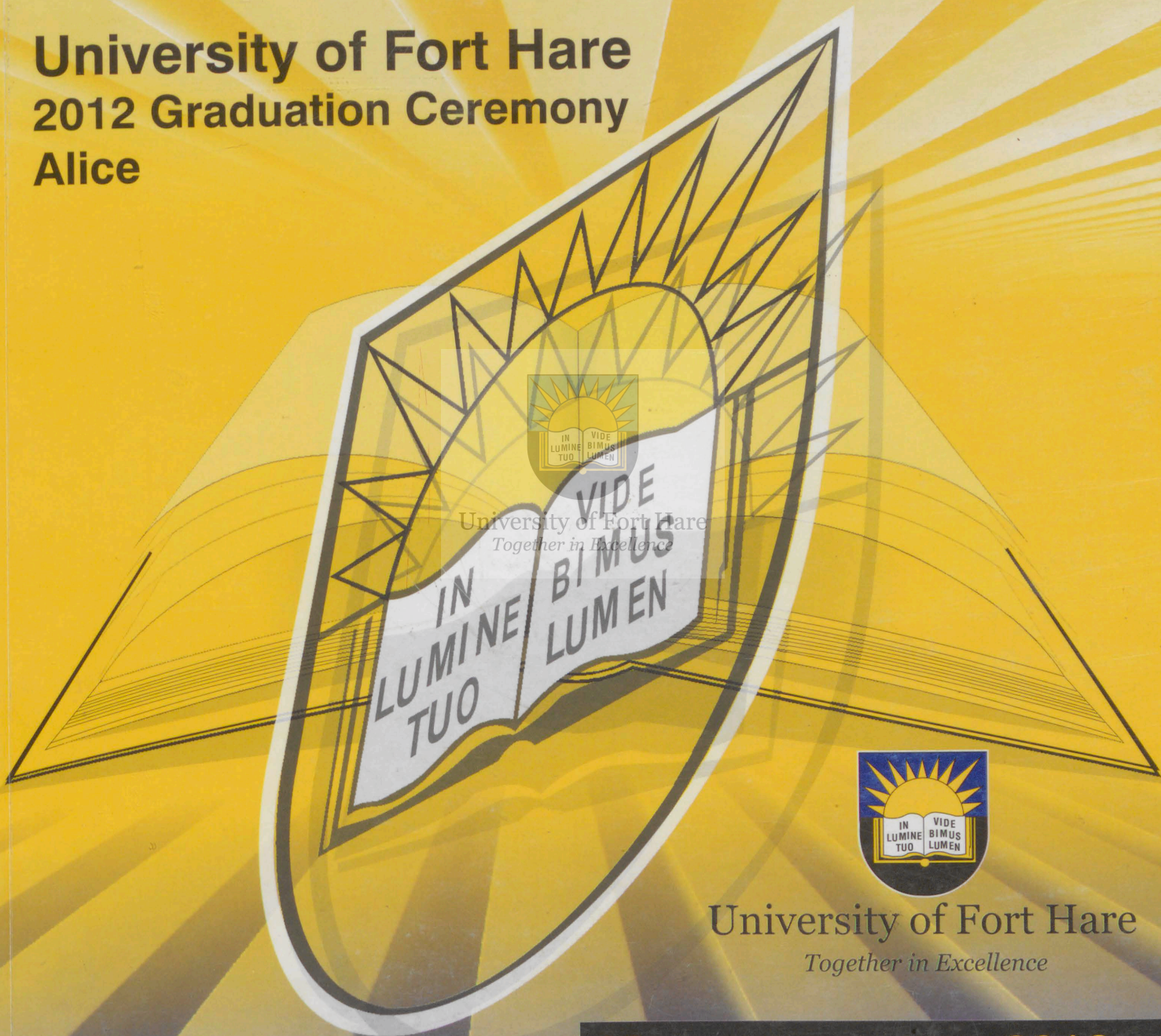

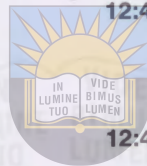

HONORARY DOCTORATE DEGREE

CITATION: DR. SADIE FORMAN - DOCTOR OF LITERATURE AND PHILOSOPHY (D LITT ET PHIL) IN HISTORY (GRADUATION, MAY 2012)

Sadie Forman was born in South Africa, on the 26th February 1927 to a Lithuanian Jewish immigrant family. Her father was a revolutionary Marxist who was sent to a Siberian exile during the Tsarist era in Russia, and left Russia to join his brother who had already settled in South Africa. Sadie's life was formed by these political roots in Marxism and she has had a lifelong adherence to the ideals of the Communist philosophy.

