joined Fort Hare as a laboratory assistant in the Botany Department and was promoted to be a senior laboratory assistant in 1980. He studied by correspondence with Unisa and completed his BSc degree in 1981, majoring in Chemistry and Botany. At course II level, he obtained an award as the best chemistry student from Iscor. He continued to further his studies on a part-time basis and completed his BSc Honours degree in Botany in 1983 with Fort Hare. He became a lecturer in Botany in 1986. In 1987 he obtained his MSc degree in Botany at the University of Fort Hare with a dissertation entitled "Anatomy and photosynthetic characterization in selected Poaceae". He has been the Director of the Electron Microscope Unit since 1993.

Since 1982 up to the present, he has been teaching applied chemistry to student nurses during vacation periods at Lovedale Victoria hospital. He has done some rural development projects in promoting quality of life in Western Thembuland. As a result, he is one of the founder members of a NGO (Zimele Rural Community Project) which still serves those communities. He has been serving as a board member since 1991 and became chairman of the board in 1995. He has also assisted the local farmers in generating income from crop production in Qamata irrigation scheme and in biological control of weeds.

He serves as a member of the board of trustees for ACAT in the Eastern Cape and is involved in a newly established Fort Beaufort independent preparatory school where he is Chairman of the board of trustees and a member of its governing council.

Mr Magwa is an active member of the following educational organizations:

- (i) South African Association of Botanists,
- (ii) Electron Microscopy Society of Southern Africa
- (iii) South African Weed Science Society.

His doctoral thesis, entitled "An investigation into the enzymes of the guttation fluid of plants" sheds new light on the origin of guttation fluid peroxidases, acid phosphatases and esterases. Some of this work has been published in the international journal "Phytochemistry", and also presented at several conferences.

HONORARY DOCTORATE OF DR. DONALD G.S. M'TIMKULU

After leaving Lovedale College, Dr M'Timkulu enrolled at Fort Hare University where he passed his BA degree with distinction in 1928. He proceeded to the University of South Africa where he graduated with Masters degree in English in 1931.

Dr M'Timkulu received a Ph.D. (Sociology of Education) at The University of Natal in 1955. He was the first African headmaster of a high school with an inter-racial staff which admitted students all over Sub-Sahara Africa at Adams College.

He held lecturing posts in Sociology at the Universities of Fort Hare and Natal between 1943 and 1959. Dr M'Timkulu resigned from Fort Hare in protest of the imminent take-over of the University College by the then apartheid government and the introduction of apartheid education.

He left the country to Pittsburgh University in the United States of America where he became a scholar in International Studies. He held several professorships in United States universities and was a visiting lecturer at Oxford University in London.

Dr M'Timkulu also traveled extensively in Africa dealing with emergency assistance and developing unity and co-operation among Protestant Churches in 41 African countries.

He was the director of Mindolo Ecumenical Foundation, Kitwe in Zambia. The Foundation was a training institution offering adult education in civil administration, government, political science and economics for leaders of newly independent countries.

He held various posts in the Zambian Ministry of Education.

Dr M'Timkulu has written extensively. Among his published works are:

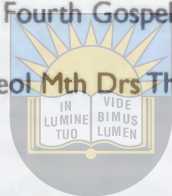

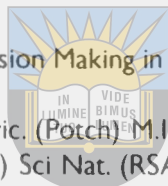
