DOCTOR REVEREND MAKHENKESI STOFILE

INAUGURAL CITATION OF DOCTOR REVEREND
MAKHENKESI STOFILE AS CHANCELLOR OF THE
UNIVERSITY OF FORT HARE, 05 MAY 2016

PROFILE

Vice-Chancellor, Dr Mvuyo Tom, members of the University Council, the entire University of Fort Hare community, and distinguished guests, Makhenkesi Stofile's life-story encompasses a journey from extremely humble origins, to rise to become the Premier of the Eastern Cape Province, and to retire from public service to the Republic of South Africa as Ambassador to Germany. Accolades that are therefore conferred on him are richly deserved. It is against this background that I introduce Dr Stofile to you as the Chancellor-designate of the University of Fort Hare.

Makhenkesi Stofile was born to parents who were farm workers in the Adelaide district of the Eastern Cape Province in 1944. He matriculated from Newell High School, Port Elizabeth and studied at the University of Fort Hare where he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1971, a Bachelor of Theology degree in 1974, a Bachelor of Theology Honours degree in 1975, and a Masters of Theology in 1979.

His desire to expand the range of his postgraduate education saw him study overseas where he received a Postgraduate Diploma in Theology from Tübingen, Germany in 1981 and a Masters of Arts degree from Princeton University (USA) in 1983. In 2000, he was awarded D. Phil (honoris causa) by the University of Port Elizabeth.

In shaping his public profile, Dr Stofile balanced his life by playing an active role in politics, academia, religion and sport. He started his working life as a farm labourer and later as a machine operator at a textile factory Industex in Port Elizabeth from 1965 to 1968. The trajectory of his life and career was massively influenced when he became a part-time tutor





at the African Independent Churches Association (AICA) Seminary in 1972. This introduced him to the world of academia, of philosophy, and of ethics.

In pursuing this career path Dr Stofile became a Senior Lecturer in Theology and Philosophy of Religion at Fort Hare from 1973 to 1987, and he also served as an ordained Minister of the Presbyterian Church of Southern Africa since 1975. He was also appointed as Senior Lecturer of Theology at the University of Transkei, where he became Acting Head of Department in 1991. Besides his status as a distinguished alumnus, Dr Stofile also served on the Governing Council of the University of Fort Hare after 1991, and was appointed as Director of Public Relations and Development at Fort Hare between 1992 and 1994. Whilst at Fort Hare he became Secretary of the Black Staff Association from 1974 to 1982. He also became Secretary General of the Southern African Black Universities Staff Association from 1976 to 1981. Dr Stofile's lengthy association with, and service to, the University of Fort Hare is self-evident. A colleague has stated that Dr Stofile is 'a Fort Hare person through and through,' and that life at Fort Hare was defined by three things besides his not insignificant academic work – namely, politics, sport, and 'swaai-swaai.'

Dr Stofile has similarly served on the Boards and Councils of a number of NGO's, Technikons and Universities. He is a past Chancellor of the then Border Technikon.

Throughout his adult life, Ambassador Stofile has been active in politics and his commitment to the struggle for liberation and social justice in the broadest meanings of those terms, is widely-known and respected throughout South Africa. During the formative years of his political career while working in Port Elizabeth, he was exposed to the political mentorship of stalwarts such as Oom Ray Mhlaba and Govan Mbeki.

He has been a member of the African National Congress Youth League since 1959 and has served the organization with distinction in a range of capacities. From 1983 to 1986, he served as Regional Secretary and on the National Executive Committee of the United Democratic Front. Ambassador Stofile became an international public figure when he led the successful campaign against a planned tour by New Zealand's All Blacks in 1986. Ambassador Stofile has also paid a heavy personal price for his political convictions in that in May 1987, he was convicted under the then Ciskeian Internal Security Act and subsequently sentenced to 13.5 years imprisonment of which he had to serve three. Previously he was detained many times for his political activities.