She matriculated in 1945 and became an Assistant in the laboratory of the Institute of Medical Research in Johannesburg until 1947. She registered as a part-time BA student at Wits in 1947 and to pay her fees worked as a nursery school teacher. At this point she joined the Yeoville branch of the South African Communist Party (SACP).

Through her political activities she got to know Lionel Forman around 1949 and thus followed a life in which she devoted herself entirely to this young revolutionary, and together they worked tirelessly for a non racial and non sexist South Africa. Lionel was physically weakened by a bout of rheumatic fever as a young boy, and both knew that his heart was dangerously damaged by this. She saw her role as one of supporting Lionel, as well as being engaged in his studies, writings, and political activism.

In 1951 Sadie and Lionel went to Prague (Czechoslovakia) to work for the International Union of Students for two years. They married there in June 1952 and in May 1953, their first son, Karl was born. In 1954 they returned to South Africa, where Lionel continued to train and practice as a lawyer. He was also preparing for doctoral studies until his involvement in politics resulted in his arrest and attendance of the Treason Trial in 1956. Sadie once again faced police harassment and financial difficulties as Lionel's partner, doing her best to bring up two sons while her husband moved between Cape Town and Johannesburg during the long and draining years of the Treason Trial.

Lionel's health deteriorated rapidly during this time and three days after the birth of their third child, Sara, he died on the operating theater in Groote Schuur Hospital. Sadie was left in

October 1959, devastated by the loss of her young husband and with three children to bring up on her own.

She continued to distribute revolutionary literature and had regular visits from the police in Cape Town. She was banned and restricted to one mile from her house, not able to meet more than two people at a time. She was prohibited from factories and education institutions which made both work and study difficult if not impossible. Finally, the stresses of bringing up three children in these extremely difficult circumstances compelled Sadie to leave South Africa in 1969 on an exit visa as her eldest son, Karl, was also facing the critical decision of army conscription.

Sadie worked as a teacher in London but always continued to support the ANC and SACP in exile. She worked tirelessly for the ANC Women's League in the UK, and for the Anti-Apartheid Movement in London. Sadie was also engaged in the research and writing about her husband's life which has resulted in two books. One she co-edited was a collection of his writings: *A Trumpet from the Housetops*, published by Zed Press in 1992.

When she returned to SA in 1998, to work in the archives at the University of Fort Hare, she brought back her husband's papers and donated them to the archives. She finally had time to write the memoirs of Lionel Forman which she aptly titled: *A Life too Short* and this was published by the University of Fort Hare Press/Iqula Publishing. This was a significant event given the close connection between Fort Hare and Lionel Forman in his days as a student activist.

While at Fort Hare Sadie contributed in numerous ways to raising awareness of the struggle through her work in preparing exhibitions for major events (e.g. the Z.K. Matthews Memorial Lecture and the Robert Sobukwe Memorial Lecture) in conjunction with the University Librarian, Yoli Soul. She also held informative and entertaining sessions with secondary school students in Alice, telling them the history of the struggle. She became a much loved and valued member of the Alice Fort Hare community. A close friend and associate



has described Sadie as: 'a natural intellectual; a profound thinker and analyst of political events; a deeply human and compassionate woman who has had a great impact on whoever meets her. She is also humorous, wise and great fun, she loves nothing better than to dance to South African musicians who formed part of her history. All her life she has evaded and avoided public recognition and reward. I think she now deserves to receive that recognition

For her lifelong commitment and participation in the political struggle for democracy, non racialism and non sexism in South Africa, as well as her outstanding work in preserving the philosophical and intellectual memory of her late husband, Lionel Forman, it is a distinct privilege for the University of Fort Hare to award the degree of Doctor of Literature and Philosophy (D Litt et Phil) in History on Sadie Forman.

MAKOMBE Rodwell

PROFILE

Rodwell Makombe was born in Masvingo, Zimbabwe, in 1979. He studied at the University of Zimbabwe, eventually completing an MA degree there, graduating in 2007, and then came to the University of Fort Hare in 2009 to pursue a D. Litt with the English Department.

The dissertation was completed between 2009 and 2011. The goal was to analyse texts racial discrimination within a methodological framework based in postcolonial theory and in criminological theory. The core finding was that this was an appropriate analytical framework, which provided a solid basis for comparing the texts and exposing the fundamentally criminal and violent nature of apartheid-style racial discrimination. This served also to justify the decision to take a criminological approach. The examiner found the work interesting and instructive, while another outside observer from the Department of Criminology (which gave invaluable assistance) was particularly impressed by the author's writing style and clarity of presentation.

He has expressed his gratitude the Department of English Language and Comparative Literature in the Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities at Fort Hare, to his Supervisor, Dr Mathew Blatchford, as well as to Mr. Michael Earl-Taylor of the Department of Criminology for his help during his studies.

