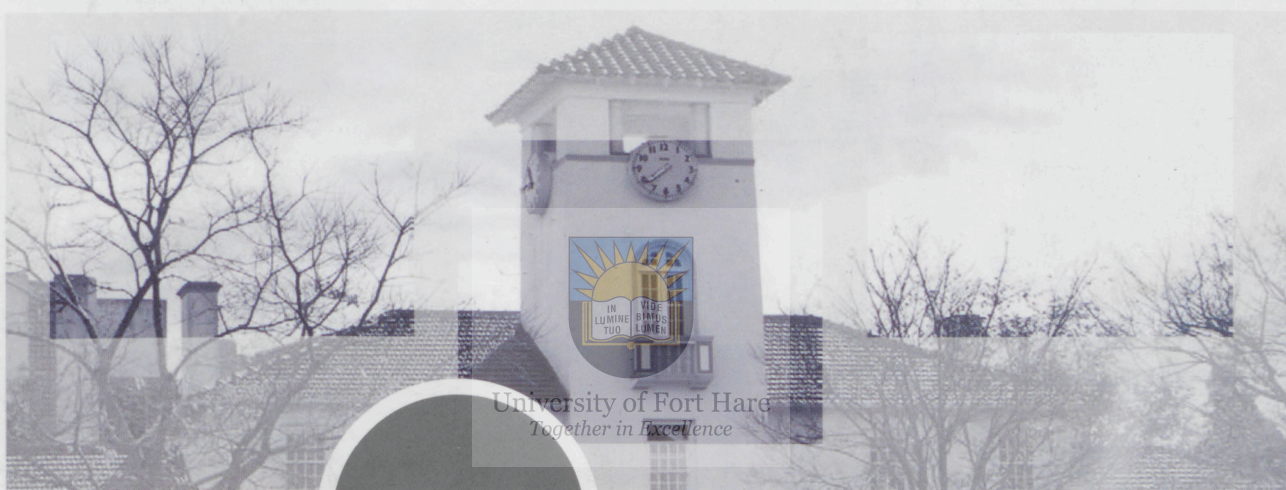

AKPAN Iniobong Wilson ✓

PROFILE

Iniobong Akpan obtained her primary, secondary and undergraduate education in Nigeria. She served in the compulsory one-year National Youth Service Corps in Ibadan before undertaking her three-year Accounting Articles in an audit firm. She later worked as an Internal Audit Supervisor at UI Ventures Limited, a conglomerate owned by the University of Ibadan. Ini holds a Master's degree in Financial Markets from Rhodes University, and is also a member of the South African Institute of Financial markets. She later enrolled for a doctorate in Economics at the University of Fort Hare.

Her thesis examined formal financial literacy training among entrepreneurs in the Eastern Cape, and engaged the new orthodoxy that portrays financial literacy as a critical success factor in small business, emerging financing regimes that make financial management training compulsory for loan eligibility, and the mainstreaming of financial literacy training in government

policies. The question was: Does formal financial literacy training matter?

The study found that scholarship about the real significance of financial literacy in the small business sector is mostly anecdotal. Short term, intermittent financial management training, while important, does not help entrepreneurs improve their financial performance nor propel business growth especially because many small entrepreneurs still rely on informal knowledge to make everyday business decisions. A paper from the thesis has been accepted for presentation at an international economics conference in Basel, Switzerland.

KHUMALO Sibanisezwe Alwyn

PROFILE

Sibanisezwe completed his undergraduate degrees with University of Fort Hare *cum laude*, and UNISA; a BCom Honours degree in Financial Markets and a Master's degree in Economics at University of Fort Hare.

For his Doctoral thesis, Sibanisezwe focused on trade liberalisation and its effects on flow of trade and the performance of the economy at industry level. Making use of an augmented production function, export function and gravity model to analyse a panel data set, the study found that the benefits largely attributed to moving towards free trade have not been fully realised in South Africa. The study further established that the effects of trade liberalisation on trade flows are largely heterogenous and some industry's trade flows have not been significantly influenced by Trade liberalisation. Any benefits tend to be short term in nature; hence dispelling the view that trade liberalisation is a panacea.

Sibanisezwe is currently serving as a lecturer in the Department of Economics East London campus. He has taught several undergraduate and postgraduate economics modules and has successfully supervised a number of honours and

master's students. He is also a reviewer for accredited journals, has read and presented 9 conference papers and published 3 journal articles.

