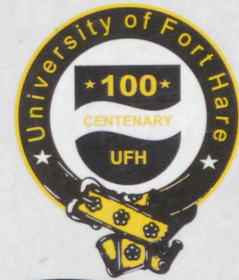

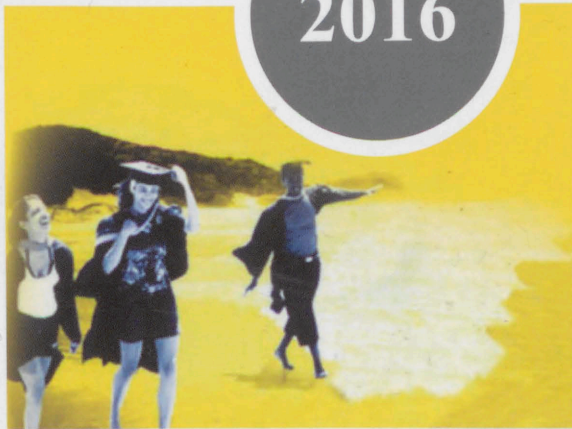

CITATION: DR II SOOLIMAN
(DOCTOR OF SCIENCE) (*HONORIS CAUSA*)

PROFILE

Dr Imtiaz Sooliman was born on 7 March 1962, in Potchefstroom, North West Province, and he started his schooling in Potchefstroom, before moving to the province of KwaZulu-Natal for further studies. In 1984 he graduated as a medical doctor from the then University of Natal Medical School in 1984, now Nelson R Mandela School of Medicine - University of KwaZulu-Natal. After his internship at King Edward Hospital in 1985, he worked in private practice for eight and a half years.

On August 6, 1992 Dr Sooliman founded the Gift of the Givers Foundation which came into being in 1993. In addition to being the founder, he is currently the Director and Chairman of Gift of the Givers Foundation, whose principle and motto says "**Best Among People are those who Benefit Mankind**".

The organization is credited for the designing and development the world's first and largest containerized mobile hospital, which was deployed in Bosnia in 1993. In 2003, the Gift of the Givers Foundation organisation became the first in South African history to receive R60 million from the South African government for humanitarian aid for KwaZulu-Natal and Eastern Cape Province. The fund was meant to design and roll out 204 000 food parcels. The Gift of the Givers Foundation is the largest disaster relief organization of African origin on the African continent and it

implements 24 different categories of development projects. By 2013 the Gift of the Givers Foundation had delivered over R800 million in aid to 37 countries around the world, including South Africa.

Ten years after its launch, the Gift of the Givers Foundation made history by being the only humanitarian organization in the world whose plane was allowed to land at the Baghdad International Airport to supply humanitarian aid to the Iraqi people after the Gulf War 2. In 2013 Dr Sooliman's Gift of the Givers Foundation, together with SA National Defence Force, rescued over 200000 displaced people in floods ravaged Limpopo areas and southern parts of Mozambique. These people were helped with medical services and disaster relief packages. The Gift of the Givers Foundation has also opened a hospital in Syria to treat casualties of the ongoing civil war in that country. In 2014 the foundation provided a two million rand aid package for Zimbabwe's floods victims in Masvingo province. The aid package consisted of food, blankets, new clothing, mattresses, towels, personal and environmental hygiene packs, water buckets and intravenous fluids. In January 2015 the organization spent over K100 million on relief aid to flood victims in Malawi.





In recognition of his selflessness, Dr Sooliman has received over 40 awards of which three were received from South Africa's three presidents namely; the President's Order of the Star of South Africa (the highest civilian award in the country) from President FW De Klerk in 1993; and the Pietermaritzburg Civic Commendation Award from President Nelson Mandela in 1997 and the South Africa's Order of the Baobab for distinguished service from President Jacob Zuma, in April 2010.

This added to another Presidential Award in 2006 from a foreign leader, President Pervez Musharraf of Pakistan, for the organization's finest and fastest disaster response to the country's earthquake calamity. In 2013 the South African Post Office also issued a stamp in honour of the foundation's efforts, nationally and internationally.

Human rights

All the humanitarian assistance that the Gift of the Givers Foundation extends to disaster victims and vulnerable communities worldwide is a key testimony of its promotion of global human rights. Some of its programmes include, drilling and rigging of boreholes for poor communities, distribution of blankets and jerseys in winter; new shoes, food packs, nutritional supplements and other foodstuffs as well as the establishment of many feeding schemes to avert hunger and malnutrition.

The Gift of the Givers also supports organisations like Usindiso Ministries which provide shelter for abused women and children as well as a home for the homeless women and children. These organisations create awareness about HIV/AIDS, Human Rights and their rights as women by offering

workshops. In recognition of all these efforts Dr Sooliman received the Lenasia Human Rights Award in 2004

Democracy

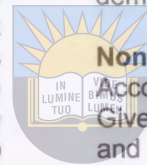
By assisting the masses in need the Gift of the Givers Foundation is helping to promote democracy. The beneficiaries are put in a position where they can make their own voices heard and be empowered to help themselves. Dr Sooliman's message of reconciliation is also helping to promote democracy worldwide.

Non-racialism

According to the website of the Gift of the Givers, their assistance is purely humanitarian and unconditional. They assist irrespective of race, religion, colour, class, political affiliation or geographical boundary. Their approaches are entirely neutral to mankind in need, are non-judgemental and have an open-minded approach to all situations. Although they work with governments to get their assistance delivered they do not align themselves to any political party.