PROFILE

Ms Ketiwe Ndhlovu was born in Zimbabwe on 4 November 1978. She was appointed as a lecturer on the staff of the University of Zimbabwe in 2004, after completing her Master's degree in African languages. She embarked on a Doctoral studies programme at this University in 2007.

For her Doctoral thesis, Ms Ndhlovu investigated the strategies used by Ndebele translators in the translation of specialised terms and cultural taboos in selected HIV/AIDS texts. Three main theoretical approaches were used in a complementary fashion, namely Descriptive Translation Studies, Cultural Studies and Corpus-Based Translation Studies. From the English/Ndebele Parallel Corpus that was constructed, it was found that, while Ndebele translators are making use of a recognised set of strategies to transfer the target message from English to Ndebele, their translations often contain various basic errors, such as misinterpretation of the source text. It was emphasised that the occurrence of shortcomings such as these in the translation of medical texts could have serious consequences. Ms Ndhlovu's findings therefore point to a dire need for the establishment of Translation as a recognised profession in Zimbabwe.

SIZIBA Liqhwa Patience

PROFILE

Liqhwa Patience Siziba was born in Bulawayo in the Matabeleland District, Zimbabwe in the year 1983. She completed her first, second and third degrees in 2005, 2006 and 2008 respectively at the University of Zimbabwe. In 2008 March, Liqhwa Siziba enrolled with University of Fort Hare for a Doctoral degree in African languages and Literature.

Her study made a critical analysis of the impact of the changing roles of women in the Ndebele post-colonial society as reflected in mythology and selected writings of IsiNdebele female writers. The methodology of this study was grounded in the Afro-centric ideology of African Womanism as propounded by various critics and theorists in the field of Womanism. The researcher used this theory, which is a new form of feminism to investigate the impact of the changing roles of women in the Ndebele society. In eschewing the Eurocentric feminist paradigms, the researcher sought to use a critical approach consonant with particular core principles of African culture. This was influenced by the fact that: The problem most women face to date is the masculine need for power and dominance in society. Liqhwa Siziba's study therefore, investigated the change, in the presentation of the roles of the women and men in society, with particular emphasis on the domestic and gender roles. The study used a trans-disciplinary approach as it bridged a gap between the "so called static" Ndebele oral narratives and the dynamic Ndebele society as reflected in the creative writings.

All examiners unanimously agreed that it was a research well done. Credit is duly given to Dr SS Mdaka by her, for his guidance and support throughout the research not only as a supervisor but as an "electe' Pater" that is, appointed father.

PROFILE

Born in 1970, Peterson did his primary and secondary school in Chivhu, Zimbabwe before completing his 'A' levels in 1989 at Thornhill High School, Gweru. He graduated with a BA degree (1992) and Graduate Certificate in Education (2000) from the University of Zimbabwe. Between 1993-2001 he taught History and Shona at high schools then left teaching in 2002 to join the National Archives of Zimbabwe. He headed the Midlands Provincial Records office, where he managed public sector records. In 2006 he joined the Midlands State University as a Teaching Assistant. He then pursued an MSc in Library and Information Science with the National University of Science and Technology, graduating in 2008 with Merit. In 2009 he was admitted to study for a PhD in Knowledge Management at the University of Fort Hare. Currently, Peterson is a Lecturer in the Faculty of Information Science and Communication at the National University of Science and Technology, Zimbabwe.

His PhD thesis is titled 'Knowledge retention strategies in selected Southern Africa public broadcasting corporations.' Adopting a survey strategy, the study aimed at establishing knowledge retention strategies employed by SABC (South Africa), DBS (Botswana) and ZBC (Zimbabwe) in retaining the knowledge that continuously seep away from these organizations due to various forms of attrition. It was established that the three corporations have no formal knowledge retention strategies in place. The study recommended the adoption of

mentorship programmes, utilization of retirees and subject matter experts, establishment of a Knowledge Manager's position among other recommendations in order to retain knowledge.

PROFILE

Reverend Mmeli Othniel Sulo was born in Duncan Village and was forcefully removed to Alice in 1983. He completed his schooling at Mpambani Mzimba High School in 1986. After studying for the ministry in the Dutch Reformed Church in Africa he was ordained in 1994 and served two congregations, at Bethulie in the Southern Free State and Adelaide since 2006.

Reverend Sulo completed all his theological studies at the University of Fort Hare. After serving his alma mater as a Time-on-Task lecturer he joined the chaplaincy in the South African Police Service.

The focus of Reverend Sulo's research was the 1857 decision of the Dutch Reformed Church on the segregation of its membership. This action placed members and communities in conflict within the same family of churches. This thesis offered the meaningful and effective pastoral function of confession as a vehicle for reconciliation for people living in conflict. The research concluded that even though the path of confession is fragile and risky, it is the responsibility of both perpetrator and the victim to confess and absolve one another. This study, using a qualitative research and a pastoral

theological interpretative research methodology, proposes that the pastoral encounter is the means to achieve pastoral organic reconciliation.