PROFILE

Nina Mari Taylor in 1998, attained an N4 and N5 Certificate *cum laude* in Financial Management at the Buffalo City College in East London. In 2001, she was awarded a Bachelor of Social Science degree at Rhodes University, East London Campus. During 2007 to 2013, she completed and obtained a BCom Honours Degree in Economics (in 2007), a Post-Graduate Diploma in Higher Education (in 2010) and a Master's Degree in Economics (in 2013) at the University of Fort Hare, East London Campus.

For her PhD thesis, Nina focused on the impact of intra- and inter-regional integration on trade flows within Africa.



Using an Augmented Gravity Model and employing Panel Data Estimation Techniques, the analysis examined the effect of regional integration on the bilateral trade flows within and between SADC, COMESA, ECOWAS and the EAC. Based on the thesis findings Nina concluded that regional integration has a positive impact on trade flows within and between SADC, COMESA, ECOWAS and the EAC. It was further determined that regional integration is of paramount importance in the case of Africa, as a continent.

One of the examiners remarked as: *“The candidate has proven that she can do research independently and that the research contributes to the science of economics and especially the field of regional integration and trade flows within Africa”*.

Ms Nina-Mari Taylor is currently serving as a lecturer at UFH in the Department of Economics based in the East London campus. She has taught several economics modules at both undergraduate and honours levels and has successfully supervised a number of students.

PROFILE

Mr. Xolani Khalo holds a Secondary Teachers' Diploma from Dr WB Rubusana College of Education, Further Diploma in Education from Rand Afrikaans University, Advanced Certificate in Education from the University of Fort Hare, a B. Ed Honours from Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University, Master of Education from the University of Fort Hare, Certificate in School Leadership from the University of Stellenbosch. He registered for a PhD in Education at the University of Fort Hare in 2014. His study compared learner errors in Grade 10 Mathematical Literacy in Financial Mathematics. The study adopted a positivist paradigm and a quantitative research approach with descriptive statistics wherein measures of central tendency were applied to test the hypotheses. One examiner noted that "the candidate demonstrated vast knowledge

and exposition of the theories used in the study".

The study revealed that the relationship between prerequisite skills and errors committed by learners in Financial Mathematics was non-significant. The statistical results displayed an insignificant relationship between irrelevant rules, strategies and errors committed. The study also revealed that there is a significant relationship between language difficulties, the use of incorrect facts and concepts and errors committed in Financial Mathematics. Improved language competencies can thus reduce learner errors in Financial Mathematics. One manuscript has been extracted from the thesis and submitted to an accredited journal.

PROFILE

Mthethwa Nokuthula Varsity holds a Master of Education Degree. She is a Senior Manager in the Mpumalanga Education Department. The study sought to assess the implementation of state-led Continuing Professional Teacher Development (CPTD) in the Gert Sibande District in Mpumalanga Province. The research adopted the Pragmatism paradigm, a mixed-method research approach, and concurrent triangulation design. Social Learning and Learning Organisation theories informed the study. For quantitative data collection, the two samples were: 200 Grade 6 English and Mathematics teachers from 100 randomly selected schools and 200 relevant SMT members. The return rates of questionnaires were 59.5% for teachers and 61.5% for SMT representatives. For qualitative data collection, the sample

consisted of one principal and one teacher from one randomly selected school, four curriculum managers and four subject advisors. Different interview schedules were used for samples from each of the interviewee cohorts.

The quantitative and qualitative data were analysed descriptively and thematically, respectively. The study found that teachers were not consulted at the design stage of CPTD programmes and teachers' job-embedded needs were not addressed. Teachers were unhappy with the timings of CPTD activities. The majority of teachers recommended the use of in-school CPTD. As a way forward, the thesis presents a framework for the productive use of CPTD. The candidate gratefully acknowledges the assistance from the supervisors and the Faculty.

AKINYI Melissa Anne Omino

PROFILE

Akinyi Melissa Anne Omino obtained her LLB *cum laude* from the University of Fort Hare in May 2008. In December of the same year, she obtained her LLM from Stellenbosch University specialising in Mercantile Law. She was then admitted to the Kenyan Bar as an Advocate of the High Court in January 2011 before enrolling for the Doctor of Laws degree at the University of Fort Hare in January 2014.