Gender equality

Dr Sooliman's Gift of the Givers Foundation provides mercy assistance to victims of natural disasters and civil conflicts. Most of these victims are women and children. The women also get training in life skills and handcrafts whilst the children are sent to school. Besides providing victims with disaster relief the foundation also rehabilitate the victims who are mostly women and children.



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Progressive social, educational and economic development of society

The Gift of the Givers Foundation provides recipients with long-term projects that include various forms of support to old age homes, orphanages, facilities for mentally and physically challenged people, shelters for abused women and children, educational projects, agricultural sustainability projects, sports development and entrepreneurship. In 1997 the Foundation started a new project called the Gift of the Givers Bursary Project with an initial outlay of R20 000. To date the project spends R5.6 million per year on bursaries to disadvantaged students.

Contribution that is consistent with the vision and mission of the University of Fort Hare

All of Dr Sooliman's achievements are in tandem with the University of Fort Hare's vision and mission. The bursaries given to underprivileged students go a long way in promoting equity among citizens of different nations. The agricultural sustainability programmes help to improve the livelihoods of the beneficiaries.

DOCTORATE DEGREES

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY IN AGRICULTURAL ECONOMICS

CHIVHEYA Renias Vavarirayi

PROFILE

Chivheya was born in Chirumhanzu. He obtained his Bachelors' degree from the University of Zimbabwe in 1996 and a Masters' degree from University of Zimbabwe in 2007. In 2014 he joined University of Fort Hare for his PhD degree.

The PhD study explored deforestation and forest dependency in Shamva resettlement area, Zimbabwe. Evaluation of willingness to participate in forest conservation and the socio-economic and institutional factors which affect the settlers' willingness to participate were done. Identification of incentives for indigenous forests conservation was done. The study confirmed deforestation, significant dependency on forest and factors which had a positive significance on conservation. The study recommended monitoring of forests, promotion of livelihoods strategies, alternative energy sources, forest conservation education and incentives. The implication of the results are good indicators to policy makers in Zimbabwe to minimise problems related to forest conservation in view of succesful resettlement programme and climate change. To date Renias has published five journal papers and he is currently working on three others.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY IN ANIMAL SCIENCE

CHIKWANDA Allen Tapiwa

PROFILE

Chikwanda Allen Tapiwa was born in Harare, Zimbabwe. He obtained the following degrees from the University of Zimbabwe: BSc. Agric. Hons in Animal Science (2000); Master of Philosophy in Animal Science (2005); Masters in Business Administration (2014). He worked in the Zimbabwe poultry industry in Senior Management Positions and University institutions until he embarked on his PhD studies at the University of Fort Hare in 2013. His study focused on the effects of grazing and housing management systems on greenhouse gas emissions, blood profiles and meat quality of Nguni goats. The study demonstrated that significant quantities of methane were emitted from earth floors of herded goats whilst more carbon dioxide and nitrous oxide were emitted from slatted floors. Tethered goats had important poly-unsaturated fatty acids that have health benefits to consumers.



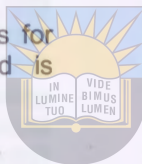
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Herding grazing system resulted in adequate nutrient flow to goats and promoted heavy body weights and desirable carcass characteristics. Physico-chemical properties of goat meat were similar between the experimental grazing systems. It was concluded that goat grazing and housing management should be considered in minimising climate change and improving meat production. It was also recommended that farmers harness methane from goat manure and use it as a biofuel.

To date he has submitted 2 manuscripts for publication from his PhD studies and is currently working on 3 others.

CHIKWANDA Denice

PROFILE

Denice Chikwanda (nee Munthali) was born in Chirumanzu, Zimbabwe. She obtained her Bachelors' degree in 1997, Master of Philosophy Degree in Agriculture in 2003, and a Master of Business Administration Degree in 2013 from the University of Zimbabwe. In 2013, she joined the University of Fort Hare for a PhD degree in Animal Science. Her study focused on adaptive responses to heat stress, quality of hides and meat from Nguni and non-descript crossbred cattle reared by smallholder farmers under extensive systems in South Africa. The findings from the study

were that both genotypes possessed hair-coat and skin characteristics that enabled adequate physiological responses to withstand heat stress. Furthermore, both genotypes produced good quality beef with health-promoting fatty acid profiles and composition. Automotive upholstery leather produced from the hides of these genotypes had high tensile strength, elongation at break and breaking load. Therefore, beef and automotive upholstery leather from Nguni and non-descript crossbred cattle reared under extensive systems can be channeled to formal markets to reduce current shortages, while improving income earnings of smallholder farmers.

To date Denice has two articles under peer-review in high impact factor journals and has submitted three others for peer review.

THESIS TITLE: Adaptive responses to heat stress, quality of hide and meat from indigenous Nguni and non-descript cross-bred cattle.

FALOWO Andrew Bamidele

PROFILE

Andrew Bamidele Falowo was born in Ilara-Mokin, Ondo state, Nigeria. He obtained a Bachelor degree (2007) and Master degree (2012) in Animal Production and Health from Federal University of Technology, Akure, Nigeria. He enrolled for his doctoral studies at University of Fort Hare in 2013.





Andrew's PhD thesis focused on the effect of natural antioxidants and thermal treatment on the quality of meat from Bonsmara and non-descript cattle. His research explored the use of different natural additives from plant sources to reduce the rate of deterioration and improve meat quality during processing and storage. This study revealed that the application of these additives significantly improved shelf life and enhanced overall meat safety.

Andrew has published two research articles from his thesis while three more of his manuscripts are currently under review with different peer reviewed Journals. Andrew is indebted to the Govan Mbeki Research and Development Centre and DAFF/NRF-RTF, Post slaughter meat handling project for financing his research work.