Reverend Sulo is extremely grateful for the guidance and support he received from his supervisor, Professor Irvin G Chetty.

Ms Mashiya has worked for international organization USAID and has 12 years Senior Management experience in government. She is currently working as a Deputy Director General (DDG) for Strategic Support Services at a National Government Department of Rural Development and Land Reform.

She registered with the UFH in 2009 to pursue her doctorate degree. Her Thesis is entitled: Strategy Implementation: A critical assessment of risk management application in the implementation of the ECPDS. The thesis investigated the extent of integrated risk management in the implementation of the Eastern Cape growth and development strategy.

The thesis concludes that there has been a limited integrated approach to risk management of PGDP implementation. The thesis recommends adoption of an integrated risk management Strategy and Model by Eastern Cape government departments, and inclusion of risk management modules in Public Management studies.

PROFILE

Mr Gatabazi is a Rwandan, born in exile, grew up and studied in Tanzania. He graduated with B.Com degree from the University of Dar Es Salaam in Tanzania in 1996. He went to his motherland Rwanda for the first time in 1996. He earned his MBA in 2000 from India. And since then he has been working for the Government of Rwanda. He registered at the University of Fort Hare in 2010 to pursue his Doctorate degree. Gatabazi's thesis is entitled "Bank Finance in developing Small and Medium enterprises (SMEs): An appraisal of relevant determinants in Rwanda".

His thesis investigated the problem why SMEs do not get adequate bank finance despite their valuable contribution in the economic development of nations. The thesis argues that there are SMEs internal factors that cause unavailability of bank financing. Understanding the causes of this problem is important in determining how to improve availability of credit to SMEs.

The thesis concludes that the lack of business information, lack of collaterals, lack of managerial competencies, lack of internal funds, lack of networking and unethical practices by SMEs significantly impacts on the availability of bank finance to SMEs in Rwanda. The thesis makes recommendations

to the government, bankers and Private Sector Federation to curb this problem for the SMEs to play their central role in the development and socio-economic transformation of Rwanda.

Mr Zimba's Doctoral thesis explored the decentralized cooperative governance in the South African metropolitan municipalities. The study argues that decision making at the local structures is not inclusive despite the notion of cooperative governance envisaged in the South African constitution. Based on the detailed data obtained from the six metropolitan municipalities, the study proposes an alternative



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inclusive decentralized model that takes into account the broader principles of cooperative governance.

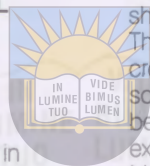

The government and political parties must be united and create an environment of peace, security, justice, equality, social cohesion and unity that will allow Development goals to be achieved. All the examiners praised the candidate for this excellent academic work. One international examiner invited Mr Muyingi to work with him further on this research topic while the other one requested him to find a way of addressing African Leaders on its findings and recommendations.

HONORARY DOCTORATE DEGREE

CITATION: DR. MAKHENKESI STOFILE - DOCTOR OF THEOLOGY
(D TH) (HONORIS CAUSA) (GRADUATION, MAY 2012)

Makhenkesi Stofile is currently serving as South Africa's Ambassador to the Federal Republic of Germany in Berlin, and thus continuing with a distinguished career in the South African Civil Service, and to South African society in general.

Makhenkesi Stofile was born in Adelaide, Eastern Cape in 1944. He matriculated from Newell High School, Port Elizabeth and studied at the University of Fort Hare University where he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1971, a Bachelor of Theology degree in 1974, a Bachelor of Theology Honours degree in 1975, and a Masters of Theology in 1979.

His desire to expand the range of his postgraduate education saw him study overseas where he received a Postgraduate Diploma in Theology from Tubingen, Germany in 1981 and a Masters of Arts degree from Princeton University (USA) in 1983. In 2000, he was awarded D. Phil (honoris causa) by the University of Port Elizabeth.

In shaping his public profile, Ambassador Stofile balanced his life by playing an active role in politics, academia, religion and sport. He started his working life as a machine operator at a textile factory in Port Elizabeth from 1965 to 1968. The trajectory of his life and career was massively influenced when he became a part-time tutor at the African Independent Churches Association (AICA) Seminary in 1972. This introduced him to the world of academia, of philosophy, and of ethics.

