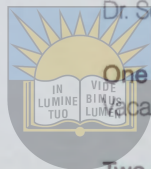

# CITATION OF: HON. JUSTICE ZAKERIA MOHAMMED YACOOB JUDGE OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL COURT

Justice Yacoob was born in Durban on the 3rd of March 1948 to a family of Indian origin. He became blind at the age of 16 months as a result of meningitis. He married Mrs Anu Yacoob in 1970, and they have two adult children (a daughter and a son).

In his early years, Justice Yacoob attended the Arthur Blaxall School for the Blind from 1956 to 1966, and thereafter he went on to study for a BA degree at the University College, Durban from 1967 – 1969. His majors there were English and Private Law. He subsequently received his LLB degree in 1972 from the University of Durban-Westville (now University of Kwazulu-Natal, Westville Campus).

In March 1972, Justice Yacoob was admitted as an advocate by the then Natal Provincial Division of the Supreme Court. He served pupillage in Durban from March to June 1973 and thereafter practised in Durban as an advocate from July 1973 to May 1991. During this 19-year period, Justice Yacoob:

- Represented many people who were prosecuted for contravention of the provisions of restriction orders imposed in terms of security and oppressive legislation, including unfair evictions and tariff charges.
- Represented, amongst others, the Durban six as they negotiated with the British government after occupying the offices of the British Consulate in 1984 as a protest against apartheid laws. In addition, he presented their case before the United Nations' Secretary – General in New York.
- Was part of the legal defence team that represented officials of the United Democratic Front (UDF) and its affiliates on charges of treason and certain statutory offences in the trial popularly known as the 'Delmas Treason Trial' from 1985 – 1988.

Justice Yacoob took silk (i.e. became a Senior Counsel (SC)) in May 1991. In February 1998, President Nelson Mandela appointed him to the Constitutional Court of South Africa. Justice Yacoob has presided over one of the most important cases to ever come before the Constitutional Court. This was the case between the Government of South Africa v Grootboom in the year 2000. It concerned the question whether the Government was obliged to provide temporary shelter to the appellants as homeless persons. Justice Yacoob, writing for the Court said that, 'Section 7(2) of the Constitution requires the State to respect, protect, promote and fulfil the rights in the Bill of Rights, and that the courts are constitutionally bound to ensure that they are protected and fulfilled. The question is therefore not whether socio-economic rights are justiciable under our Constitution, but how to enforce them in a given case.'

Justice Yacoob became politically influenced and active during his university days. It was during this period that he realised the meaning and implications of apartheid. His political life was an active one. He initiated, organised and participated in protest actions; writing, producing and distributing pamphlets, brochures and publicity material; and also addressing public meetings in support of the struggle against apartheid. He was also a member of various groups and organisations including, the 'Durban Committee of Ten' in 1980. Justice Yacoob was also an Executive member of:

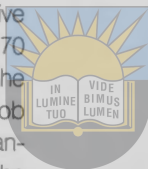
- The Natal Indian Congress from 1981 – 1991; It is in this capacity that he organised and addressed many anti-apartheid mass meetings;
- The Anti-South African Indian Council, which organised resistance, protests and boycotts to illustrate the futility of an elected South African Indian Council in 1980;
- The Durban Detainees Support Committee from 1981 – 1985.

- The Democratic Lawyers Association between 1979 – 1984; and
- The United Democratic Forum and was heavily involved in campaigns against the tri-cameral Parliament from 1983 – 1985.

Justice Yacoob participated in activities of the Natal Indian Blind and Deaf Society and was a member of the General Committee during 1967 – 1980. He was also an Executive of the South African National Council for the Blind from 1970 – 1980. Justice Yacoob is currently the Chairperson of the South African National Council for the Blind. Justice Yacoob was a member of the Council of the University of Durban-Westville from 1989 – 1993 and from 1995 – 1997. He was the Chancellor of the University from May 2001 – 31 December 2003.

As Chairman of the Panel of Independent Experts for the Constitutional Assembly, Justice Yacoob assisted with aspects of the Constitution concerned with national and provincial power, local government, the judiciary and fundamental rights. He regularly delivers lectures and training in the fields of Law, Human Rights and Judicial Competence both locally and internationally.

It is a distinct privilege and honour for the University of Fort Hare to award the degree: Doctor of Laws (LLD) (Honoris causa) to Honorable Justice Zakeria Mohammed Yacoob.

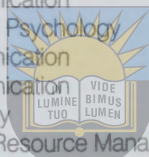

##### PROFILE

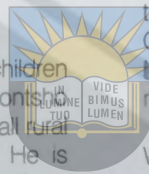
Zandisile Moses Dweba was born 3<sup>rd</sup> in a family of ten children – five boys and five girls. He was born from Julius Ntshontsho and Dorah Nomisa Dweba of Mxaxo Location – a small rural village between Dimbaza and King Williams Town. He is married to Thandeka Siyoko and they have two sons and two daughters. Zandi (as he is affectionately known) grew up as a highly disciplined child and spent most of his time helping his parents, especially his mother with house chores. He completed his primary education in Mxaxo Bantu Community School and his secondary schooling at Gasela Secondary School. After passing his STD 8, he unfortunately had to leave school to give way for his younger siblings as the family was struggling financially.