Melissa's doctoral thesis focused on the phenomenon of "evergreening" of pharmaceutical patents which involves extending the patent term of pharmaceutical patents beyond the term prescribed by the Agreement on Trade Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPS) thus hindering the entry of generic medicines into the market. Her doctoral study involved evaluating the role of free trade agreements in the proliferation of this phenomenon in both

developed and developing countries and the measures taken in those jurisdictions. Ultimately her thesis proposed solutions for developing and least developed countries in combatting "evergreening" while still participating in international trade. The study thus makes recommendations for law and policy makers in developing and least developed countries in this respect.

PROFILE

Simphiwe Sincere Bidie registered for the LLB degree at the University of Fort Hare in 2005 which he completed in 2008. In 2011 he successfully completed the LLM degree by research at the University of Fort Hare.



His thesis sought to critically examine the new statutory rules regulating the various forms of company capital distributions as well as the prescriptions pertaining to the personal liability of directors for related corporate legal contraventions and individual misconduct. A comparative approach was adopted with the aim of interrogating contemporary corporate law developments in a number of selected commonwealth jurisdictions and to establish how the new rules are being interpreted by the courts in these jurisdictions so as to draw lessons for South Africa. Ultimately the thesis showed that consistent with the approach envisaged by contemporary corporate law legislation, the current capital protection rules emphasise the subsistence of the company rather than preservation of the extent of company capital which is in any case subsumed in the operational requirements of the company. It further establishes that the difference between the old capital protection rules and the new solvency and liquidity test is that the test appears to be designed for the protection of company stakeholders' interests specifically and the promotion of societal interests in the sustainability of corporate entities generally.

PROFILE

Tseitsi Given Ramatsekisa graduated from the University of Venda with Bachelor of Laws (LLB) and Master of Laws (LLM) respectively in 2004 and 2005. He further obtained a Certificate in Sports Law from the University of Pretoria in 2011. At the age of 23, he was the youngest candidate to be admitted as an Advocate of the High Court of South Africa in 2006. He served as a Lecturer at University of Venda (2005 - 2013) and in the same capacity at the Nelson R Mandela School of Law (2013 - 2016). In 2013 he was appointed a member of Letaba TVET Council; and a member of the Magistrates Commission in 2014, the same year he also registered for the degree of Doctor of Laws at the University of Fort Hare.

The study focuses on constitutionalism and separation of powers in South Africa since the adoption of the Constitution of South Africa of 1996.



From the time of Montesquieu to today's South Africa, the doctrine of separation of powers has preoccupied the minds of philosophers, politicians, judges and lawyers. Using desktop survey and a comparative analysis, the study examines the extent to which the functions of the Executive, the Legislature, and the Judiciary are separate and independent of each other in a modern, constitutional and democratic state founded on Human Rights and the Rule of Law; and the checks and balances that are necessary.

The study revealed that a unique model of separation of powers is emerging in South Africa which has enormously been enriched by the living experiences of other jurisdictions, the robust debates on democracy in South Africa and the jurisprudence of the courts. One examiner commended the Candidate for "a wonderful explanation of the component of separation of powers ... and a good grasp of South African jurisprudence."

PROFILE

The purpose of the study was to establish English First Additional Language teachers' understanding and implementation of reading strategies in Mthatha District. Obtaining teachers' perceptions and challenges on reading strategies was vital for the study as a way of establishing their competency towards teaching reading as a skill. Four research questions were employed to determine reading strategies currently adopted by teachers in their classes, teachers' perceptions of reading strategies, reading problems or challenges that teachers were facing.



A mixed method research was chosen for this study which involved both the qualitative and quantitative approaches. The study followed a survey research design. A purposive sampling was used to select 126 teachers from which questionnaires were distributed to collect data and 10 teachers were randomly drawn from the sample to be interviewed and observed in class. Both qualitative and quantitative data were analysed concurrently using coding and categorization of themes for qualitative data and Statistical Package for Social Sciences version 22 (SPSS) for quantitative data. The results indicated that a majority of teachers seemed not to understand certain reading strategies seriously limiting their ability to implement these in their classes. Only an insignificant percentage indicated understanding of, and therefore implemented, these strategies. The teachers indicated that they were not trained continuously on reading strategies and the schools had no libraries. A majority of teachers highlighted that there were indeed problematic reading strategies and they simply did away with the strategies that were not suitable for their learners and would try the ones they found relevant or suitable. The researcher proposes a reading enhancement model to assist teachers in the teaching of reading.