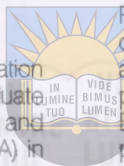
In pursuing this career path Ambassador Stofile became a Senior Lecturer in Theology and Philosophy of Religion at Fort Hare from 1973 to 1987, and he also served as an ordained Minister of the Presbyterian Church of South Africa since 1975. He was also appointed as Senior Lecturer of Theology at University of Transkei, where he became Acting Head of Department in 1991. Besides his status as a distinguished alumnus, Ambassador Stofile also served on the Governing Council of the University of Fort Hare after 1991, and was appointed as Director of Public Relations and Development at Fort Hare between 1992 and 1994. Ambassador Stofile's lengthy association with, and service to, the University of Fort Hare is self-evident. Rev. Stofile similarly served on the

Boards and Councils of a number of NGO's, Technikons and Universities.

Throughout his adult life, Ambassador Stofile has been active in politics and his commitment to the struggle for liberation and social justice in the broadest meanings of those terms, is widely-known and respected throughout South Africa. He has been a member of the African National Congress (ANC) since 1963 and has served the organization with distinction in a range of capacities. From 1983 to 1986, he served as Regional Secretary and on the National Executive Committee of the United Democratic Front. Ambassador Stofile became an international public figure when he led the successful protest that prevented a planned tour by New Zealand's All Blacks in 1984. Ambassador Stofile has also paid a heavy personal price for his political convictions in that in May 1987, he was convicted under the then Ciskeian Internal Security Act and subsequently sentenced to 11 years imprisonment of which he had to serve three.

He was a Regional Chairperson and Member of the Internal Leadership Core of the African National Congress (1990 – 1991), and has been a member of the National Executive Committee of the ANC from 1990 to date. After the 1994 democratic elections, Ambassador Stofile was a Member of Parliament and the Chief Whip of the ANC in the Parliament of the Republic of South Africa from 1994 to 1996. He was the ANC Treasurer General from 1995 to 1997. Ambassador Stofile served as the Premier of the Eastern Cape from 1997 to 2004, and was South Africa's Minister of Sport & Recreation South Africa from 2004 to 2010. One of the defining hallmarks of his tenure as Minister of Sport is that he consistently emphasized the importance of sport in consolidating social cohesion and transformation in democratic South Africa.

Besides his commitment to the struggle for liberation and social justice, Ambassador Stofile also served as a sports administrator from local to national levels between 1965 and 1994, specializing in rugby, cricket and netball administration. He was the Vice-President of the South African Rugby Football Union (SARFU) from 1990-1992. He has also coached rugby,



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specializing in junior and club rugby (1974 -1994). He sat on the 2010 FIFA World Cup LOC Board of Directors.

By all accounts Ambassador Stofile was a formidable rugby player and represented the non-racial Border Rugby Union at both scrum-half and wing. He continues to take a keen interest in rugby, lawn tennis and table tennis, athletics, boxing and cricket, and also enjoys ballroom dancing.

It is a distinct privilege for the University of Fort Hare to award the degree of Doctor of Theology (D Th) (honoris causa) on a revered son of the Eastern Cape, ithole lomthoniyama elinomkhitha nomkhoka lase Mpuma Koloni, Makhenkesi Arnold Stofile.

Maggie Kisaka-Lwayo was born in Nakuru, Kenya on 23 June 1971. She matriculated at Loreto High School Limuru, Kenya, in 1989. Before coming to University of Fort Hare, Maggie studied at Egerton University and Moi University in Kenya and the University of Kwazulu-Natal and obtained a BSc (Honours) in 1994 and an MPhil in 2000 in Agricultural Economics. Subsequently, she worked with the International Livestock Research Institute (ILRI), the World Agroforestry Centre (ICRAF) and did some University teaching. Maggie is currently the Executive Manager for Research and Development at the Eastern Cape Appropriate Technology Unit in Mthatha, South Africa. She is married to Lwayo, S. Jembe and has two daughters and a son.

Her thesis is entitled: Risk preferences and consumption decisions in organic production: The case of Kwazulu-Natal and Eastern Cape Provinces of South Africa. Using diverse econometric models, she identified the determinants of organic technology adoption, elicited risk preferences among smallholder farmers and established the factors affecting consumer awareness and consumption of organic products. The candidate's policy recommendations have the potential to significantly impact technology adoption, contribute to increased smallholders' ability to bear risk and enable stakeholders to gain better understanding of organic purchase decisions. Two articles have been published in international journals and three papers accepted for international conferences in Shanghai, China, and Australia.

Major findings from the studies were: Moringa leaves suppressed internal parasite load and have microbial activities. They have high nutrient contents comparable to known brands in the market. They can be used as a protein supplement to improve goat performance and meat quality, and for medicinal purposes.

Four papers have been published from this thesis, two papers were presented at the 58th International Congress on Meat Science and Technology (ICOMST) in Ghent, Belgium and four others are under review in peer reviewed international Journals.

As a God-fearing young Pastor, he believes that the Spirit of Excellence is upon him as was the case with Daniel.