He left for the mines and was employed as a labourer (underground) with West Driefontein Gold Mine in Carletonville. This move forced him to become an adult at a very young age as he had to make hard choices of what was to become of him. While working at the mine, he completed his Matric (STD 10) through correspondence with Damelin Institute and got an opportunity in 1975 to undergo training as a male nurse which he completed in 1977. Zandi was then appointed and worked at Leslie William's Memorial Hospital as a trained nurse until he decided to change his career.

After joining the erstwhile Ciskei Government in 1979 as a clerk, he was given an opportunity in 1981 to study part-time for a Diploma in Public Administration (majoring in

Industrial Psychology) with the University of Fort Hare which he completed in 1983 – obtaining distinctions in Industrial Psychology in all three years. This was to become Zandi's new field of speciality as he was later recruited by Anglo American Corporation as a Graduate Human Resources Trainee. After completing his mandatory two years graduate training he was appointed as a Labour Relations Manager in one of the company's subsidiaries in Vereeniging. It was during this period as the mine's Labour Relations Manager that he had the privilege of interacting with such people as Gwede Mantsha, Cyril Ramaphosa, Jay Naidoo, Sidney Mafumadi, Clement Zulu, etc., who were all with the labour movement in various capacities.

While at the mine he registered and completed a BAdmin degree with Unisa after which he joined Coca-cola in East London as its Human Resources Manager. During his tenure at Coca-cola, he further registered and completed a BAdmin Honours with Unisa. In 1996 while working for Telkom South Africa as the company's Area Human Resources Manager he registered for and completed a Post-graduate Diploma in Strategic Human Resources Management with the University of Oregon and in 1998 completed his MA with the University of Port Elizabeth. On the 1<sup>st</sup> of December 1998 he took up the position of Provincial Head – Human Resources with the South African Police Service. For the period 2001-2002, he held the position of Divisional Manager HR and Business Development with DaimlerChrysler South Africa – a position which he vacated to concentrate on his business ventures which were growing steadily and demanding his attention. The break was short-lived as he was promptly approached by the East London Development Zone Corporation to join its Planning Team which was at the time busy developing the now operational East London Industrial Development Zone's Master Plan. This exposure offered Zandi with a rare opportunity to craft his doctoral research questions which were prompted by his observation that leaders in Industrial Development Zones and such similar structures as Export Processing Zones, elsewhere in the world, operated in a

global environment and as such needed to possess global leadership competencies. It was his view that if this was the case, it was prudent to ask and respond to the following questions:

- What were the key generic leadership competencies relevant to globalisation?
- Within these, what were the specific relevant leadership competencies for the Industrial Development Zones?
- Did leaders in the Industrial Development Zones demonstrate these global leadership competencies?
- Were these leadership competencies significant and did they impact the leaders' capability to operate in a global environment?

Zandi's study did not only respond to these questions, but succeeded through rigorous statistical testing and analysis, to quantitatively substantiate his arguments and conclusions. While various studies have been conducted elsewhere in the world and endorsed by such bodies as the United Nations Development Organisation (UNIDO), these studies only attempted to analyse the impact of the various policy variables on the functioning of Industrial Development Zones. They missed out on the strategic dimensions of the growth of Industrial Development Zones which relate primarily to leadership.

This study completes the circle, as for the first time an inventory of global leadership competencies has been compiled and validated in a South African setting. The validation of these competencies could assist in the development of a global leadership competency model which could be used as a basis for the profiling, recruitment and development of leaders in transnational and organisations which operate, or aspire to operating, globally. This has the potential to boost the success of these zones as a result of enhanced leadership competence. The downstream effect of the success of these Industrial Development Zones is the boosting of the

government's efforts in job creation resultant from successfully attracted investors into the zones.

This study contributes to the growing literature on the prevalence and demonstration of global leadership competencies which are essential for organisations to operate competitively in a global environment. The study provides empirical evidence that these essential, global leadership competencies are demonstrated by leaders in the Industrial Development Zones in South Africa. The importance of this study for the Industrial Development Zones is the way in which it emphasises what leaders need to be as against focusing only on what leaders need to do. For the Industrial Development Zones, the message is clear: the imperative to globalise is accelerating. Not only is globalisation opening new markets and providing fresh opportunities, it is also exposing the zones' leadership weaknesses. As the Industrial Development Zones rely more and more on the global markets for their survival, they require a greater number of global leaders.

Zandi currently heads his East London-based Leadership and Human Resources consulting company as its CEO and Lead Consultant. The company consults both in the private and public sectors.

### MAHLATHI MALIXOLE PERCIVAL

#### PROFILE

Dr Percy Mahlathi was born to a family of five children (two boys and three girls) in the Mahamane rural area of Mount Frere. He attended a local primary school then proceeded to do Form 1 at Mount Frere High School and later matriculated at Colosa High School in Idutywa. He then proceeded to study medicine at the University of Natal Medical School (now known as the Nelson R Mandela School of Medicine).