PROFILE

Claudio Chipendo obtained a Certificate in Education in 1988 (University of Zimbabwe), Diploma in Ethnomusicology in 1994 (Zimbabwe College of Music), Bachelor of Music Education (2002), and Master of Teacher Education in Music (2006) from the University of Zimbabwe. He specialised in Music, with special focus on Ethnomusicology and the performance of African Instruments.

He is currently serving as a Lecturer in Music at Midlands State University where he teaches Zimbabwe African traditional genres and Dances, Music methods, Music Tourism and Culture among other courses. He has so far published 5 journal articles and he is looking forward to publishing 2 by the end of the year. He



enrolled for Doctoral Studies in Music at the University of Fort Hare and was subsequently awarded a Govan Mbeki Bursary which assisted him to complete his studies.

The study established that the changes in context and performance practice of mbira dzavadzimu in Zimbabwe were to a larger extent due to foreign influences such as colonialism, the coming of missionaries, modernization, urbanization, commercialization, mediatization, the use of modern technology and institutionalization. Due to the mentioned influences, the environmental settings, the change of context from sacred to secular, the relationship with ancestral spirits musical practices, performance situations, the quality of sound, have been modified and adjusted in response to the influences of the new global world's ever changing audience and performance space. In short, this has resulted in a shift of *mbira* performances from its traditional to modern settings, from the village to the city and onto the international scene with a new performer audience setting. Various innovations were carried out on the instrument and its music as a result of the advent of modern technology. The use of microphones, modern amplification systems, recording studios, radio and television broadcast, audio and video cassettes, CDs, DVD, teaching of the

instrument using audio and video instructional models and the use of internet sites in learning how to play *mbira dzavadzimu* and other instruments have become a reality.

NTOZINI Anathi Nomanzana

PROFILE

Anathi Nomanzana Ntozini obtained the following degrees from the University of Fort Hare: Bachelor of Social Science (majoring in Psychology and Sociology) in 2010, Bachelor of Social Science Honours (Psychology) *Cum Laude* in 2011 and her Master's degree in Social Sciences (Counselling Psychology), also *Cum Laude* in 2012. Anathi has written and published three chapters in three text books, as well as published two journal articles in two international accredited journals with very impressive impact factors. She is currently serving as the



Psychology Clinic Manager on the Transnet Phelophepa Health care train which provides primary health care services to rural communities across South Africa. In 2014, Anathi enrolled for her Doctoral studies at the University of Fort Hare and subsequently was awarded a scholarship by the National Research Foundation.

The goal of her PhD study was to investigate correlations between the psychological wellbeing of two racial groups of institutionalised and non-institutionalised elderly in the Buffalo city area. The study revealed a significant statistical relationship between physical activity (PA) and psychological well-being of the elderly, regardless of the sociodemographic variables. Physical Activity showed a significant relationship with psychological wellbeing of the elderly. The study also discovered that loneliness correlates significantly with all four of the psychological well-being scales. The results indicate that the higher the levels of loneliness experienced by the elderly, when socio-demographic variables are controlled, the lower the levels of psychological well-being in terms of autonomy, environmental mastery, purpose in life, and self-acceptance. However, with the exception of the relationship between loneliness and purpose in life, ethnic affiliation moderate's

autonomy, environmental mastery and self-acceptance. It was also found that English-speaking elderly constantly experienced higher levels of autonomy when loneliness increases, than was the case with the isiXhosa elderly.

The study concluded that there is the urgent need to develop a solid national database on needs, facilities and services for the elderly population in South Africa, especially as far as demographic variables such as race and socio-economic factors are concerned. Such a database should provide invaluable information to assist planning, dissemination, delivery and evaluation of effective service delivery. It will also serve as an important source for further research. For this study, Anathi received outstanding remarks from all three examiners with two of the examiners awarding distinctions to her work.

