MR KARAMCHUND KRISH MACKERDHUJ

Karamchund Krish Mackerdhuj was born on 15 August 1939 in Durban, South Africa.

Mr Mackerdhuj studied at the University College of Fort Hare from 1958 to 1963, obtaining a University Education Diploma, thereafter he completed a Bachelor of Science degree at Rhodes University and his Bachelor of Science Honours through Unisa.

During 1964 and 1965, Mr Mackerdhuj taught Matric Physical Science, Mathematics and Biology at Gandhi Desai Secondary School, Durban, and also assisted in performing the experiments for the Matric Physical Science setwork reference book written by Getliffe (Chief Inspector of Science for the Natal Education Department).

In 1966 and 1967, Mr Mackerdhuj did research chemistry with the Hind Brothers (Pty) Ltd in Durban and then spent four years lecturing, part time, in organic chemistry to final year chemistry students at M.I. Sultan Technikon.

From 1967 to 1971, Mr Mackerdhuj worked as an analytical chemist and in 1972 to 1975 went on to the Technology department doing technical auditing. From 1976 to 1990, he was a distillation, utilities and oil movements technologist.

From 1991 to 1992, Mr Mackerdhuj became a senior technologist, Industrial Relations Manager in 1993 and a Special Projects Manager during 1994 and 1995.

In July 1995 Mr Mackerdhuj took early retirement but is still however presently occupied on the following Boards and Councils:-

- United Cricket Board of South Africa (President)
- The National Sports Council (Vice President)
- The National Sports Forum (comprising DSR/Olympic Committee/NSC)
- Durban Sports Vision (Executive)

- FOOTBALL:** Mr Mackerdhuj received a Coaching Certificate while playing goal-keeper for the University 1st team.
- CRICKET:** He played Super-League and Inter District Cricket under Natal Cricket Board for Crimson Cricket Club. He was captain of the University Cricket team, selector for the U-19 Natal team and he received an Umpiring Certificate and umpired inter-provincial (and Centralised Tournaments (SACBOC and SACB) for 15 years.
- TABLE-TENNIS:** Mr Mackerdhuj was the singles and doubles champion and Captain at the University of Fort Hare for 6 years. He was also a Natal Open Quarter Finalist.
- ATHLETICS:** He was Junior Victor Ludorum in High School.

From 1975 to 1976, Mr Mackerdhuj was President of the Durban District Cricket Union, from 1976 to 1984, President of the Natal Cricket Board, from 1978 to 1984, Vice-President of the South African Cricket Board, 1984 to 1990, President of the South African Cricket Board. In 1992 until 1993, Mr Mackerdhuj was Vice-President of the United Cricket Board of South Africa, in 1993 moved up to the position of President and is still President at this present time.

Mr Mackerdhuj founded Natal Council of Sports (NACOS) in 1976 for all Provincial Sports Codes and was President for many years. From 1978 to 1988 he was a Member of the Executive for the South African Council of Sport (SACOS) as well as Secretary for Finance (SACOS) from 1981 to 1988. During 1988 he was a member of the Interim Committee for the National Sports Council (NSC) and became Vice-President since the inauguration in 1990. In 1995 he became Chairman of Development Committee for South Africa and is still President to this present time. Mr Mackerdhuj served as Patron and Alternate Director to the Board for the Cape Town Olympic Bid 2004.

ALFRED Z. MSEZANE

From Shepherd to Physics Professor/Director of Research Center

At the age of about seven, when I eventually entered grade school, I could neither read nor write (no school would have accepted me in this country, the USA). But, I could count in threes, sevens, sixes, eights, fours, etc., add simultaneously and carry forward a running total. I had retired at the age of six as both a farmer and a shepherd. We counted hundreds of sheep; sometime it would take a whole day to complete the counting. The necessary ingredients for effective counting was a well-trained giant goat to lead the flock and a sheep-dog, a wonderful shepherd's assistant, to drive the flock gently. Most importantly, I learnt effective management and leadership of diversity from my job. I loved the job because it offered me absolute freedom - as long as the total number of sheep was correct and none was sick. The standards were exacting, no margin of error was permitted as is done even in the most sophisticated physics.