Upon qualifying he worked at McCords hospital before joining King Edward 8th hospital for a two year period. He then left for private general practice in Claremont, Pinetown before settling in Khayelitsha, Cape Town where he practiced for about 7 years. In 1995/6 Dr Mahlathi spearheaded an initiative by former NAMDA (National Medical & Dental Association) colleagues to unite medical associations into the South African Medical Association. He left practice at the end of 1997 to focus on the unification process on a full-time basis and subsequently became the Secretary General of SAMA from 1999 to the end of 2001.

Upon leaving SAMA he joined the National Department of Health as senior technical advisor to the Director General later to be appointed the Deputy Director General responsible for human resources in April 2004. Dr Mahlathi has held positions of responsibility in many organisations including the World Medical Association's Socio-Medical Affairs Committee, the WHO's Health Worker Migration Global Advisory Council and the WHO Expert Committee on Retention of Health Workers in Remote and Rural Areas. He was a member of the MEDUNSA University Council from 2000 to 2006. He holds the following qualifications: MB ChB (Natal), AMP (Manchester Business School) M Phil (Stellenbosch).

Dr Mahlathi has led the development of many policies in the health workforce field notably the Human Resources for Health Planning Framework (2006), Nursing Strategy for South Africa (2008) and the famous Occupation Specific Dispensation for health professionals (OSD, 2007). His major interests are in the health workforce field focusing mainly on policy, planning and service interface. The study he conducted for his PhD was inspired by the concern of chronic shortages of health professionals in the South African health system despite South Africa possessing so many health science education and training institutions.

The objectives of this study were therefore geared to (a) explore the extent to which joint planning for health sciences education and training takes place between the health policy planners and higher education institutions for the production of health professionals, (b) establish the critical role of health workforce planning in health service delivery, and (c) propose a method through which coordination of human resources for health planning can be done within the South African context. All those interviewed (100%) concurred that there was no credible workforce planning system that brings together university or college educators and government policy planners. The academics revealed that there is no identifiable system of planning either between or within academic institutions specifically addressing the institution's contribution to health needs of the country. There is therefore no direct correlation between the number of students trained and the health system requirements. They all concurred that this state of affairs contributes to the imbalance between categories of professions trained with the established ones like medicine getting the lion's share of funding. Their training is almost solely based on history, and not necessarily the needs of the future.

The existence of a national health workforce planning system was viewed as essential for planning for the broad health sector, to guide production of health professionals at health sciences academic institutions and serve as a mechanism

of coordination between provincial Departments of Health in prioritising and funding of health sciences training. There was also concurrence between policy makers and academics that there are issues which need to be urgently addressed on a national basis e.g. determining training targets, assessing and quantifying service gaps, catering for the evolving service delivery modes that current training does not cater for, determining the supply gaps across the professions and improving annual intakes, production targets, and attrition factors.

### Conclusion

A national health workforce planning system is required to guide policy makers and academic institutions on the type and extent of interventions that are required to respond to the complex burden of disease being experienced by South Africa. The proposed planning tool will require adequate resourcing of Departments of Health at national and provincial level with workforce planning professionals that have the understanding and appropriate attributes to plan for a health system complicated by social and economic problems.

The following recommendations are made: (a) National Department of Health to pronounce a set of principles to govern joint agreements between education and service (b) Creation of a national coordinating committee for academic health sciences planning to include the Departments of Health, Department of Higher Education, National Treasury and Department of Public Service and Administration to establish coherence at top government policy level (c) Setting up of a national health sciences education and training committee made up of government, academic institutions, private health sector and funding bodies for planning purposes to respond rapidly to the health needs of the country (d) Investing heavily in black universities to address faculty development and transformation issues in the health sciences and (e) Developing academic leadership to enrich training and service quality.

#### PROFILE

Mr Jephias Matunhu, a resident of Gweru City, a socialist, an international scholar and a commercial farmer, was born to Mrs. E. Matswayi and the late Mr. S. Matswayi in Chibi district in Masvingo province in Zimbabwe. Jephias Matunhu is happily married to Viola Matunhu. His marriage was blessed with lovely twin daughters- Patience Sibonginkosi and Precious Esnath. Mr Matunhu did his primary education at Nyevedzwa School in Masvingo Province and his secondary education in Bulawayo in Matebeleland province.

Between 1982 and 2005, he acquired the following educational qualifications; Certificate in Education from Morgenster Teachers' College, Certificate in Computers from Gweru Polytechnic, Certificate in Management of Training from Institute of Personnel Management, B Ed in Educational Administration, Planning and Policy Studies from University of Zimbabwe, M Ed in Educational Administration, Planning and Policy Studies from University of Zimbabwe, and MBA from Zimbabwe Open University.

Between 1984 and 2006, Mr Matunhu served the government of Zimbabwe in various capacities. From 1984 to 1991, he served as a Science Master at two schools; namely Mazorodze in Masvingo province and Govarizadze in Midlands province. He is passionate about agriculture and Africa's development in general and rural development in particular.