He was a Regional Chairperson and Member of the Internal Leadership Core of the African National Congress (1990 – 1991), and has been a member of the National Executive Committee of the ANC from 1990 to 2012. After the 1994 democratic elections, Ambassador Stofile was a Member of Parliament and the Chief Whip of the ANC in the Parliament of the Republic of South Africa from 1994 to 1996. He was the ANC Treasurer General from 1995 to 1997. Ambassador Stofile served as the Premier of the Eastern Cape from 1997 to 2004, and was South Africa's Minister of Sport & Recreation from 2004 to 2010. One of the defining hallmarks of his tenure as Minister of Sport is that he consistently emphasized the importance of sport in consolidating social cohesion and transformation in the democratic South Africa.

Colleagues who served with Dr Stofile in the Public Service have stated that he was guided by principles such as a highly professional work ethic, efficiency, integrity, and competency. Anecdotes abound about his management of the public service:

“Don't be like a wheelbarrow” he would admonish an underperforming staff member – “a wheelbarrow is of no use when it is stationary!”

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“If you cannot do your work, I have to do it – this means that you are redundant and that you will have to go!”

To the staff who complained to him that they were under investigation, his standard reply to them was: ‘you should feel privileged that you are under investigation – because if you have nothing to hide, any investigation will prove that you have nothing to hide!’ Dr Stofile's final posting in a distinguished career in the South African Civil Service, and to South African society in general was the appointment as South Africa's Ambassador to the Federal Republic of Germany in Berlin from 2011 – 2015.

Besides his commitment to the struggle for liberation and social justice, Dr Stofile also served as a sports administrator from local to national levels between 1965 and 1994, specializing in rugby, cricket and netball administration. He was the Vice-President of the South African Rugby Football Union (SARFU) from 1990-1992. He has played and also coached rugby, specializing in junior and club rugby. He sat on the 2010 FIFA World Cup LOC Board of Directors.





From 2014, Ambassador Stofile was elected unopposed to be the Vice President of the World Anti Doping Agency (WADA) representing the governments of the world on WADA.

By all accounts Ambassador Stofile was a formidable rugby player and represented not only the Fort Hare 'Blues,' but other representative bodies in the non-racial Border Rugby Union. Dr Stofile continues to take a keen interest in rugby, lawn tennis and table tennis, athletics, boxing and cricket, and also enjoys ballroom dancing.

It is a distinct privilege for the University of Fort Hare to award the degree of *Doctor of Theology* (D Th) (honoris causa) on a revered son of the Eastern Cape.

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HONORARY DOCTORATE DEGREE

CITATION: DR NAD AKUFO – ADDO (DOCTOR OF LAWS) (*HONORIS CAUSA*)

PROFILE

Mr. Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo is a Ghanaian lawyer and politician, son of the late Edward Akufo-Addo, former chief justice and president of the second republic of Ghana and a member of the famous “Big Six” — the founding fathers of Ghana. His father’s residence in Accra served effectively as the headquarters of Ghana’s first political party, the United Gold Coast Convention (UGCC). He had his primary and secondary education in England and then attended the University of Ghana, Legon, graduating in 1967 with a BSc degree in Economics. He subsequently studied law in the UK and was called to the English Bar (Middle Temple) in July 1971 and to the Ghanaian Bar in July 1975.

Immediately after being called to the English Bar in 1971, Mr Akufo-Addo became an associate counsel for five years at the now-defunct New York-based international law firm, Coudert Brothers, at its Paris office in France. Apart from the welcome exposure to the dynamics of international corporate transactions, his stay in France also made him fluent in French. In 1975, he returned home to Accra to continue with his legal career.

He joined the chambers of U.V. Campbell as a junior member from 1975 to 1979 and in 1979 became senior partner and co-founder of the law firm *Akufo-Addo, Prempeh & Co*, which has become one of the most prominent law firms in Ghana. Some Ghanaian lawyers who have passed through his law firm are among the most outstanding lawyers at the Ghanaian Bar today.

He was vice-president of the Greater Accra Regional Branch of Ghana Bar Association from 1989-91, and then president from 1991-96.

Mr Akufo-Addo has served on the boards and committees of a number of political, legal, commercial, and social organizations in the country. He was the first Chairperson of DHL (GH) Ltd; Chairperson, Kinesec Communications (Co) Ltd., publishers of *The Statesman*; and the first Chairperson of the Ghana Committee on Human and Peoples’ Rights. He was responsible, through his association with the US company, Millicom, for introducing mobile telephony into the country.