Even when I eventually joined school, I was always the teacher's favorite student because I could lead and shepherd others. Today, I still like to lead and direct, but now scientific enterprises. Interestingly, as director of CTSPS, I manage diversity, viz. researchers from many countries around the world, with differing backgrounds and cultures (Africa, Canada, China, France, Japan, India, Germany, UK, Russia, ...) as well as colours. It was my experience as a shepherd, which on the surface appears to have nothing to do with teaching physics, that resulted in my being hired by the President of Morehouse College. The habit of getting up at 4:00 a.m. daily and working, developed in my childhood, has been fundamental to my success. Marvelling at my experience as a shepherd, a lady at the University of Georgia, Athens, once inquired if I did not fall asleep counting so many sheep!

At the age of about four, my maternal grandmother, a benevolent despot, but a beautiful woman in all respects, took me to live with her on the farm near Amersfoort. In her view, children had to be taught farming. Four year olds were essential in keeping goats, chickens, calves out of her corn field near the house. Mr. John Lewis of the USA House of Congress once told me that he used to practice his sermons on the chickens, which merely wondered if he did not understand that they were mere chickens and nothing more! At the age of five, after my grandfather died, we settled on a farm near Warden in the Free State. The region had excellent pastoral and agricultural farming. I loved the abundance of everything. Soon the farmer, one of the finest whiteman I had ever met, wanted me to help around the farm including

playing with his son, a year younger than I. Once I even cooked for the squatters when the regular cook was sick. This brought me problems because the squatters wanted the cook replaced by me, a mere six-year old.

It became clear, when I inherited the job from the previous shepherd, that accurate counting was extremely essential to keep the farmer and his assistant happy and, consequently my job which I loved dearly because it offered me all the freedom I wanted. Contrast this with the regimentation of schooling, which I hated with a passion. In the winter, I would be left in the mountains of Lesotho, the Drakensburg mountains, with a large flock of sheep. The assistant would simply say: there are fifteen hundred and three sheep. Within a month or so, he would show up to check and count. Any discrepancy between his number and mine would be resolved by recounting. Since I could not write, I would use stones. We could spend a whole day counting and recounting until the number was indisputable. Remember that these were valuable merino sheep for the best export wool. Now you get the idea. I was required to keep the skins of dead sheep so that the farmer could determine whether they died naturally or I slaughtered them.



When the farmer's assistant was away home, lots of my time was spent counting a small subset of the major flock. After a month's practice, counting soon became automatic. All that the farmer's assistant worried about, was that if there was any undercounting, the sole purpose was to eat the extra one. There was no margin of error or even approximation — it was either fifteen hundred and three or recounting as many times as was necessary to reach absolute agreement. Perhaps, that is why I now prefer and like theoretical physics because we can accept many reasonable approximations. The difference between 1500 and 1503 is insignificant, particularly when it might take the whole day to decide one way or the other. In my field of research the two numbers 1500 and 1503 are for all practical purposes the same. My good life and freedom ended when my dad discovered that I had skipped school, stayed in the mountains, like the baboons, and became a full-time shepherd.

At the age of seven, I returned to my parents in Springs and started school. I could neither read nor write but was excellent with numbers. I could do everything in my head. This deficiency lingered on for many years. What carried me was the ability to concentrate and remember. I was excellent in grade school, second to none, even skipping grade 8! My eventual aim was to cease being anyone's disciple, but become an independent thinker. Ever since then, I have not been a good student. At one time, I even attempted to trade my mother for a nicer mom who would allow me to stay away from school, sleep out, etc. But, I could not convince my dad since I

did not have any experience to compare notes. In the city, I learnt construction and formed a company to deliver African beer to sheebins for a fee. The business was lucrative and cost-effective with no inventory.

Born in Springs, Transvaal, December 31, 1938, I am the second son of Mr. and Mrs. Albert Msezane; my brother is Richard, married and lives in Springs. I married Gail Patrick (Canadian) in 1969, London, Ontario. We have two children, Temba and Lambda, the former completed a M.S. degree in Economics (Georgia Tech) and the latter, a B.S. degree in Microbiology (Princeton University). I attended primary schools in Warden and Springs, secondary school at Inkamana and College at Fort Hare in 1960-1964. I immigrated to Canada in 1969 and to the USA in 1978 and became a citizen in 1985.