Since 2007, he has published 12 journal articles, 2 book reviews, 4 magazine articles and 2 book chapters. He has presented 11 papers at international conferences in South Africa and outside South Africa. He has several papers that are at different stages of publication. Mr Matunhu completed his PhD studies in two years. 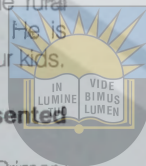

"An analysis of human resource management in the Department of Education, Vhembe District" is an empirical study undertaken to analyse the efficacy of the district's human resource management, especially with regards to educators. The premise was that the district's HRM systems are neither geared to, nor capable of, ensuring a steady and sufficient supply of not only highly skilled and qualified educators, but also dedicated and motivated ones, intent on staying in the system.

The study employed both qualitative and quantitative research methods in its pursuit of reliable, valid, and verifiable data. Interviews and questionnaires, amongst other instruments, were used. Interviews were recorded on tape and transcribed verbatim.

Human resources are, without any shadow of doubt, the organization's most valued resource. It is thus a cause for much concern that Vhembe education district is, currently, not in a position to meet its demand for educators, especially those offering Maths, Science, Accounting, and Technology. The study found, for example, that 103 students are projected to graduate from the IPET programs of the local university, the University of Venda; 4 of them to graduate with a BSc in Education degree. Only 128 students were registered for a BSc in Education degree. No student was registered for a BCom in Education degree.

There were about 306 foreign educators teaching Maths, Science, and Accounting in various schools in the district. The MEC for education has announced that the department will recruit about 600 Zimbabwean educators this year (Sowetan, 17 February, 2010). This is an indictment that the department's efforts to lure qualifying students into teaching

are not bearing the desired fruits. Bursaries, like Fundza Lushaka, are not attracting sufficient numbers of teacher trainees. Continuous professional teacher development is in shambles due to the unacceptably low number of curriculum advisors. Not surprisingly, the problem is more profound in the subjects hitherto mentioned. The fact that some curriculum advisors experience subject content challenges exacerbates the problem. The district is also experiencing challenges managing labour relations and retaining skilled, competent and qualified educators. Educators' turnover is also another cause for concern. The District is, thus, sitting on a potential time bomb which is bound to explode with devastating consequences.

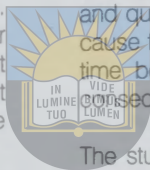
The study recommends that educators' working conditions be drastically, substantially, and meaningfully improved. This includes, but is not limited to, salaries and benefits. The duplication of tasks by the district's and provincial's HRD sub-directorates must be eliminated; the department must terminate forthwith the unhealthy and exploitative practice of employing educators on a temporary basis for excessively long spells (sometimes spanning over five years); immediate and meaningful reduction of educators' workload; meaningful extension of ICT to circuit offices; and employing more highly qualified curriculum advisors. The conclusion reached was that the District is facing enormous challenges and pressure in managing the supply and retention of educators, particularly those offering Maths, Science, Accounting and Technology.

### ZIKHALI WHITEHEAD

#### PROFILE

Whitehead Zikhali was born in 1966 in Nkayi District, Zimbabwe. He did his Primary education at Sivomo School, Secondary education at Sizane Secondary (1983-1986) and "A" Levels at Mpopoma High school (1987-1988).

In 1990, he briefly taught at Tshabanda SDA secondary school, and was later attested into the Zimbabwe Republic Police in July the same year as a Patrol Officer (P/O).

Whilst in the Zimbabwe Republic Police, he rose through the ranks until his highest rank of Superintendent when he resigned after 18 years of continuous service to enroll for doctoral studies at the university of Fort Hare in January 2007.

While still in the Police force, he studied and successfully attained the following qualifications:

- MSc Policy Studies (Universities of Fort Hare and Zimbabwe), Bachelor of Adult Education (University of Zimbabwe), Diploma in Adult Education (University of Zimbabwe), Diploma in Training Management (IPMZ) and Further education Teacher's certificate (Zimbabwe)

Whitehead also held the following positions in the Zimbabwe Republic Police:-

- He was the HOD Police Studies and Adult Education at the Police Staff College (As Associate College of the University of Zimbabwe). During this period, he introduced a "Gender studies" course in the Diplomas Adult Education and Police Studies.

- He was also the Head of Training Research and Development Section at Police General Headquarters in Harare, and later became the Staff Officer responsible for Training at Headquarters.

In 2004 - 2006 he was Part time lecturer at the University of Zimbabwe, Department of Adult education and Zimbabwe Open University.

From 2001 to 2002, he was posted to Kosovo (Former Yugoslavia) on a United Nations Peacekeeping assignment. On his return home, he was involved in training Police Officers in the SADC region on a United Nations Pre-deployment training programme in conjunction with the Institute for Security Studies (ISS) based in Pretoria.

Whitehead is currently based and employed by United Nations Headquarters in New York, USA, working as the Mission Manager and Gender Advisor for Somalia and Sierra Leone peacekeeping missions, in the Department of Peacekeeping Operations, responsible for giving strategic advice and mainstreaming gender issues to the police components in those missions.