Mr Akufo-Addo could best be described as a naturally born politician. He has held





numerous positions and played various active roles in the political struggle in post-independent Ghana. Highlights include: General Secretary of the People's Movement for Freedom and Justice (PMFJ): 1977-78; elected three times as Member of Parliament: between 1996-2008; from 2001-2007, as Cabinet Minister, first as Attorney-General and Minister for Justice for two years, and later as Foreign Minister for five years in the government of President Kufuor, where he served with distinction.

Human Rights

Like the late Dr. J. B. Danquah, the "Doyen of Gold Coast politics", and others before him, Mr. Akufo-Addo used his law practice to champion the cause of human rights, justice, freedom, democracy and the rule of law. He is well known for giving free legal assistance to the poor and has often fought for the rights and freedoms of the Ghanaian people. Indeed, many of the important constitutional cases of the modern era, which, inter alia, protected the independence of the judiciary, the right of citizens to demonstrate without police permit, and the right of equal access of all political parties to the State-owned media, were undertaken by him.

As Attorney-General, he was responsible for the repeal of the Criminal Libel Law, which had been used to intimidate the

media and criminalise free speech. The repeal has enabled the Ghanaian media become one of the most vibrant and freest in Africa. Under his chairmanship of the Legal Sector Reform Committee, the implementation of the court automation programme was initiated. As Foreign Minister, he was fully involved in the successful Economic Community of West Africa States (ECOWAS) peace efforts in Sierra Leone, Liberia; Ivory Coast and Guinea Bissau, and was chairman of the ECOWAS Mediation and Security Council in 2003.

In 2004, Ghana was elected one of the pioneer members of the African Union (AU) Peace and Security Council, a mandate which was renewed at the AU Summit in Khartoum in January 2006. Mr Akufo-Addo was chosen by his peers on the AU Executive Council to chair the Ministerial Committee of 15 that fashioned the Ezulwini Consensus, which defined the AU's common position on UN Reforms. He negotiated for the 2007 AU Summit to be held in Accra as part of Ghana's Golden Jubilee celebrations, and chaired the AU Executive Council in 2007. Ghana was elected by her peers to take the non-permanent West African seat on the UN Security Council for 2006-07. In August 2006, Mr Akufo-Addo chaired the meeting of the Security Council which took the decision that halted Israel's massive incursions into



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Lebanon. Again, Ghana was elected to the new UN body, the Human Rights Council, with the highest number of votes — 183 out of 191 — of any country, and as a pioneer member of another UN body, the Peacebuilding Commission.

Democracy

In his early thirties, Mr Akufo-Addo was the General Secretary of the broad-based People's Movement for Freedom and Justice (PMFJ), which was composed of political stalwarts that opposed military rule. This group led the "NO" campaign in the UNIGOV referendum of 1978, ultimately bringing about the downfall of the Acheampong military government on 5 July 1978, and the restoration of multiparty democratic rule to the country in 1979. Mr Akufo-Addo had to go briefly into exile after the referendum, when his life was in danger. But, from Europe, he could be heard constantly on the *BBC World Service*, vigorously criticising the military rulers back in Ghana and calling for a return to democracy. In 1991, Mr Akufo-Addo was the chairman of the Organising Committee of the Danquah-Busia Memorial Club, a club dedicated to the preservation of the memory and ideals of the two great advocates of Ghanaian democracy, Dr. J.B. Danquah and Dr. K.A. Busia, Prime Minister in the 2nd Republic of Ghana. Mr Akufo-Addo travelled throughout Ghana to establish branches of the Club all over the country

in the grassroots style for which he is known.

In 1995, Mr Akufo-Addo led the famous "KumePreko" protest demonstrations of the Alliance for Change (AFC), a broad-based political pressure group, which mobilised more than a million people onto the streets of Ghana to protest the harsh political and economic conditions of the time. It is well established that those demonstrations helped create the environment for the victory of the NPP in the 2000 elections. In 2008, he contested for the presidency, but lost the elections. Mr Akufo-Addo once again contested the 2012 presidential elections, and, when he was declared a loser, he petitioned the Supreme Court. He, however, won cross-party acclaim for quickly accepting the Supreme Court ruling, which dismissed his petition and announced that he would not seek a judicial review of the ruling, even though he was entitled to, so that the country would move on. Mr Akufo-Addo's actions have won him a great deal of respect from Ghanaians and a lot of political watchers around the world. He helped preserve the peace and stability of Ghana.