His thesis provided empirical evidence that local pigs are able tolerate heat and perform better under high temperatures which are associated with climate change unlike imported pigs. James' thesis also addressed policy issues regarding handling of disease outbreaks and utilisation of local pigs to promote development in communal production systems. Examiners acknowledged that the thesis was the first attempt to use choice experiments to estimate total economic values (based on productive and adaptive traits) of local pig genetic resources of Southern Africa in order to justify the need for their

conservation. James produced five papers for publication in internationally refereed journals.

James is married to a beautiful and intelligent lady Grace Portia Kuda who is also a PhD scholar. The couple is blessed with one brilliant son Menalarche Blessing.

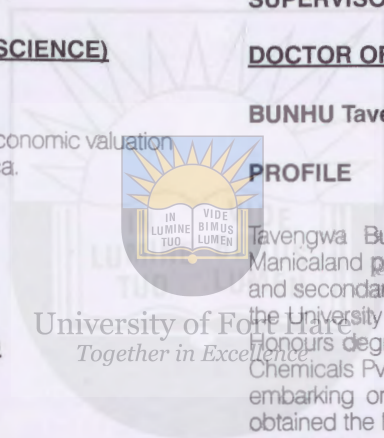
BUNHU Tavengwa

His thesis title is "Preparation and Evaluation of Lignocellulose-Montmorillonite Nanocomposites for the Adsorption of some Heavy Metals and Organic Dyes from Aqueous Solution". Novel nanocomposite adsorbents based on lignocellulose and montmorillonite clay were prepared and successfully used for the removal of heavy metals and organic dyes from aqueous solution. Some of the adsorbents showed ability to simultaneously adsorb both organic dyes and heavy metals from aqueous solution which made them unique. Naturally occurring materials were employed in the study. The adsorbents could be recycled, thus making their use in water treatment cost-effective.

The candidate has several conference presentations and



three publications in reputable journals. Furthermore, the candidate has asked that on his behalf, I express his gratitude to the NRF, GMRDC and the Department of Chemistry in the Faculty of Science & Agriculture at Fort Hare for funding and the opportunity to undertake his studies.

She registered for her PhD programme in 2009 at the University of Fort Hare. In this programme, she investigated the medicinal and toxicological properties of *Aloe ferox*, a common plant used for the management of constipation in Nkonkobe Municipality of the Eastern Cape.

Through a series of carefully planned scientific experiments and bioactivity-guided research methodology, she was able to unravel the mystery behind the use of *Aloe ferox* as a laxative remedy in the rural communities. In addition, she was able to confirm that the plant is not toxic even when used orally as a remedy for the treatment of constipation. This has made this plant a candidate for bioprospecting for laxative drugs.

From her PhD work, she published four articles in peer reviewed international journals and two others are currently being reviewed for publication in similar journals. Olunmi Wintola is a seasoned educator with close to 10 years experience as a science teacher. She is presently a research fellow in the Phytomedicine Research Unit of this University. She is blessed with two daughters.

Mr Sichun Hu was born in China on 20 December 1976. He is married Guo Min and they have one child. His thesis title is "Investigation and laboratory tests of sub-economic aluminum resources in China". He investigated the sub economic aluminum (Al) resources of China and carried out a series of laboratory tests for Al extraction as well as by-products utilisation. His motivation was based on the situation that China is seriously lacking good quality reserves, but has a huge amount of sub economic Al resources, which are potentially mineable and exploitable in both Al metal and by-products.

His study has met all the targets set and his major achievements are: 1) Metallurgical parameters obtained through tests and successfully optimized technological development which were both proved to be effective; and 2) The data for the amount of sub economic Al resources, distribution and status in China were collected and compiled into useful scientific information and database. The international examiners specifically agreed that his thesis presented an extensive, detailed and profound study of Al mineral resources in both technical and theoretical aspects and are highly recommendable to the Al mining and processing industries in China and the rest of the world.

Based on his study, five peer-reviewed papers were published in international journals including Nonferrous Metals, Conservation and Utilisation of Mineral Resources, Light Metals, and two patents were awarded in China (Patent numbers: 200810190801.3., 200810190802.8.)

Hu is an extremely hard working, dedicated and keen learner and is a friendly individual. He is currently employed as Senior Engineer and Deputy Leader of his Research Division

Christy E. Manyi-Loh was born in Buea, South West Region of Cameroon where she attended both her primary and secondary school. She obtained her B.Sc and MSc. from the University of Buea and during her study she was awarded the senate prize for the best student in Microbiology and the best student in research project offered by American Society of Microbiologists in 2003 and 2007, respectively. Manyi-Loh registered for her PhD (Microbiology) at the UFH in 2009 with support of GMRDC. For her PhD she investigated the anti- *H. pylori* activity of six honeys obtained from different localities in the country by using standard microbiological techniques. The available bioactive volatile components present in the most active honeys were elucidated by chromatographic techniques. At the end of her research she was able to establish that the anti-*H. pylori* activity of the honeys varies with location as a result of difference in climate and vegetation that influence the chemical composition of honey. Her work led to the identification of two novel potent volatile antimicrobials in honey (thiophene & N-methyl- D3-aziridine). These results will assist in the development of new alternative or complementary treatment in *H. pylori* infections.