FALOWO Andrew Bamidele

THESIS TITLE: Effects of natural antioxidants and thermal treatment on quality of meat from Bonsmara and non-descript cattle*

NJISANE Yonela Zifikile

PROFILE

Yonela was born in Flagstaff, Eastern Cape Province. She obtained her BSc (2011) and MSc (2013) Agriculture (Animal Science) from the University of Fort Hare. She enrolled for a doctoral degree at the same University in 2013.

Her PhD study focused on farm to abattoir conditions and their subsequent effects on behavioural and physiological changes, and the quality of beef from extensively-reared

Nguni and non-descript cattle. The study revealed that the conditions and activities at the farm, during transportation, lairaging and at slaughter influence some behavioural and physiological changes and the quality of beef. The two tested genotypes showed similar behavioural and blood physiological response patterns when exposed to common stimuli, although the meat colour variables differed.

So far, she has published four peer-reviewed articles and has five papers currently under review in various highly regarded journals. She has also published a number of non-scientific communications under the South African Young Academy of Science blog series and *The Conversations*. She has showcased her work both locally (Stellenbosch and East London) and internationally (Turkey, Uruguay and France).

She is currently employed as a postdoctoral fellow and has been serving as a student executive member of the South African Society for Animal Science – Eastern Cape Branch.

NJISANE Yonela Zifikile

THESIS TITLE: Farm to abattoir conditions and their subsequent effects on behavioural and physiological changes and the quality of beef from extensively-reared Nguni and non-descript steers.

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RANI Theodora Zikhona

PROFILE

Rani Zikhona Theodora completed her BSc, BSc (Hons) and MSc in Agriculture (Animal Science) at the University of Fort Hare. She then enrolled for her PhD degree in Animal Science in 2013.

Her study determined the effect of post-slaughter handling on physico-chemical and microbiological quality of red meat along the distribution chain. Her research showed that most rural consumers in South Africa have limited knowledge on the importance of meat safety and mostly consider price when making purchasing decisions. The levels of microbial counts in meat from the abattoirs and retail shops were found to be above acceptable levels. Findings from this study can also act as a foundation for the development of acceptable microbiological standards or guidelines for abattoirs in South Africa and other developing countries as well as help in the development of more effective meat inspection programs.

She presented her work at the International Congress of Meat Science and Technology in Uruguay (2014) and France (2015). Five manuscripts from her study are currently under review in high impact journals. To her credit, she has published three papers. Zikhona is currently employed as an NRF post-doctoral fellow at the University of Fort Hare.

THESIS TITLE: Effect of post-slaughter handling on physico-chemical and microbiological quality of red meat along the distribution chain in the Eastern Cape Province, South Africa.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY IN SOIL SCIENCE

PETER Prince Chinedu

PROFILE

Prince Chinedu Peter was born in Abia State, Nigeria. He obtained his Bachelors' degree in Soil Science from the University of Agriculture Makurdi, Nigeria in 2002; and a Masters' degree in Soil Physics and Conservation at the University of Nigeria, Nsukka, Nigeria in 2008. He joined the University of Fort Hare for his PhD in 2013.

The PhD study covered thirteen ecotopes in Eastern Cape Province. The study explored some soil structure-associated physical properties, organic carbon and nitrogen. The findings established that tillage, texture and mineralogy influenced the result of sieving operation using Iris FTLVH – 0200 digital electromagnetic sieve shaker (Filtro Vibración SL Spain). Sieving efficiency attained for the soils varied with tillage and mineralogy. The aggregate size composition and distribution in soils of these ecotopes are a function of mineralogy rather than tillage. Tillage influenced nitrogen in the physical fractions of these soils.





Changes in nitrogen content due to tillage were expressed more in the silt fraction of the soils. Soils in these ecotopes showed tendency for slow nitrogen accumulation.

Texture influenced the accumulation of carbon and nitrogen in these soils. The clay fraction of the soils was prominent in determining the amounts of carbon and nitrogen in the soils. The findings also revealed that aggregate stability indices cannot be relied upon in isolation to tillage, texture and mineralogy. The study also showed that micro aggregate stability indices were not sensitive to tillage in these ecotopes.

Furthermore, macro aggregate stability indices such as Water Stable Aggregate, State of Aggregation, Mean Weight Diameter (from wet sieving) and Potential structural deformation index were sensitive to tillage. Micro aggregate stability indices such as Dispersion Ratio, and Aggregate Silt plus Clay as well as macro aggregate stability indices like State of Aggregation and Water Stable Aggregate were sensitive to texture. On the other hand micro aggregate stability indices like Dispersion Ratio and Water Dispersible Clay were sensitive to mineralogy. Macro aggregate stability indices like Mean Weight Diameter, Water Stable Aggregate and State of Aggregation were also sensitive to mineralogy. The study recommended the use of specific settings for sieving efficiency. The consideration of tillage, texture and mineralogy in management to curb soil physical degradation was recommended.

At present, Prince has published four scientific papers. Four manuscripts from this study currently are under review.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY IN BIOCHEMISTRY

ABRAHAMS Adrian Mark

PROFILE

Adrian was born in Grahamstown on the 16th April 1986. He obtained his Bachelors' degree in 2010, Honours degree in 2011 as well as a Masters' degree in 2013 from the University of Fort Hare.

In 2013 he registered for his PhD degree in which his study focussed on elucidating functional interactions between the Russian wheat aphid and wheat by understanding the resistance mechanisms activated by the Russian wheat aphid resistance gene Dn1. This would facilitate the development of improved cultivars possessing resistance to the effects of RWA infestation and improving agronomical traits. Proteomic analysis showed that photosynthetic, metabolic and stress/defence related proteins were significantly up-regulated in the resistant wheat cultivar in response to aphid infestation, suggesting that the rate of incorporation and/or exportation of photosynthetic products are essential for the maintenance of resistant cultivars.