Non-racialism

His passionate commitment to non-racialism becomes more pronounced when dealing with matters regarding gender, discrimination, race and ethnicity.





Mr Akufo-Addo's upbringing, education and professional practice as a lawyer and politician have all combined to make him a true cosmopolitan advocate for a just and inclusive world, where every human being enjoys equal worth and opportunities, regardless of their gender, race or ethnicity. Having sojourned in England for his education, and later in France at the commencement of his legal career, he had first-hand experience of racial prejudice and became committed to ensuring that no human being suffers the indignity of racial or ethnic discrimination in whatever manifestation it takes. His law firm in Accra has a deliberate and inclusive recruitment policy which has enabled many outstanding lawyers across the gender, ethnic or racial divide in the society to ply their trade based only on merit and professionalism.

Gender equality

Mr. Akufo-Addo is an ardent champion when it comes to the promotion of gender equality. Perhaps, due to the fact that all his five children are girls, he has constantly fought for the right to education of the girl-child in order to bring emancipation to the African child, especially in rural areas, where the dignity and potential of women are often compromised by poverty, disease and anachronistic cultural practices. To this end, Mr. Akufo-Addo has urged governments in Ghana to prioritise

education by making basic education not only compulsory, but free for all children up to secondary school. Again, his law firm in Accra has groomed many female lawyers, who have excelled in their law practice. One of them serves as a respected judge on the Supreme Court of Ghana. Two of the female lawyers who trained in his law chambers, Mrs Ursula Owusu Ekuful and Ms Irene Addo, are both, currently, prominent Members of Parliament.

Progressive social, educational and economic development of society

As soon as his political party assumed the reins of government in 2001, Mr. Akufo-Addo successfully embarked on a court automation programme purposefully aimed at speeding up the dispensation of justice through the use of enhanced ICT by court officials. Besides, he was a significant voice in the Kufuor administration, which promoted infrastructural development on a scale which is yet unmatched by two successive governments to date. On the educational development front, Mr Akufo-Addo is so popular in Ghana for his advocacy of free primary and secondary school education in Ghana. He personifies the zero tolerance for corruption in government and advocates for community beneficiation from the proceeds of natural resources such as gold and oil, especially in mining towns



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suffering from environmental degradation and pollution. Mr. NAD Akufo-Addo's legal and political leadership roles, both past and present, significantly contribute to human rights, constitutional democracy as well as socio-economic development

as enshrined in the University of Fort Hare's strategic vision and mission. It is in view of this that the University of Fort Hare is honoured to be associated with such a distinguished lawyer and politician.

MASUMBE Paul Sakwe

PROFILE

Paul Sakwe Masumbe completed a Bachelor's degree in English Private Law from the University of Yaoundé in 2000, and Master's degree in Public Law and Jurisprudence from the University of the Western Cape in 2013. In 2014 he registered for the degree of Doctor of Laws (LLD) at the University of Fort Hare.

His research focuses on the naturalisation of refugees under South African and international law, a topic that is very pertinent and relevant in the wake of the unprecedented global migration and the refugee crises it has triggered especially in Europe.

Using desktop research methodology and document analysis, the candidate admirably employed the French philosopher Michel Foucault's discourse on biopolitics and neoliberalism to explain South African law, jurisprudence and administrative policies in the light of the global context within which State sovereignty, human rights, citizenship and refugee rights operate. His research

revealed the interplay of complex legal and practical impediments towards the process of naturalisation of refugees in South Africa: lack of humane treatment in the process; superfluous and complex stages in the application of permanent residence and citizenship; failure to comply with court orders upholding refugee rights, neglect of international obligations and disregard of constitutional precepts by government officials. The study concludes that the system was designed to fail the refugee population in South Africa because of the complicated application process and passage to citizenship.

It recommends, amongst others, amendments to the current statutory regimes on refugees, immigration in general as well as citizenship acquired by naturalisation and strengthening policy implementation at the Department of Home Affairs. These recommendations have the potential to enhance positively the realisation of full refugee rights in South Africa and elsewhere. All the three Examiners concluded that the thesis is a work of academic distinction and scholarship and recommend that it be published. One Examiner commented: *This is one of the studies I have read where the writing is conversational,*





emotive, and passionate in pleading the cause of the oppressed and taking the dialogue, through the use of simple language, to the audience most in need of the solutions suggested.