From her thesis, six articles were published in International peer reviewed journals and additional four manuscripts are either in press or under review process.

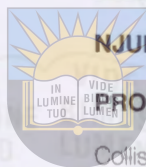

PROFILE

Collise Njume holds a BSc (Hons) and an MSc degree in Microbiology awarded in 1998 and 2000 respectively from the University of Buea, Cameroon. He has worked as a Medical Laboratory Technologist and Microbiologist with the Solidarity Foundation and Medical Centre, Buea, Cameroon (2000-2004) and as Instructor of Microbiology at the University of Buea, Cameroon (2005-2009). During his service with the University of Buea, he also worked as a research assistant in the Laboratory for Emerging Infectious Diseases (2007-2009).

In March 2009, he enrolled for his PhD programme at the University Of Fort Hare, working on phytochemical analysis and bioactivity of South African medicinal plants on clinical isolates of *Helicobacter pylori*. Data generated from this study identified numerous South African medicinal plants as reservoirs of therapeutically useful compounds against *H. pylori* infections. Two of the compounds isolated from the stem bark of the marula tree (terpinen-4-ol and pyrrolidine) demonstrated anti-*H. pylori* activity at concentrations $<1\mu\text{g}/\text{mL}$ against clarithromycin- and metronidazole-resistant strains. The properties of terpinen-4-ol indicated that it could be a useful alternative in the eradication of *H. pylori* from the stomach with the potential to reduce the high pill burden associated with combination therapy thereby encouraging patient adherence to therapy.

MOTA LESOLI was born on the 07th/11/ 1976 at Tsikoane Lesotho. He completed his primary education at Linareng L.E.C in 1991, High School at Mount Royal in 1996, Diploma in Agricultural education at LAC/NUL in 2000. He was employed as a teacher at LEMS until 2002. He obtained BSc in Animal Science in 2005 and MSc in Pasture Science in 2008 at UFH. Mota joined Fort Cox College of Agriculture as a Senior Lecturer in 2008.

Mota registered for PhD degree with UFH in 2008. He conducted research on social and biophysical factors responsible for rangeland degradation and vegetation restoration. This work was funded the Kellogg Foundation, GMRDC, and WRC, to who he is grateful. He found that there are social factors and biophysical factors responsible for rangeland degradation. Rangeland degradation was characterised by poor forage productivity and vegetation cover, high soil unconfined compressive strength, with low hydraulic conductivity. Low-lying areas were severely degraded as a consequence of overgrazing. He concluded that restoration performance depends on the ability for the "microsite" to collect and store

water, and introduction of plant propagules.

From this thesis, five papers were presented in the Grassland Society of Southern Africa (GSSA) congresses, five manuscripts are at different stages of review in peer-reviewed journals. To his credit, Mota has published 27 peer-reviewed papers in Journals and conference proceedings. He is the member of the Executive Council GSSA. He is married to Makobeli and both were blessed with a daughter Seapei.

The study came up with the new framework or model for continuous development of teachers.

All the examiners agreed that the thesis demonstrates clear engagement with the subject content and, that the candidate has a good grasp of the subject matter. One of the examiners acknowledged that the model of continuous professional teacher development implementation framework adds a new, original and innovative angle to continuous professional teacher development.

Wendy is a lecturer at Walter Sisulu University. She presented three papers on different aspects on the implementation of continuous teacher development programmes in international and national conferences.

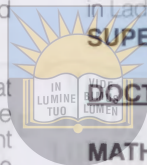

She registered for PhD in Education at the University of Fort Hare in 2009. Her study assessed the implementation of teacher performance appraisal in primary schools. The study adopted a post-positivist paradigm and used the concurrent triangulation design as the operational framework for data gathering. The study revealed that the implementation of performance appraisal in Zimbabwe is affected by economic and political instability, brain drain, inadequate funding and shortage of teaching and learning materials as well as insufficient knowledge on the adopted policies. All examiners agreed that the study provides new knowledge on the implementation of teacher performance appraisal in education. One examiner noted "the study deals with practical challenges and raises questions about the conceptualisation and implementation of the entire PAS and enriches our understanding of the education field". He also recommended publication of the thesis.

Joyce is in the process of finalising three journal articles out of this study. She is appreciative to her supervisor Dr N. Duku; and the financial support received from CEMRDC.

