1. Outline and discuss the Frontier Wars in the Eastern Cape between 1779 and 1853. (50)
2. Analyse the forces and factors which quickened the events that brought about the death of Chungwa Tshaka and amaXhosa expulsion from the Zuurveld region in 1812.
3. Discuss critically the rise and the fall of the Kat River Settlement. (50)
4. Using Nontetha Bungu-Nkwenkwe as your example write an historical narrative to prove that women were also an important factor in the 19th-20th century socio-political discourse. (50)
5. Discuss the events around the death of amaXhosa King Hintsa and explain how Hintsa's War impacted on South African race relations? (50)
6. Outline and discuss Clifton Crais' explanation of the historical origin of poverty in the Eastern Cape. (50)
7. Outline different historiographical interpretations of the 'Xhosa cattle-killing' episode and discuss the key differences and contradictions between them. (50)