PROFILE

Chancellor Reverend Stofile, Vice-Chancellor, Dr Tom, and the entire University of Fort Hare community – it is an honour to present Dr Pumzile Mlambo-Ngcuka, for the honorary degree, Doctor of Social Science.

Pumzile Mlambo-Ngcuka was born on 3 November 1955 in Cleremont, Durban, Natal. She matriculated from Ohlange High School in Inanda and enrolled with the National University of Lesotho for a Bachelor of Arts degree in Social Science and Education. After graduating she lectured at Mpumalanga Teachers College from 1980 – 1981, and also taught at Ohlange High School from 1981 – 1983. Thereafter Ms Mlambo-Ngcuka obtained qualifications in Gender Policy and Planning at the Development Planning Unit at the University College, London, in 1988. She furthermore obtained a Masters in Philosophy degree in Education Planning and Policy from the University of Cape Town (UCT) in 2003, and in the same year was awarded an Honorary Doctorate from the Witwatersrand Technikon. Dr Mlambo-Ngcuka's crowning academic and

educational achievement was in 2013 when she was awarded a doctorate from the University of Warwick for her work on using mobile technologies to support Teacher Development in resource poor nations.

Dr Mlambo-Ngcuka has gained a prominent profile in South African society because of her proven contribution to national development and social cohesion at local, national, and international levels.

At local level, Dr Mlambo-Ngcuka began her professional life as a teacher in local schools in KwaZulu-Natal. She then got involved in community development, especially in the Western Cape where she was a founding member of the Gugulethu Community Development Corporation. She also worked for the World University Service South Africa (WUS) based in Cape Town. This body provided support to organizations promoting literacy, rural development and outreach to marginal communities.

At national level, Dr Mlambo-Ngcuka was a cabinet minister and the first female Deputy-President of the Republic of South Africa. From 2005 to 2008, she



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served as Deputy President of South Africa, overseeing programmes to combat poverty and bring the advantages of a growing economy to the poor, with a particular focus on women. Prior to this, she served as Minister of Minerals and Energy from 1999 to 2005 and Deputy Minister in the Department of Trade and Industry from 1996 to 1999. She was a Member of Parliament from 1994 to 1996 as part of South Africa's first democratic government. She initiated, and was involved in, national economic development programmes such as the Accelerated and Shared Growth Initiative for South Africa (ASGISA), the Reconstruction and Development Programme (RDP), and the Joint Initiative on Priority Skills Acquisition (JIPSA). At international level, she worked as a youth director for the Young Women's Christian Association (YWCA) Board in Geneva where she was involved in promoting the development of education in Africa, Asia, and the Middle East. She was also appointed as the Executive Director of the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and Empowerment of Women (UN Women) on 10 July 2013.

Dr Mlambo-Ngcuka has met the University of Fort Hare criteria and values for the awarding of honorary degrees in an outstanding manner. With regard to gender equality Dr Mlambo-Ngcuka has displayed exemplary values. Dr Mlambo-

Ngcuka's interest in gender equality dates back to her student days. A few years after completing her first degree in Social Science and Education at the National University of Lesotho, she also obtained a qualification in Gender Policy and Planning at the University College of London. She later became the President of the Natal Organization of Women under the auspices of the United Democratic Front. Later still, she worked for the YWCA in Geneva. She was also the Director of a Cape Town organization known as "TEAM", where she was involved in promoting economic self-reliance and skills training programmes among women in informal settlements and African Independent Churches. She worked as a management consultant at Phumelela Services promoting race- and gender-sensitive organizational development. In February 2006, she became the first woman to be appointed Deputy President of the Republic of South Africa, and in July 2013, she was appointed as Executive Director of the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and Empowerment of Women (UN Women). The fact that she has occupied many high-ranking positions that are not commonly occupied by women has no doubt also served to pioneer and to promote gender equality and non-sexism in society.