Belong to Who's Who in Science and Engineering (Premier Edition) and Who's Who in the World (1996). Have been nominated for the American Physical Society's prestigious Bouchet Award for 1998.

Professor Msezane is a highly respected and prolific theoretical atomic physicist, with an enviable record of some eighty publications in refereed journals, most recently in the area of small-angle electron scattering. He is also a superb organizer and administrator at the Centre for Theoretical Studies of Physical Systems at Clark Atlanta University, which Professor Msezane founded and has headed since its inception.

GABRIEL MOLEHE SETILOANE

Gabriel Molehe Setiloane was born on 4 February 1925 in Kroonstad, Orange Free State.

Gabriel Setiloane matriculated in December 1941 from Bantu High School, Kroonstad, and thereafter qualified for a Teacher's Certificate in December 1942 from the Moroka Missionary Institution, Thaba 'Nchu.

From 1943 to 1948 Gabriel Setiloane worked as a teacher at various mission schools. During this time, he also studied privately at the University of South Africa and received the B.A. degree in December 1947 majoring in Bantu languages, Native administration and English.

In January 1949, he began his probation as a Minister of the Methodist Church. As part of the training for the ministry, each probationer had to have at least two years training in a theological college. He was admitted to a Graduate Diploma in Divinity at Rhodes University after spending 1952-1953 at Fort Hare College which was a constituent college of Rhodes University. Concurrent with his divinity studies, he worked as a part-time assistant lecturer in the Department of African Languages at Fort Hare University. In October 1953, he was ordained into the Ministry.

In 1954, he was admitted as a student at Union Theological Seminary, New York, into the final year B.D. class, and at the end of June 1955, into the degree status. He spent the summer of 1955 in youth leadership training courses arranged by the National Council of Churches in the USA. From October 1955 to February 1956 he obtained a Diploma from the Ecumenical Institute of the World Council of Churches, Bossey, Switzerland, and for the remainder of 1956, he was a circuit minister in Orange Free State Goldfields Area in a town named Virginia.

From 1957 to 1962, he was one of the two general secretaries of the Youth Department of the Methodist Church. He was in charge of African work in the country, including Lesotho, Botswana, Swaziland, Mozambique and South West Africa.

In 1963 he was commissioned to do research towards a senior degree on the separatist Independent Churches in the Witwatersrand area. Due to the government refusing him admission to Wits, the University of South Africa invited him to do the degree with them but declined due to him opposing of separate institutions of learning for races.

From 1962 to 1968, He was employed as Executive-Organising Secretary for the All African Conference of Churches with a seat at Mindolo Ecumenical Centre, Kitwe, Zambia. This involved the organisation and running of training courses for national Christian educators and "Leaders of Leaders" of Youth Work. All this work was done in close collaboration with the World Council of Churches.

From 1968 to 1969, he was invited to lecture on the theme: "The Growth of the Church and the Ecumenical Movement in Africa", at the Selly Oak College, Birmingham, United Kingdom. From here until 1973, he earned a living as a member of staff to the Student Christian Movement of Great Britain and Ireland with the special responsibility of Chaplaincy for African students in British Universities. He also participated as a member in the British Council of Churches' Conference of University Chaplains.

It is during these years in Britain that He became a member of two study groups which made a significant contribution to Ecumenical spheres:

- 1) The World Council of Churches Commission of World Mission and Evangelism Study Section on "Churches in Mission", resulting in the Study Pamphlet: *Can Churches be compared?* WCC 1970.
- 2) The British Council of Churches Commission on International Affairs Study on "Violence in Southern Africa - a Challenge to the Churches", resulting in this publication *Violence in Southern Africa*, SCM Press, 1972.

While living in Britain, he had an opportunity to be invited to participate in many activities in and outside Europe which were in line with his area of study and previous working experience.

Also during this period he had attended as guest speaker at numerous Ecumenical Conferences, in Europe and the United States.