To date three publications have emanated from this work.

NJOM Henry Akum

PROFILE

Henry Akum Njom was born in Chup North West Region of Cameroon. He obtained a BSc (Hons) and MSc in Microbiology from the University Buea, Cameroon in 2003 and 2007, respectively.

In his PhD, Henry studied the mechanism and synchronicity of wheat (*Triticum aestivum*) resistance to leaf rust (*Puccinia triticina*) and Russian wheat aphid (*Duraphis noxia*) SA1. The study revealed that, prior infection of wheat plants under laboratory conditions induced resistance to Russian wheat aphids (antixenosis). Proteomic analysis revealed common enzymes found to be up-regulated in the resistant and moderately resistant wheat cultivars in response to stress, either imposed by RWA-SA1 feeding or leaf rust race 3SA145. They included key enzymes in photosynthesis such as photosystem II proteins and cytochrome as well as s-adenosylmethionine synthase involved in the ethylene pathway.

His work has made a major contribution to understanding the resistance mechanisms of wheat against RWA and leaf rust. Three





manuscripts from this PhD study are under review.

PROFILE

Samuel Wale Odeyemi was born in Kwara State, Nigeria. He obtained B.Tech (Honours) Biochemistry from Ladoké Akintola University of Technology (LAUTECH) and a MSc. (Biochemistry) from the University of Ilorin, Nigeria.

For his PhD, Samuel did a comparative study on two indigenous medicinal plants used for the management of diabetes in the Eastern Cape, South Africa. He assessed the cytotoxicity of these plants on mammalian cell lines and their mechanism of action. The study revealed *Albucasetosa* possesses better *invitro* strong antidiabetic activity compared to *Albucabracteata*.

The mechanism of glucose utilization in L6 and 3T3-L1 of *Albucasetosa* and *Albucabracteata* may be due to the activation of some molecules in the insulin-signaling pathway, while the *invitro* antidiabetic activity of *Albucabracteata* may also involve its inhibitory effect on α -glucosidase.

This work has so far generated one published article and three others are under review. Part of this work has also been presented at local and international conferences.

OKAIYETO Kunle

PROFILE

Kunle Okaiyeto was born in Ilorin, Nigeria. He obtained his Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Ilorin, Nigeria in 2005. In 2011, Kunle enrolled for a BSc (Hons) degree at the University of Fort Hare and after obtaining a MSc degree, continued with a PhD program in 2013.

The focus of his PhD studies was on evaluating flocculating potentials of bioflocculants produced by bacterial isolates and their potential utilization as alternatives to the hazardous chemical flocculants used in water treatment. He identified some bacteria that were capable of producing bioflocculants and tested the potentials of the bioflocculants in the reduction of turbidity and chemical oxygen demand (COD) of waters from Thyume River.

He further compared the flocculating capability of the produced bioflocculants with the conventionally used chemical flocculants.





The findings confirmed the potential of microbial flocculants as alternatives for application in water treatment processes. To-date Kunle has published five journal articles from his PhD thesis with two articles still under review. The findings have also been presented at both national and international conferences.

He worked as a Development Chemist for Quetech Chemicals manufacturing under Unilever South East Africa based in Zimbabwe.

In his PhD thesis Herbert researched on bioactivity and synthesis of silver nanoparticles using plant medicine. The study





aimed to lend validation through scientific analyses on the efficacies, toxicities and effective dosages for analgesic and anti-inflammatory activities of indigenous plants. The study revealed the phytochemical composition of commonly used plants. In this research we successfully added value to plant medicine by synthesising silver nanoparticles mediated by plant extracts. The silver nanoparticles were observed to be more bioactive than the plant extract. This showed that there was significant enrichment to the extracts as evidenced by the synergistic effect between the plant extract and the silver nanoparticles.

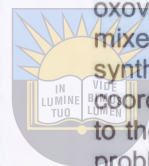

The PhD study looked at the domestication of wild vegetables in the Eastern Cape Province of South Africa. This essentially borders on the re-introduction of wild vegetables that

have been neglected by the community for nutritive and therapeutic potentials which could broaden the food base in the Eastern Cape. The study confirmed that underutilized wild vegetables constitute a large reservoir of macro and micro minerals, phenols, flavonoids, flavonols and proanthocyanidins. Furthermore, they could serve as supplements for food which will improve the livelihood of the people thereby contributing to the daily requirement for normal growth and also aid in averting diseases associated with malnutrition.



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The implication of this finding will contribute significantly to the sustainable harvesting of wild vegetables in the Province which could eventually alleviate and improve food security. PROFILE

Mawonga Christopher Deliwe, (64 years old) completed: BSc (Mathematics, Statistics), UNISA; BSc Hons (Mathematics), Fort Hare; MEd, Rhodes University and MBA, Heriot Watt University, UK. He is married to Nomthandazo and they were blessed with children. Mr Deliwe worked for a long-time in the Public Service and he retired as the Rector of Griffiths Mxenge College of Education in Eastern Cape.

Mawonga registered for a PhD with Fort Hare in 2013 and started with his research work in earnest. As an Educational manager, he was troubled by the poor audit performance results within government - particularly recurring audit findings and he saw an opportunity to make a contribution towards these challenges hence his research topic which looked at how the Auditor-General and the departments can work together to enhance sound public financial administration in the Public Service. In his findings, Mawonga discovered that although poor consequence management and questionable leadership quality were the two most visible symptoms of the disease - unintended consequences of the political system of the capitalist democracy were ultimately to blame.