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Dr Mlambo-Ngcuka's contribution to a South African society based on the values of human rights, democratic principles, and non-racialism is well-documented and well-known. Dr Mlambo-Ngcuka has at various times been a staunch member of organizations that fought for human rights, democracy, and non-racialism. Examples of these are her engagement in the United Democratic Front and the African National Congress in the South African liberation struggle. She has also participated in many community development initiatives, and gender activist movements, that intersect with human rights, democracy, and non-racialism and that operated under the umbrella of these bodies. Her commitment to the consolidation of democracy and human rights in South Africa have been outlined in her service in government above. Dr Mlambo-Ngcuka has similarly made significant contributions to the progressive social, educational, and economic development of South African society.

Dr Mlambo-Ngcuka has been highly successful in promoting commitment to education. She has done this through personal example in the first place. She has availed herself of every possible opportunity to further her studies. She has done this until she reached the pinnacle of education – the doctoral degree – at the age of 58 in 2013. After

vacating her cabinet positions, Dr Mlambo-Ngcuka established her own foundation – known as the Umlambo Foundation – to provide support to schools in impoverished areas. She did this in the hope of improving the quality of education in these schools and thus helping in eradicating poverty in the country. The Foundation currently supports 33 schools in all provinces.

Her work in the YWCA in Geneva involved promoting the development of education in Africa, Asia, and the Middle East. She was awarded an honorary doctorate by Wits Technikon in 2003 and has been the Chancellor of the Tshwane University of Technology since 2007. According to its Vision and Mission, the University of Fort Hare is not only committed to teaching and research excellence, but it also aspires to use the knowledge thus generated for the scientific, technological, and socio-economic development of our nation and the wider world. This is exactly what Dr Mlambo-Ngcuka has done for many years. She has equipped herself with a high level of education and has used that education not only for her own benefit but for the benefit of society at large both in South Africa and elsewhere. She worked for the political emancipation of South Africa, which was of benefit not only to the people of this country but to the whole world. Her work for gender equality was

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also for the benefit of Africa, Asia, and the Middle East. It took place, not only in South Africa, but in Europe as well. Her Foundation, the Umlambo Foundation, tries to promote high-quality education in schools located in impoverished areas, the ultimate aim being to reduce the level of unemployment and poverty in the country. With her appointment as the Executive Director of the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and Empowerment of Women, she now clearly works for the benefit of the whole world.

For her lifelong commitment and participation in the political struggle for democracy, non-racialism, for non-sexism and gender equality, and for raising the profile of the importance of education in South Africa, it is a distinct privilege for the University of Fort Hare to award the degree of *Doctor of Social Science* (D Soc Sc) to Pumzile Mlambo-Ngcuka.

DOCTOR OF LITERATURE AND PHILOSOPHY IN AFRIKAANS

CHAUDHARI Shamiega ✓

PROFILE

Shamiega holds a BA-degree, a Diploma in Higher Education and an Honours degree in Afrikaans which she obtained from the University of the Western Cape. Her Masters' degree in Afrikaans was obtained from the University of Fort Hare.

The topic of her doctoral thesis was derived from two things very dear to her heart; slavery and women. Her study focussed on the Silences of Female Slaves which she approached from an African Womanist perspective. With this in mind she sees history as a reflection of male contributions and male dominance that generally ignored the contributions and voices of women. The voices and existence of the female slave in the South African history left a void that until now received little attention. The female slave's triple oppression, of being black, being a woman and being a mere possession, placed her in the lowest order of colonial society and confirmed the worthlessness of her existence.

Although the slave women have played important roles in history, their presence was taken for granted and their existence ignored while they were forced to endure their physical and emotional pain and suffering in silence."

The results of the study show that the female slaves were not just weak and submissive as many of the texts portray, but that they had agency and used silence as a strategy of resistance.

One examiner stated that "the thesis makes a substantial contribution to the field of Afrikaans literary studies by introducing new perspectives and methodologies". Her work sensitises the reader to South Africa's painful history of colonialism, patriarchy and racism, a topic tackled with integrity and enthusiasm.