During the years 1973 to 1975, he was employed as Head or Executive Secretary of the Schweizerische Sndafrika Mission with a seat in Zurich. He became a regular participant in the Orientation and Training Sessions of Dienste in Uberssee, Germany and those of the Church of Sweden Mission and the Church in East Germany.

In 1975 to 1978, He founded the Department of Religious Studies at the Botswana Campus, from September 1978 to February 1979, he was a visiting lecturer at the Theologische Hogeschool van de Gereformeerde Kerken, Kempen lecturing in African Theology and its challenges to Traditional Western Theologising. In 1980, until 1984, he became the Superintendent Minister to the Kroonstad Circuit of the Methodist

Church of South Africa, and finally, from 1984 he became an Associate Professor, at the Department of Religious Studies, University of Cape Town, until his retirement in 1990. His specialisation being in African Religion and the Development of African Theology and the challenges it raised.

Gabriel Setiloane is married to Ellen Matlaleng and they have six children.

PETER FRANK SCOGINGS

Peter Frank Scogings was born on June 4th, 1963, in Pinetown, Kwa Zulu Natal and is of South African nationality. After completing high school in 1980, he studied for a B.Sc at Natal University, Durban. His major subjects were Environmental Biology and Geology. From 1985 to 1988, Peter studied for B.Sc (Hons) and M.Sc in Wildlife Management at the University of Pretoria. His M.Sc thesis was an ecological study of the grasslands of a game reserve, with special reference to plant production and herbivore-habitat relationships.

Since August 1990, he has worked as a Researcher in the Agricultural & Rural Development Research Institute (ARDRI) and the Department of Livestock and Pasture Science at the University of Fort Hare. From 1990 to 1995, he worked on a project to develop techniques for assessing and monitoring veld condition in the Eastern Cape, under the supervision of Prof. Trollope, Department of Livestock & Pasture Science. In that time, he established the Southern African Communal Rangelands Network, which is an international, interdisciplinary group of more than 60 agricultural, ecological and social scientists interested in communal land-use systems. During 1995/96 he participated in the planning and execution of farming systems research in communal grazing areas of the Eastern Cape, under the supervision of Dr. van Averbeke, ARDRI. Peter's work in ARDRI yielded numerous papers, including presentations at the 3rd International Wildlife Ranching Symposium (Pretoria, 1992), the 6th International Rangelands Congress (Salt Lake City, USA, 1995) and an international workshop on Southern African rangelands and global change, which he helped organise (Gaborone, Botswana, 1996).

Much of Peter's work in ARDRI was in collaboration with members of the Department of Livestock & Pasture Science at Fort Hare, where he submitted his PhD dissertation on plant-herbivore interactions. His PhD research was done under the supervision of Prof. Trollope, with Prof. O'Connor, Department of Range & Forage Resources, University of Natal, Pietermaritzburg, as co-supervisor. The PhD research consisted primarily of two experimental analyses of the effects of real or simulated goat browsing on the growth and nutritional quality of six tree and shrub species on the University of Fort Hare Research Farm. One analysis used data on plant growth, nutritional quality, plant phenology, plant population structure, botanical composition and vegetation physiognomy collected from 1993 to 1995 in 1-ha camps in a long-term browsing experiment begun in 1982. The other analysis was of the effects of simulated browsing on plant growth and nutritional quality in an experiment which was conducted on individual plants in the field during 1994/95.

Through his PhD research, Peter has established collaborative links with international scientists in the United Kingdom and the United States of America. He has presented the results of his PhD research at the 80th Annual Meeting of the Ecological Society of America (Snowbird, USA, 1995), the 31st Congress of the Grassland Society of Southern Africa (Nelspruit, 1996), the 32nd Congress of the Grassland Society of Southern Africa (Port Elizabeth, 1997), the 23rd Annual Congress of the South African Association of Botanists (Fort Hare, 1997) and the 82nd Annual Meeting of the Ecological Society of America (Albuquerque, USA, 1997).

Since April 1997, Peter has occupied a position in the Department of Livestock & Pasture Science where he contributes to building the research and teaching capacity of that department, under the supervision of Prof. Raats. He currently teaches Ecology to undergraduate students and co-supervises post-graduate students in the department. He continues to publish the results of his PhD research and other research projects that he has completed at Fort Hare.