Secondly, the Office of the Auditor General did everything possible within their means and powers to get the Public finance and good governance principles right but without authority and power to enforce their findings, they could not make significant impact on the ground. Mawonga recommended that the political leaders and Chapter 9 institutions must put stringent measures which should ensure that the Departments correct fully the anomalies discovered by the AGSA. He further recommended that there should be consequences management for non-compliance. The study also showed that the Eastern Provincial Administration as a whole is not making use of the Auditor General for guidance and support and hence regular poor performance by most of the departments. One examiner commented that the thesis was "... an excellent piece of research ...", while another remarked that it was "... worthy of publication".

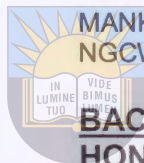

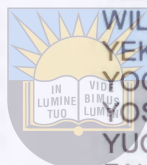

was published in 2006. Some of his poems were included in an anthology, "Selaemthonjeni", which was another of his publications. All these books were, at one point or another, prescribed for different standards in schools.

Currently the ever-determined Matshyana has submitted two manuscripts to various publishers for consideration: "Kude kwalapha" (an isiXhosa novel), and "Kudliwa ngamntu" (isiXhosa short stories).

Mr Matshayana has contributed immensely in writing self-distributed articles on African Nationalism and the history of the Pan Africanist Congress of Azania and is presently busy with a book on the life and times of Robert Mangaliso Sobukwe. His involvement in the struggle for liberation was motivated when his father, who was trained as a carpenter for three (3) years at Clarkebury and (having passed the course), was not issued a certificate without any apparent reason other than that blacks will use the certificates to compete with whites in the workplace. His stay in Cape Town exposed him to speeches of politicians like Sam Khan, Fred Cannyson, Duma Nokwe and others at the Grand Parade. Influenced by PAN Africanists such as the late Clarence Mlamli Makwetu and others he took the spirit of PAN Africanism to his classes at Sitebe School and all areas around Clarkebury.

He became an invisible force behind the historical umBhashe skirmish of 1963. In March of that year, his brother, Terror, and others were arrested and sentenced to three (3) years on Robben Island and Victor Verster, respectively, for membership and

promoting the aims of a banned organisation, PAC. On his release in 1966 he was served with a two (2) year banning order and restricted to the magisterial district of Engcobo. When the PAN Africanist Movement was formed in the late 1980s, he emerged as a force behind mobilization of the youth in the area of Engcobo and was subsequently elected to the chairpersonship of the Eastern Transkei region when the PAC was unbanned. In 1995 he was elected as a councillor in the then Engcobo district. When demarcation of wards was done, later he became one of the two (2) councillors representing the PAC in the Ngcobo Local Municipality until 2005. Starting as early as 1947, Mr Matshayana took an interest in community development and organized a soccer team with a ball donated by a German trader when he was a teacher at Xuka. This team developed to be the legendary Clarkebury United Brothers which existed until the 1980s.

In 1952, he initiated a community development process by organizing local agricultural shows when he was the chairperson of the Clarkebury Social Club, an organization established to encourage youth participation in culture, sport and economic development. In 1953, he founded and became secretary/treasurer of the Clarkebury Credit Society, a society that functioned until he was arrested in 1963.

For ten (10) years, Mr Matshayana led as president of the Engcobo Amateur Sports Union. It was at that time that he and twenty four (24) other teachers went for an athletics training course in Bloemfontein in 1974. This





led him to be elected as president of Dalindyebo Region Sports Union for the next five (5) years. At the same time he was the chairperson of Transkei Schools Amateur Sports Union and by virtue thereof became one of the officials of the T.B.V.C. Inter-State Games. As a teacher, his commitment in education was awarded with the honour of being vice-chairperson of the Engcobo Principals Organisation in 1974.

Mr Matshayana sealed his contribution to the community by making financial sacrifices by personally contributing fees towards the

education of not fewer than thirty (30) children from the community. Twelve (12) of those scholars achieved teacher training certificates and became teachers while nine (9) passed matric.

The highlight of his contribution to society came in the year 2015 when the President of the Republic of South Africa recognised Mr G.G.T. Matshayana and honoured him by special invitation as a guest of honour as a prominent person from the Eastern Cape during the official opening of Parliament.

Benedicta was born in Ibadan Nigeria. She holds a Diploma in Adult and Community Development from the University of Ibadan, Nigeria; Bachelor of Education Honours in Adult Education and Community Development from the University of Lagos, Nigeria; Bachelor of Social Science Honours in Development Studies and a Master of Education degree respectively from the University of Fort Hare. She registered for a PhD in Education at the University of Fort Hare in 2013.

Her doctoral thesis examined the implementation of school-based continuing professional teachers' development in high schools in the Fort Beaufort Education District. The study adopted a post-positivist paradigm and used a mixed methods approach and concurrent triangulation design as the operational framework for collecting data. The study established that school management teams implement school-based continuing professional teacher development programmes to assist teachers in their quest for professional growth and development. It was also established that there are informal communities-of-practice or teacher networks operating in schools to enhance continuous professional development of teachers but that

they operate haphazardly. The study recommended that, for effective school-based continuous professional teacher development programmes there should be interactive participation of all members of the school community during the implementation process. It proposed an alternative school-based teacher development framework.

The examiners agreed that the thesis demonstrates clear engagement with the subject content and that the candidate has a good grasp of the subject matter. They also indicated that the thesis is an academic work of high standard, the problem identified has been well researched and appropriate analysis and conclusions were reached. Two manuscripts based on her thesis are currently under review for publication.