His doctoral thesis focused on the truism that men have historically served in higher echelons of management structures in public, private and NGOs in Zimbabwe and that women were under-represented in those organisations. The study found out that women were under-represented in leadership and senior management positions in the studied organisations and that they worked under male leadership in most of the researched organisations. External examiners concurred and remarked that the study has made an important contribution to the knowledge of constraints faced by women in accessing top leadership and senior management positions in Zimbabwe.

Whitehead has also visited most of United Nations peacekeeping missions, namely Sierra Leone, Sudan,

##### PROFILE

Reuben Tshuma was born on 10 September 1955 in Filabusi District of Zimbabwe. He got his primary and secondary education in the same district. He then enrolled at United College of Education where he graduated with a certificate in education which enabled him to teach in a number of schools in Matabeleland Province. However it was not long before Mr Tshuma distinguished himself as an outstanding educator. In recognition of his exceptional performance, Reuben was appointed school head of a prestigious boarding school in the provincial capital. Under Mr Tshuma's headship, the school not only excelled with high pass rate but also in 2001, soon after his departure, it received a coveted accolade, the Secretary's Bell, for exceptional performance and achievement.

Despite having displayed a clear success trajectory, Mr Tshuma did not sit on his laurels. Between 1997 and 2001, he read for B Ed and M Ed, successfully graduating with the two qualifications. This achievement saw him being appointed lecturer in one of the teacher education colleges in Zimbabwe. While working as a teacher Educator, Mr Tshuma was also a part time lecturer at the Zimbabwe Open University teaching B Ed and M Ed students. His work in higher education convinced Mr Tshuma that he needed to do a higher degree, a doctorate, which he has now completed.

His study, quality assurance in teaching practice, focussed on an under-researched area of teacher education. It identified tensions, in quality assurance practices, between accountability and continuous improvement on the one hand and process and product on the other. All examiners agree that his thesis sheds new light on quality assurance in teacher education in general and teaching practice in particular. One

of the examiners commented that the research "... provides the basis of a new theoretical model for analysis of quality assurance processes in teacher education..."

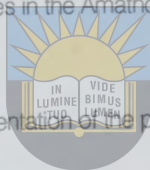

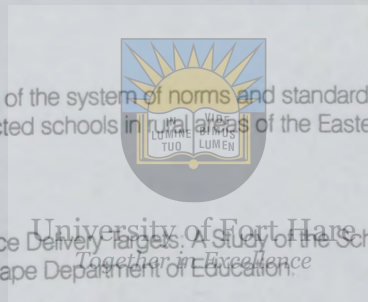

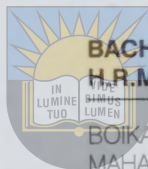

#### LUBISI NOMBULELO

##### PROFILE

Nombulelo Lubisi was born in Mxhelo village, Alice, where she received her primary and secondary education. In 1993, she enrolled for a BJuris degree at the University of Fort Hare and after completion of the LLB degree at the same institution in 1998, she enrolled for a Masters degree in the following year, specialising in Labour Law. She was appointed as judges' researcher at the Constitutional Court of South Africa for two years. In 2002, she worked as a researcher for National Association of Democratic Lawyers (NADEL) in Cape Town, and later on at the National Institute for Crime Prevention and the Reintegration of Offenders (NICRO). In 2003 she worked for the Department of Justice at George Magistrate Court, from where she was appointed at the University of Fort Hare as a Junior Lecturer. In 2004 she reactivated her Masters degree which she completed in 2005, and in 2007, she registered for a doctoral degree. Her doctoral study was supported by a staff capacity grant by the Govan Mbeki Research and Development Centre at the University of Fort Hare, and also by SANPAD Research Capacity-building Initiative.

In 2007 Nombulelo Lubisi served as a Research Scholar in Law and participated in the Clerkship Exchange Program first established between the Rutgers Law School, the Federal Court, and the Constitutional Court of South Africa, in Camden, New Jersey. Subsequently, she was also granted a scholarship by the Netherlands National Commission for UNESCO as a Visiting Researcher at the Centre for Human Rights of Maastricht University, Netherlands.

In addition to serving on a number of Faculty and University Committees, Ms Lubisi served as Head of Department of Adjectival law, and Faculty Quality Assurance Coordinator. Nombulelo Lubisi has delivered papers at national conferences and in January 2008, presented a paper at Maastricht University.

During 2008 she was appointed by the Minister of Justice to serve on an advisory committee of the South African Law Reform Commission's Project 25 on Statutory Revision, which was tasked to scrutinise all labour statutes from 1910.

Her thesis speaks to issues of social justice, to the hopes and aspirations of the average person who the Constitution seeks to protect. It addresses the right to social security and social assistance with reference to older persons in the Nkonkobe Municipality. The right is of central importance for safeguarding the human dignity of all persons, the elderly in particular, when they face circumstances that potentially deprive them of their capacity to fully enjoy their human rights. In this regard, it plays an important role in poverty alleviation, preventing social exclusion and the marginalization of the most vulnerable members of the society. The realization of this right requires the government to adopt a range of progressive measures and to marshal adequate resources to social security and pro poor programmes.