PROFILE

This thesis explores agricultural production and rural poverty in the Eastern Cape. The thesis identifies different strands of rural development discourse and practice in the Eastern Cape, paying special attention to what Chiguware calls the “miracle crop discourse”. This discourse is traced back to the 1930s, when English settler nationalists embraced a new strategy for agricultural modernisation based on the introduction of high value cash crops, such as citrus, chicory and pineapples. Prior to this period, the region had been dominated by mixed farming and livestock specialisation. The new model drove new investment and research, as well as attempts to connect agriculture with industry and to manage water, soil erosion and conservation in the region. The basic ideology was that cash crops were superior and appropriate for whites, while subsistence farming was better for blacks. This was entrenched during apartheid, where even household subsistence production was radically undermined by overcrowding and forced removals. The benefits of the crop based development

model proved extremely narrow and the costs of maintaining competitive market access remained high. The agro-processing industrialisation model also failed. Chiguware’s thesis nevertheless shows how deeply invested the settler ruling class remained in this version of racialised, agricultural modernisation. The thesis then moves into an exploration of the post-apartheid period, revealing how the mantra of crop production and the search for “miracle crops” has continued to dominate the rural development discourse. By departing from its historical roots as a stock farming region, the post-apartheid government has embarked on a costly, high risk and low return model of agrarian modernisation based on cash crop farming.

Chiguware shows clearly how the demand for cash cropping and the almost religious belief in its efficacy continues to underpin virtually every post-apartheid rural development strategy from land reform to agri-villages and agri-parks. The thesis also investigates the repeated efforts of the provincial government to revive, at great cost, export crop-production projects, such as Magwa tea, despite long histories of repeated failure. The thesis concludes that the nature and form of post-apartheid rural development policies have effectively accelerated de-agrarianisation and, by ignoring stock farming and basic food



production, have undermined food security and left the province without a viable and sustainable agrarian strategy for inclusive development.

The primary focus of Adam Perry's thesis is on the changing physical and social forms of the household or homestead (*umzi*) in the Eastern Cape. The *umzi* is a structure which has endured in rural areas but has also changed due to transformations in social relations, newer forms of construction and service provision in rural areas. The thesis examines the factors that have contributed to the survival of the homestead as a social and physical form. The thesis also explores the challenges of circular migration and migrant labour for those determined to improve their lives. It reflects on some of the contradictions between desire for change and older continuities and patterns in the landscape as motif for connecting families to place and identity. Perry also provides evidence of the nature of

contemporary agrarian practices and peoples' connection to land and livelihoods, arguing that rural homes provide both symbolic and pragmatic spaces to sustain livelihoods, spread risks and express their cultural distinctiveness. He points out that new forms and desires for citizenship have now been embraced by youth who leave rural areas for lives in the cities in unprecedented numbers, which changes kinship, residence and marriage patterns. But, Perry insists that the connection to the rural homestead remains strong, as it serves as an anchor for families and individual navigate their material and spiritual survival in a heartless, harsh and insecure world. Perry grapples with the shift towards greater individualism, privatisation and consumerism in rural life and the continuing ideologies and practices of communalism.

Ultimately, he argues that the former tendencies, are placing enormous strain on the *umzi* as a social institution, but that, even in the current period of hyper-urbanisation and movement away from the Eastern Cape, the social and physical integrity of *umzi* is being maintained through new forms of investment and connection.



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These investments – into commodities, household structures and building materials – continue to renew the commitment across gender and generations within families to maintaining and building the *umzi* in rural areas as a social collective. Ultimately this reinforces the placement of homesteads as centrifuges in maintain rural linkages and identities in the rural Eastern Cape.

Anthony obtained his primary, secondary and undergraduate education in Nigeria. He holds a Master of Science degree in Sociology from the University of Ibadan Nigeria, where he conducted research on pregnancy-risk perceptions and use of emergency contraception. He is skilled in data analysis and is an advanced user of

several statistical software packages. He has over five refereed publications in the areas of sexual behavior and the sociology of contraception, HIV and diabetics. Prior to beginning his doctoral studies, Anthony worked as a relationship officer in a major insurance company in Nigeria, where his major responsibility was to develop insurance solutions for corporate clients. Anthony enrolled for a doctorate at Fort Hare in 2015. His research focused on explaining the paradox of poor maternal health outcomes in the context of free maternal healthcare. His thesis argues that while there has been an overemphasis on the removal of user fees as a way of addressing the problem of poor maternal health outcomes in sub-Saharan Africa, barriers beyond user fees exist – some with profound ethnographic dimensions - which, if not properly addressed, could undermine the drive towards universal access to maternal health.

Papers from his thesis have been presented at international sociology conferences in Vienna (Austria) and Pretoria, two have been published in accredited journals, and another two are currently under review in international journals. Anthony is currently developing five more manuscripts from his thesis.