PROFILE

Henry Chinhara was born in Bikita District, Masvingo Province, Zimbabwe. He holds a Diploma in primary education and Bachelor of Education degree in early childhood education from the University of Zimbabwe; and Master of Education degree from Midlands State University, Zimbabwe. He registered for PhD in education at the University of Fort Hare in 2013.

His study examined how children with special needs are catered for in the provision of early childhood development (ECD) programme in Zimbabwe. The study adopted a post-positivist paradigm and used mixed methods approach and concurrent triangulation design as the operational framework for collecting data.

The study established that all schools are enrolling children with special needs in the early childhood development programme and there are few pockets of very good practice. However, there are serious challenges in the training of teachers and also adaptation of curriculum to meet the needs of diverse children in the early childhood development programme. The study recommends an alternative inclusive and holistic model for the provision of inclusive education in early childhood development classes. All external examiners agreed that the study was well conceptualised and added new knowledge to the genesis of the new ECD programme,

especially in the area of supporting diverse learners in inclusive classes.

One external examiner wrote "The field of Early Childhood and Development has not been widely researched especially in Africa and therefore this research is topical and important in the light of the majority of African countries...." Two manuscripts based on his thesis are currently under review for publication. He also presented one paper in an international conference.

PROFILE

Mr Velelo Clifton Kalipa was born in Grahamstown in 1956. He did his primary and secondary education in Grahamstown and graduated his Junior Secondary Teachers' Course at Lennox Sebe Teachers' Training College in 1979. He obtained his BA in 1995, BEd in 1999 as well as MEd in 2005 at the University of Fort Hare.





In 2012 Mr Kalipa registered for the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Education. His study focused on the implementation of alternatives to corporal punishment (ATCP) in the Eastern Cape rural secondary schools. It emerged from the data that school leadership was a problem in as far as supporting the implementation of ATCP in schools as in some schools the issues of disciplining learners were centralized in the principal's office. Channels of communication among principals, School Management Team members and teachers with regard to the implementation of ATCP were also problematic as there were no clear roles as to how each of these officials should implement ATCP. Some teachers still perceived ATCP as unsuitable for maintaining discipline in rural schools and their discipline strategies were still characterized by punitive measures which border on corporal punishment. School discipline was not seen as a societal matter where other relevant stakeholders could play a pivotal role in learner discipline.

The study therefore proposes that a comprehensive framework which is inclusive of parents and other community stakeholders should be developed to make education a societal matter when it comes to school discipline. One external examiner commented that, *"This is an interesting topic not only to educators, but even to an audience outside education such as social workers, lawyers, legislators, parents etc. Researchers in education will make reference to it"*

PROFILE

Mr Khashane Stephen Malatji was born on 13 May 1981 at Ga-Maake, Limpopo Province. He obtained a B.Ed degree in Senior Phase and FET, B.Ed (Honours) and M.Ed in Curriculum Studies from the University of Limpopo. He is now employed at the University of Venda as an Educational Development Practitioner.

Mr Malatji's study investigated self-reflection practices of School Management Teams (SMTs) in the Capricorn District. The purpose of the study was to establish self-reflective practices employed by SMTs in performing their management functions, and to suggest a reflective model for the enhancement of SMT performance. The study followed qualitative approach with a case-study research design. The population consisted of SMTs from primary, secondary and special schools. Purposive sampling was utilised to select eight Heads of Departments, nine principals and nine deputy principals. The data was collected by means of questionnaires,





individual interviews and focus group interviews.

It emerged from the data that SMT members were not fully aware of all of their daily functions and that poor reflective practices made it difficult for them to effectively fulfil their management functions. The study provided insights into the practice of self-reflection and how SMT members could become reflective practitioners. A new framework was suggested that SMTs should continuously and critically reflect on their management practices and decisions. The study recommends that SMT members be trained and oriented about management functions prior to their appointment in the positions. The study further recommends that SMTs consider self-reflection as part of their daily activities. One external examiner commented that: *"This study makes a good contribution to the existing knowledge on school management and it is recommended that the study's report be published for the benefit of those school managers in the affected area and indeed the generality of South African school managers"*

Two papers from this PhD thesis have been accepted for publication. Moreover, Mr Malatji has also published six papers and eleven articles are under review.

PROFILE

Mr Norman Rudhumbu was born in Masvingo, Zimbabwe. He holds two Masters Degrees in Education and Business Administration respectively. He is currently a senior lecturer at Botho University in Botswana.

Rhudumbu's study sought to bridge literature and research gaps on the role of Academic Middle Managers (AMMs) in the planning and implementation of curriculum change in Private Higher Education Institutions (PHEIs). Located in the pragmatic research paradigm, the study employed a mixed methods research approach which utilised structured questionnaires and semi-structured interviews to gather data on the role of AMMs in the planning and implementation of curriculum change in PHEIs in Botswana. Data was gathered from a stratified purposive sample of AMMs in PHEIs in Botswana. Qualitative data was analysed for content and quantitative data was analysed by use of descriptive and inferential statistics. The study found that the role of AMMs in the planning and





implementation of curriculum change in PHEIs was ambiguous, complex and too demanding because of the fact that AMMs were made to spend most of their time on daily administrative routines instead of core academic activities such as planning and implementing curriculum change in their departments.

The study also captured strong insights on the influence of AMMs biographical characteristics as well as on the influence AMM job requirements on their performance in their role in curriculum change. Based on the results of the study, a model is suggested to assist AMMs in the effective planning and implementation of curriculum change. Rhudumbu has already built a solid research profile with twenty-two publications and six conference presentations to his name to date. He has so far published two articles from his PhD thesis and three other articles are currently under review.