The Examiners commended the quality of the thesis. One commented: *'The scope of the thesis is well delimited and the factual content of the highest quality'*. Another stated: *'The candidate marshals good factual material about social security and social assistance in general, and in South Africa, and about the elderly population of the Nkonkobe Municipality. The candidate puts this factual information together with analysis of the rights involved to present a good picture of the overall problem and the overall requirements under which governmental agencies operate'*.

Lloyd-James Segun Baiyegunhi was born in Nigeria on the 19 November 1973. He obtained a General Certificate of Education at St Barnabas' Secondary School in Kabba, Nigeria. He then registered at Ahmadu Bello University in Nigeria where he obtained a Bachelor of Agriculture degree in Agricultural Economics and Rural Sociology in 1998 and a Master of Science degree in Agricultural Economics in 2003. Lloyd Baiyegunhi later registered at the University of Fort Hare in 2006 for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Agricultural Economics.

The title of Lloyd's thesis is "Access to credit and the effect of credit constraints on household welfare in the Eastern Cape Province, South Africa". The protracted and persistent nature of poverty in many rural households of developing countries has been linked to the lack of finance needed to undertake profitable investments. The results presented in this study support the claims that credit policies still have an important role to play in rural development, and additional rural finance can enhance productivity and household welfare, thus contributing to pro-poor growth. Lloyd has published three articles in international peer reviewed journals. Four papers have been written for publication from his PhD research, of which two have been submitted to journals for consideration.

During his time at the University of Fort Hare, Lloyd has been active in the Department of Agricultural Economics and Extension, where he lectured on a part-time basis. He has subsequently taken up a post as Lecturer in Agricultural

Economics at the University of KwaZulu-Natal.

Lloyd is engaged to be married to Ms Lara Adekunle later in the year.

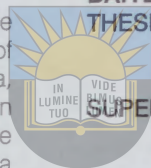

#### **PROFILE**

Monde Mapekula was born on 31 December 1965 in Peddie. Monde started his primary education at Mqwashini Primary School where there was a serious lack of resources. For example, Standard 3 and 4 pupils would share the same classroom and teacher. Monde matriculated at Mareledwane High School, also in Peddie. His Matric certificate was without the subject Mathematics, because they had no Mathematics teachers.

After completing Matric, Monde studied at Cape College of Education in Fort Beaufort doing a three year Secondary Teacher's Diploma. While he was in his second year, he registered for a three year Business Management Diploma with UNISA. He finished both diplomas on record time. After completing his diploma, he worked at Mareledwane High School as an educator. This was to plough back to the school that had opened up his eyes to the world.

Because of his desire to study towards a BSc in Agriculture, he transferred to Port Elizabeth, where he could work and study Maths in the evenings. Viola Maphosa was born in Bulawayo, Zimbabwe. She completed her secondary education at Luveve High School in Bulawayo. In 1986 she enrolled for a 2 year Diploma in Agriculture at Chibero College and in 1997 she enrolled with Mazowe Veterinary College where she obtained a Certificate in Animal Health. In 2002 she obtained a first class degree in Agriculture (management) from the Zimbabwe Open University. In 2003 she was awarded a scholarship under the Netherlands Funding Programme (NFP) to study for a Professional Masters in Tropical Animal Production at Larenstein University in the Netherlands and graduated in 2004. Viola has also occupied the following positions, Research technician at Matopos Research Station in Bulawayo from 1999 to 2002 and Research officer from 2003 to 2004. She then moved to the Department of Livestock Production and Development (LPD) where she worked as a Provincial Livestock Specialist in charge of Matebeleland South Province from 2005 to 2006 after which she embarked on a PhD programme with the University of Fort Hare.

Her study was initially funded by Govan Mbeki Research and Development Centre (GMRDC) and thereafter she got funding under National Research Foundation (Africa Scholarship) Program. For her doctoral study, Viola evaluated plants used by resource-limited farmers in the ethno-veterinary control of gastro-intestinal parasites of goats in the Eastern Cape Province. Her work seeks to validate the safety and efficacy of plants traditionally used by communal farmers on animals to control gastro-intestinal parasites, and come up with appropriate doses. The study hopes to contribute to the use of sustainable and cheaper alternatives to conventional methods which have developed drug resistance and are becoming unaffordable to the resource poor farmers. She has published 12 scientific papers in internationally refereed

journals of which five are from PhD work and six are under review. Viola is one of the most excelling female scientists.

#### **PROFILE**

Cletos Mapiye was born on 24 November 1979. He obtained his BSc Agriculture (Hons) (2002) and MSc Animal Science degrees with merit (2004), both from the University of Zimbabwe. In November 2003, he joined Grasslands Research Station in Marondera, Zimbabwe as a research officer. He then moved to Bindura University of Science Education in April 2005, where he served as a lecturer, before embarking on the PhD programme in April 2007.