He registered for a PhD in Education in 2009. His study was titled *The Performance of Secondary School heads as instructional leaders: A Case Study of Six Secondary Schools in Zimbabwe*. The study was located in the interpretative paradigm and adopted a single case study approach. The study found that heads had complex and multifaceted roles that they performed as instructional leaders and hence failed to cope with the demands of their roles. The study also revealed that heads mainly followed a top down approach when executing their duties. This neglected modern supervisory practices such as shared decision making, distributive and clinical supervision approaches. The study recommended, among others, that heads should adopt modern supervisory approaches when executing their duties in addition to distributing leadership chores to subordinates.

Sevious is an experienced headmaster and part time lecturer with the Zimbabwe Open University. To date he has contributed five educational publications in various Educational Journals.

Jenny Shumba was born in Mberengwa District in, Zimbabwe. Jenny holds Certificate of Education; a Bachelor of Education degree from the University of Zimbabwe and a Master of Education, (with merit) from the same university. She registered for a Doctor of Philosophy Degree in Education at the University of Fort Hare in 2009.

Jenny's research focused on school going learners who have lost one or both parents and have become orphans. The aim of the study was two-fold: to understand the bereavement experiences of orphaned learners and to examine how such experiences can inform school counseling services. The study employed an interpretive phenomenological design.

One of the main findings was that there was a mismatch between what children and school counselors say was happening in secondary schools pertaining bereavement counseling. The other was that although there was a lot of death in Zimbabwe the counseling syllabi lacked focus on bereavement counseling. The net result is that bereaved learners in the case study schools were not receiving adequate

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bereavement counseling. The study proposes a new school counseling model for consideration by school authorities and researchers. One external examiner commented that the thesis should be "...published in the form of a book or serialized into journal articles..." To date two journal articles based on the thesis are under development.

Elizabeth Selemani-Meke holds a Bachelors' degree from the University of Malawi and a Masters Degree from Virginia Polytechnic Institute, USA.

She registered for a PhD in Education at the University of Fort Hare in 2010. Her thesis was titled An Assessment of the Implementation of Continuing Professional Development Programmes for Primary School Teachers in Malawi: A case of Zomba Rural Education District. The study was placed within the post-positivism paradigm and used a mixed method research design that incorporated concurrent procedures in the collection, analysis and interpretation of the data. The study revealed weaknesses in the implementation of CPD programmes for teachers in the district. Generally the study noted that there was much emphasis on the transmissive model of CPD implementation, to the neglect of transitional and transformative models.

All the external examiners agreed that the study was well conceptualized and adds new knowledge to the implementation of CPD programmes for primary school

teachers. One examiner commented that "the study brings new insight to an otherwise neglected area in the education system". Four journal articles have already been accepted for publication from this study.

Elizabeth is currently a Research Fellow at the Centre for Educational Research and Training, University of Malawi. As a researcher, she has undertaken a wide range of research and consultancy projects with different donor organizations in all levels of education. She has also published widely in the areas focused in the projects.

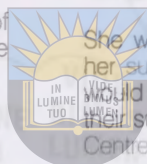

The study adopted an interpretive paradigm and used the phenomenological design as the operational framework for data gathering. The study revealed different ways in which orphaned learners experienced psycho-social support both at home and at school. Orphans expressed their experience by narrating how they were supported at home and school after the death of their parents. More importantly, the study revealed that the orphans were not provided the opportunity to open up and express their feelings about the bereavement, and as a result, they still harboured grief which affected them emotionally and physically. The study came up with bereavement and counseling models, and other means of providing orphans with psycho-social support. All examiners agreed that the study provides new knowledge on the Orphans and Other Vulnerable Children interventions. One examiner stated "this study contributes a lot to the area of OVC's interventions, an area that is so critical especially in the developing world".

Simon is currently a full time Lecturer at the University of Namibia in the Department of Educational Psychology and Inclusive Education. He presented papers on different aspects on psycho-social support for orphans and vulnerable children in international and national conferences. He has produced three papers which are currently under review for publication in accredited journals.

The study found that some lecturers in teachers' colleges do not have andragogic skills for teaching adults and that such lecturers had malpractices that conveyed negative messages to their students.

All the examiners agreed that the study has theoretical significance to the body of literature and contributes to policy implications in terms of training needs for lecturers to handle

adult students. One examiner observed that the study was impressively researched with well articulated frameworks that revealed the messages that influence and shape students from lecturers' practices

Faith is an experienced Tertiary academic who rose through the ranks to become a Vice Principal of a teachers college. She has produced a paper which is currently under review for publication in accredited journal.

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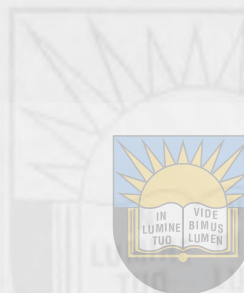