He has also published six primary school mathematics textbooks and one secondary school mathematics textbook, some of which are in use as prescribed books in both government and private schools in Botswana. He is grateful to his supervisor, Prof C. Maphosa, for his encouragement and expert guidance of the study.

Nosizo Shava was born in Gwanda North District, in Matabeleland South Province of Zimbabwe. She holds a Diploma in Education (DE), Bachelor of Education (B.Ed) and Master of Education (M.Ed) degrees in Curriculum and Arts Education, all from the University of Zimbabwe. Shava registered for PhD in Education at the University of Fort Hare in 2013. Her study used Margaret Archer's Social Realism to study factors enabling and/or constraining teacher education models in Zimbabwe, the 3-3-3 Post-'O' Level in Science. The use of analytic dualism showed the interplay of structure, culture and agency in shaping and re-shaping the curriculum model, and in responding to the dilemmas and the paradoxes of the 3-3-3 model of teacher education. The study recommended an agency to act upon constraining factors by transforming rather than reinforcing them.

The external examiners agreed that the study was well conceptualised and adds knowledge to teacher education. One of the examiners recommended that the study be accepted unconditionally. Shava has prepared two manuscripts based on her thesis, and these are currently being reviewed. Her appreciation goes to Dr V. Nkonki, her Supervisor, for professional guidance and the Govan Mbeki Research and Development Centre (GMRDC) for financial assistance. Nosizo is also grateful



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to her family for their support. Nosizo is currently a lecturer at Hillside Teachers' College in Zimbabwe.

PROFILE

Mrs Magdaline Tangwe was born in the South West Region of Cameroon where she completed her primary and secondary education. She holds a Teachers' Certificate, a Diploma in Education, a Bachelor of Education Degree, Honours and Master's Degree in Education. She is currently doing a Post Graduate Diploma in Higher Education and Training (PGDHET).

Mrs Tangwe's study sought to establish the role of academic support programmes in enhancing students' academic performance in higher education institutions. The study was located in the interpretive research paradigm and utilised qualitative methods of data collection and analysis. Underpinned by Alexander Astin's Involvement Theory, the study employed a purposive sample made up of first year students, peer facilitators and programme coordinators.



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The study found that most undergraduate students in the university faced academic challenges such as academic writing, interpretation of questions, and the use of computers, among others. This was due to the fact that most of the students were from poor socio-economic backgrounds. The study also revealed that the academic support programmes established to mitigate students' academic challenges faced some challenges in their implementation. Some of these include financial, recruitment and training of peer facilitators, lack of proper coordination of the different programmes in the different departments and monitoring and evaluation. Based on the results of the study, a model was proposed to assist the effective implementation of peer academic support programmes so as to mitigate students' academic challenges at universities. The external examiners commented on the good quality of the thesis and encouraged publications emanating from it.

Mrs Tangwe has published six articles in internationally recognized journals and one is forthcoming. She has also submitted a further two drawn from her thesis for review. She is grateful to her supervisor who has guided her consistently during this period of her studies.

HONORARY DOCTORATE DEGREE

CITATION: PROF DN JAFTA

(DOCTOR OF LITERATURE AND PHILOSOPHY)(*HONORIS CAUSA*)

PROFILE

Prof Nompumelelo Jafta is an esteemed daughter of the Eastern Cape and was born in the Qumbu region of what was formerly called Transkei.

She matriculated at Healdtown High School in Fort Beaufort in the 1950s. She then went on to complete the Bachelor of Arts degree at the University of Fort Hare with distinction in isiXhosa, as well as the University Education Diploma. Further qualifications included the Bachelor of Education degree, the Honours degree in African Languages, the MA (cum laude) degree in isiXhosa Drama from the University of Zululand, and the D. Litt from Stellenbosh University.

Armed with these qualifications and with her passion for the teaching and the promotion of African Languages, with particular reference to isiXhosa. Prof Jafta has devoted almost her entire professional life to teaching and thereby empowering students with cognitive and linguistic skills.

She taught at St Matthews College in Keiskammahoek, Jabavu High School in Alice, and then proceeded to become the first black woman to be appointed as a lecturer at the University of Fort Hare. She was then seconded to the Mthatha branch of the University of Fort Hare, where she played a pioneering role as a founder-member in the establishment of the Department of African Languages of what became the University of Transkei.

The hallmark of Prof Jafta's professional career has been the manner in which she has distinguished herself in the promotion of African Languages, especially isiXhosa in various national bodies.

Through her membership of the isiXhosa National Body of the Pan South African Language Board, she was acclaimed for her development of appropriate terminology and orthography for isiXhosa. In terms of the language provisions of the Constitution of the Democratic Republic of South Africa, Prof Jafta has been passionate about the need to develop and promote African languages and to ensure that they enjoy 'parity of esteem' with



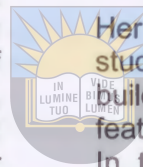


other languages. This is a linguistic human right which Prof Jafta has embraced in her professional and academic activities.

Arguably the first black academic to broach the subject of teaching an African language through the medium of an African Language, she was the first to implement this against all odds as this was not fashionable at the time. It is in recognition of this pioneering idea and work that some of her students (who include luminaries in the study of isiXhosa, and who teach at Fort Hare), dedicated a Festschrift to her titled: *Ahead of Times*, in recognition of her being indeed, ahead of her time. It is in no small part thanks to her pioneering spirit that the Department of Higher Education and Training is vigorously championing the cause of mother-tongue medium of instruction. In pursuit of the mother-tongue medium of instruction campaign she served on the National Commission for Higher Education under the convenorship of the late, Dr Neville Alexander.