For his PhD thesis, Cletos evaluated cattle production on communal rangelands and the potential of Acacia karroo in improving Nguni beef production. He found that protein deficiency in the dry season was the major factor limiting cattle production on communal rangelands and can be corrected by feeding A. karroo leaf meal, which can cheaply improve growth performance, carcass traits, beef quality and fatty acid profiles of Nguni cattle. He has so far published 8 articles in high impact-factor and NATED journals such as Meat Science, Journal of Arid and Semi-arid Environments, Livestock Science and Asian-Australian Journal of Animal Sciences from his PhD thesis. One of his articles from his PhD work entitled "Opportunities for improving Nguni cattle in the smallholder farming systems of South Africa" has been rated as Number 4 among the Top 25 Hottest articles by the journal Livestock Science for the period July - September 2009. To date, Cletos has published over 40 scientific papers in internationally refereed journals and 12 research papers in peer-reviewed national and international conference proceedings.

Cletos is yet to get married.

#### **PROFILE**

Marizvikuru Mwale was born in Sekel district of Zimbabwe. She is married to Munyaradzi Manjoro and blessed with a lovely daughter. Marizvikuru did her Primary Education at Zengeza No. 5 Primary School, Secondary Education at St. Albert's High school and her "A" level at Chipindura High School in Bindura, Zimbabwe. She completed her BSc Honours degree in Animal Science in 1999 and MSc degree in Animal Science in 2004, both with the University of Zimbabwe. In 2000-2002 she was employed as an Animal Science lecturer at Mezu College of Agriculture and in 2004 she was a Coordinator and lecturer of Animal Science at Bindura University of Science Education. She was enrolled to conduct PhD studies with the University of Fort Hare in April 2007, which she completed in November 2009. Her studies were on the evaluation of medicinal plants which are commonly used to control gastro-intestinal parasites in village chickens by resource-limited farmers in the Eastern Cape Province.

Almost every household in the rural communities owns village chickens. The chickens are a ready source of cash, meat and eggs thereby improving the livelihoods of the rural communities. The productivity of these chickens is, however, impeded by gastro-intestinal infestations. Ideally commercial drugs are used in the control of gastro-intestinal parasites, but the drugs are expensive, inaccessible, and unavailable in some developing countries, and are mostly in bulky packages that are unsuitable for resource-limited farmers. In addition, veterinary services are limited to most rural communities hence, farmers resort to the use of ethno-veterinary medicine, which is readily available, accessible and within the reach of the farmers. The practice is usually shared from generation to generation and it is, therefore, important to document the information before it is distorted or become extinct with time. Resource-limited farmers in Centane district of the

Eastern Cape province of South Africa reported that they mostly use *Aloe ferox*, *Agave sisalana* and *Gunnera perpensa* for controlling gastro-intestinal parasites in chickens. These plants were found to be fairly toxic, possess anti-inflammatory and analgesic properties and were effective in controlling *H. gallinarum* worms (most prevalent gastro-intestinal parasite in village chickens in Centane) in vitro and in vivo. In addition, the plants did not affect the haematological and biochemical properties of village chickens.

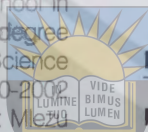

Oluwaseyi Aboyade was born on 10 March 1978. She obtained her BTech in Biochemistry (Hons) in 2001 at the Federal University of Technology, Akure and MSc in Pharmacognosy in 2005 from the University of Lagos, both in Nigeria.

Her PhD thesis addressed the efficacy and the safety of the extracts of the berries of *Solanum aculeastrum* - a medicinal plant used, among other things, for the treatment of breast cancer in the Eastern Cape Province of South Africa. Particular attention was paid to the possible effect of different processing methods of the berry extracts. Her study showed that there is some justification for the traditional use of the berries of *Solanum aculeastrum* in the treatment of inflammation-related ailments and cancer. However, the medicinal use of the plant also poses considerable health risks. Processing of the berries had an overall beneficial effect on the medicinal properties of the plant and should thus be considered as a method of making the berries of *Solanum aculeastrum* safer for use as an herbal remedy. She has so far published 3 articles in NATED journals from her PhD work.

Jaipal Reddy Appidi was born on 12 June 1981. He obtained his BSc (Botany, Zoology and Chemistry) in 2001 from Kakatiya University, India and MSc Biotechnology in 2004 from Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, India. He then moved to the University of Hyderabad in 2005, where he served as lecturer, before embarking on the PhD programme at the University of Fort Hare in February 2007.

In his PhD thesis, he evaluated the antidiarrhoeal and toxicological properties of *Hermannia incana* Cav. The prolonged onset of diarrhoea, inhibition of castor oil-induced enteropooling and the suppressed propulsive movement observed in this study are indications of the antidiarrhoeal potential of the leaf extracts of this plant. The antibacterial activity of the crude extracts and the pure compounds epicatechin and 3, 5, 7, 2' tetra-hydroxy flavone-3- O- -D-glucopyranoside of the plant against diarrhoea-causative organisms also support the antidiarrhoeal properties of *Hermannia incana*. From his PhD study, he has so far 4 published and 1 accepted articles in NATED journals such as *Pharmaceutical Biology*, *Methods and Findings in Experimental and Clinical Pharmacology*.