To her former students Prof Nompumelelo Jafta (Sis' Mpumi as she is affectionately known to her colleagues), is very unique – she does not resemble anyone. Her life-long passion has been the development of isiXhosa. She is an exceptional educator who infused the love

of isiXhosa to many students who had a tendency of looking down on their language. Prof Mpumi is also renowned for her professional integrity and her forthrightness in dealing with issues had a positive impact on the performance of her students, to mention a few – Prof Sizwe Satyo (UCT), Prof DS Yekela (UFH), Dr Mfusi Hoza (WSU), Dr Nomsa Satyo (UFH), Dr Mhlobo Jadezweni (Rhodes).



Her unshakeable focus on inspiring students, budding authors, community builders, is but one of the outstanding features of her academic life.

In terms of her public intellectual work Prof Jafta has contributed in various ways to the development of South African society through the tool of language. She has appeared at various forums and addressed a variety of audiences on the importance of language, with specific reference to isiXhosa. She has delivered numerous lectures on the teaching and writing of isiXhosa literature to writers and publishers. For at least twelve years she has had a regular feature called: *'Ulwimi Lwethu,'* on Radio Xhosa (now Umhlobo Wenene).

Her work in the public domain also broached the subject of gender equality as she was the founder and first editor of a women's journal, *Nawe Unakho*, when





appointed by the Eastern Cape Department of Arts and Culture.

But Prof Jafta was primarily a highly-respected academic: she has read papers at conferences, authored and co-authored books, served as an external assessor and examiner at various universities, as well as publishing extensively in isiXhosa. In recognition of her contribution to South African society through the development and advancement of languages, Prof Jafta, has received, among others, the following awards:

- The Umnweba Mqhayi Prize, a signal honour named after the celebrated Xhosa author, SE Mqhayi (1999);
- The Eastern Cape Premiers Award for her services in advancing the isiXhosa language and culture (2002);
- The Education Award from Metropolitan Life, Eastern Cape (2005);
- Honorary doctoral degrees from NMMU (2008), and WSU (2011).

Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor, and the entire University of Fort Hare community, Prof Jafta's life-long work in the advancement of African Languages, with specific reference to isiXhosa is eminently consistent with the Vision and Mission of the University of Fort Hare.

PROFILE

Hatikanganwi Mapudzi has a Bachelor & Honours Degree in Communication from the University of Fort Hare, a PGD in Media Management and MA in Journalism & Media Studies from Rhodes University. She later enrolled for a PhD at the University of Fort Hare with her thesis analysing the growth of citizen journalism practice and how it has impacted on the journalistic discourse. The goal of the study was also to establish how the mainstream media are responding to the citizen journalism phenomenon which has mostly been applauded for democratising the society. The key finding of the study is that the digitisation process has transformed the media fraternity. The study revealed that mainstream journalism acknowledges the essence of the phenomenon, but it still stands firm that objectivity is a prerequisite of journalism. The practice has also been commended for being an alternative information provider. The examiners of her thesis commended that the study is very important and relevant, given the ubiquity of digital technologies and the empirically proven widespread use of social and citizen media on the African continent and that the candidate needs to be applauded for completing such a

thought-provoking study that has produced conclusions that are very original and significant. Hatikanganwi has articles which have been peer reviewed and are forthcoming in some Communication journals.

PROFILE

This study aimed at investigating socio-linguistic factors that determine dominance and resistance: a case of Katanga language in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). Using language dominant theory (LDT), the study also examined the language factors affecting the status of the Katanga language in relation to the strategies used by its speakers to revitalise it. Language resistance theory (LRT) was also used in this study to find out the perceptions of Katanga people towards their own language. The study also used language endangerment theory (LET) to look at whether the dominant languages such as French, English and Kiswahili were





affecting the existence of the Katanga language.

The study employed qualitative research method which used a case study design. A purposeful sample of thirty (30) Congolese-Katanga people was used in this study. Data was collected through individual, focus group discussions or interviews and documents analysis. The findings of the study revealed that the Katanga language which is a minority language, mother tongue or a creole and a pidgin variety of Kiswahili was not recognised officially in the policy of the DRC and was not used in the official document of the country. Its speakers used other languages that gave them some advantages. Recommendations were made to use the minority languages such as the Katanga language in both public and private sectors and for the economy of the country.

PROFILE

This study investigated the classroom interaction types used by teachers in their English Second Language classrooms. The study was triggered by the researcher's observation of a continuous under-performance by learners in the intermediate schooling Phase in the Libode Education District. Five schools were involved, where two English Second Language teachers per school participated in the study.

This research work was premised on the constructivist theory propounded by Jean Piaget and Jerome Bruner. This theory holds the view that learners should be responsible for their own learning by being actively involved in discovering knowledge by themselves.

The study employed a qualitative methodology. Data were collected through the interview method, where the researcher visited each participating school and made face to face semi-structured interviews with the respondents.

The researcher also analysed the lesson plans of each teacher who participated in this study. The motive was to examine how lessons were planned before the actual classroom interaction took place. The last method of data collection was the classroom observation exercise where the researcher visited each respondent in his or her





classroom in order to experience the nature of classroom interaction that took place. The findings of the study were that most teachers who teach ESL had not specialized in the subject when they were trained to be teachers. They also revealed that the teachers were using both the old and the new interaction types when teaching English Second Language. The study also established that the teachers contended with overcrowded classrooms rendering teaching and learning ineffective.

The study recommended that the teachers should espouse the constructivist approach in their classes so as to allow the learners to explore knowledge by themselves while the teacher serves as their guide.