Muinat Nike Lewu was born on 23 August 1971. She obtained her BSc Agriculture (Hons) (1998) and MSc Agronomy (2000) degrees with merits, both from the premier University of Ibadan, Nigeria. In February 2007, she embarked on her PhD programme in the University of Fort Hare.

For her PhD thesis, Nike investigated the nutritional value of seven accessions of both the leaves and tubers of cocoyam (*Colocasia esculenta*) growing in South Africa. She found that cocoyam and potato tubers have very close nutritional values. Boiling the leaves and tubers of cocoyam prior to consumption is an effective way of reducing antinutritional factors; a major problem of cocoyam consumption. While cooking increased the protein, fibre and lipid contents of the crop, some nutrients contents may be lost. Cocoyam leaves contain substantial amount of minerals and could therefore be recommended as a cheap source of nutrients in South Africa especially as a vegetable for the consumption of pap. In vivo toxicity/safety evaluation of cooked accessions of *C. esculenta* revealed that one of the accessions studied poses least level of toxicity risk if consumed. From her PhD work, Nike has so far had 6 articles published and accepted for publication in high impact-factor and NATED journals.

Nike is married to Dr Francis Bayo Lewu and they are blessed with two children, Gerrard and Stephanie.

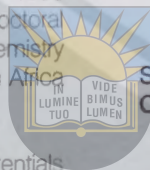

Mr. Etinosa Ogbomoede Igbinoso was born in Benin-City, Nigeria. He completed his primary and secondary education at Lydia Primary School in 1989 and Word of Faith College in 1995, respectively. He obtained his Bsc (Hons) Microbiology degree in 2001 with a second class upper division from Ambrose Alli University, Ekpoma, Nigeria, and Master of Science (Microbiology) degree in 2006, from Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife, Nigeria. He joined the Department of Microbiology, Ambrose Alli University, Ekpoma as a lecturer in December, 2006 from where he proceeded to the University of Fort Hare in 2007 to pursue a doctoral degree in Microbiology.

Mr. Igbinoso's thesis was entitled "Surveillance of invasive Vibrio species in discharged aqueous effluents of wastewater treatment plants in the Eastern Cape Province of South Africa". Using a combination of culture-based and molecular methods his study revealed that Vibrio pathogens easily survive treatment processes in the wastewater treatment facilities either as free-living cells or as plankton-associated entities. He also observed that Vibrio pathogens appear to be resistant to chlorine disinfection at normal concentration thus posing a potential health risk to communities which depend on the watershed for domestic and recreational purposes. Also, the major free-living Vibrio species, identified in this study includes *V. vulnificus*, *V. parahaemolyticus*, *V. metschnikovii* and *V. fluvialis*. The antibiograms and associated antibiotic resistance genes of the Vibrio strains were also elucidated and demonstrated the presence of genes that were only recently described from clinical isolates, thus suggesting that these resistance determinants might be further disseminated in habitats downstream of the sewage plants, and consequently constituting a serious health risk to the host communities

This research has so far produced six publications in high impact factor NATED journals with one of them currently in the TOP25 Hottest publications on ScienceDirect. His work has also been presented in international and national conferences. Dr. Igbinoso is a member of Water Institute of Southern Africa (WISA), South Africa Society for Microbiology (SASM) and Nigerian Society of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology (NSBMB).

She subsequently proceeded to South Africa where she obtained a Master of Science degree in Microbiology at the University of Fort Hare. After completing this MSc programme, her natural inclination for environmental microbiology became more appealing and led her towards doctoral studies.

Augustina Osode's doctoral study investigated the prevalence and distribution of pathogenic *Escherichia coli* (*E. coli*) strains that cause diarrhoea as either free or attached cells in the final effluents of three wastewater treatment plants located in the Eastern Cape Province and its impact on the physico-chemical quality of the receiving water body. The findings of the study showed that the wastewater treatment plants effluents are a veritable source of pathogenic *E. coli* in the Eastern Cape Province watershed and also suggests the need for a regular monitoring of the efficiencies of the wastewater treatment facilities pursuant to ensuring compliance to standards. Miss Osode's work has resulted so far in three peer-reviewed publications with three others submitted. She has also presented her studies at both national and international conferences.

For his PhD thesis, Mr. Odjadjare evaluated the prevalence and distribution of *Listeria* pathogens in treated wastewater effluents in the Eastern Cape Province of South Africa and their impact in the receiving watershed and on the public health. He found that *Listeria* pathogens very well survives the conventional wastewater treatment process as free-living and plankton-associated entities and are thus widely distributed in the South African aquatic milieu thereby indicating a potential negative impact of the discharged wastewater effluents on the environment and by extension on the public health. His findings suggest the need for an urgent audit of the efficiencies of the wastewater treatment facilities in the Eastern Cape Province and ensuring compliance to regulatory standards. He has so far published 3 articles in NATED journals such as the World Journal of Microbiology and Biotechnology, Environmental Monitoring and Assessment, and African Journal of Biotechnology from his PhD thesis, with three other manuscripts currently under review in some NATED journals. To date, Emmanuel has published 9 research papers in peer-reviewed journals and three national and one international conference proceedings.