PROFILE

Dondolo has Masters in Public and Visual History from UWC. Dondolo is the Rockefeller Scholarship holder and he spent one academic year at the Centre for the Study of Public Scholarship, Emory University in Atlanta, USA. He did his summer internship at the Smithsonian Institute in Washington DC, particularly at the Centre for Folklife and Cultural Heritage, and the Birmingham Civil Rights Institute in Alabama, USA. Further, he has published a number of academic articles and co-authored a book. Dondolo has 17 years of experience in heritage sector, including lecturing and supervision of honours students and working in local government. In this period he worked at the Amathole District Municipality, South African Heritage Resources Agency, District Six Museum, Human Sciences

Research Council, Robben Island Museum to mention a few.

Dondolo is the Council Member and Chairperson of the National Museum based in Bloemfontein until 31 August 2018. PROFILE

Amos Apraku is currently doing his postdoctoral research with the Association of Commonwealth Universities under its CIRCLE programme.

His thesis examines climate change risk perceptions, vulnerability and the significance of 'assets' in mitigation and adaptation in rural and peri-urban East London and Port Elizabeth, South Africa. It also assesses the levels of local climate change awareness and local interpretations of the causes of climate change. At macro community level, the study finds that agriculture, food security, water resources, human settlements, health, ecosystems and biodiversity are the most affected by climate change. At a micro scale, it finds that households have different levels of vulnerability to climate change depending on the diversity of their asset portfolios.

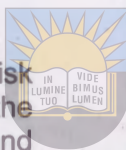
Households are partially (or collectively) relying on human, social, physical, natural, and financial capital in their

adaptation strategies. A major thesis of the study is that, in addition to economic and other class-based assets, indigenous or local knowledge plays an important role in the ways local residents mitigate and adapt to climate change. The study concludes that this contribution of indigenous knowledge systems to climate change mitigation and adaptation in South Africa warrants its recognition as one of the key assets of livelihood construction and diversification in rural and peri-urban settings.

PROFILE

Iliana Nadi Albino is Chief of Education and Adolescent Development UNICEF, South Africa. Born in Juba, South Sudan, and having been exiled in Kenya at the tender age of two months due to political unrest, she grew up and was schooled in Kenya. After completing her Master of Arts Education and the Management of Change at the University of Sussex in 1995. She started her professional journey in 1996 when she joined Operation Lifeline Sudan.

Ms Albino has over 16 years of work experience in international development, specifically in gender, HIV/AIDS; Education; Early Childhood Development; Child protection; resource mobilisation; social policy and planning. She has worked with UNICEF in several specialist portfolios in Education:

- South Sudan: 1996 to 2000
- Lesotho: 2001 to October 2004
- South Africa: June 2006 to date

In these capacities, Ms Albino has played a vital role in the Continent in advocating for girls' access to education. As a national of Kenya, Ms. Albino has played a definitive role in both enhancing education rights, and working with

governments and civil society at all levels, to build policies, systems and practices required to achieve quality basic education for all children. She is politically astute, which has contributed to 'big picture' change in the education sector; and helped her to address challenging and controversial issues such as HIV, girls' education and child/community participation. As a visionary and strategic thinker, she advocates with governments and civil society at the highest levels for the fulfillment of children and women's

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Ms Albino has become one of the most important leaders for educational transformation within UNICEF. Having worked in unstable countries, emergency environments and conflict regions, she is known for her ability to promote educational access in the process of building country stability.

Some of her achievements include:

PROFILE

Thandiswa Pretty Mpiti was born in Mdantsane, Eastern Cape South Africa. She obtained a Bachelor of Education (Foundation and Intermediate Phase), Bachelor of Education Honours, and Master of Education in English Language from the University of Fort Hare.

The focus of her study was finding remedial procedures that can improve the learners' writing. Mpiti's study used a qualitative design within an interpretivist paradigm. The study revealed a marked improvement in the writing performance of learners who used the process approach in writing. The instruments used for data collection were semi structured interviews, classroom observations and document analysis.

The study clearly identifies the possible causes of the writing difficulties in EFAL in particular and content subjects in general. The findings of Mpiti's study will help teachers greatly in the implementation of instruction and general

classroom pedagogy of writing and suggests strategies to minimise these writing difficulties.

The study concludes that problem-based learning strategies should be embraced by both the teachers and learners in order to enhance learners' academic achievement in writing in English First Additional Language. The thesis has produced two published papers and one is currently under review.

Nondwe Cynthia Phelokazi Ngibe was born in Mount Frere, Eastern Cape. She obtained her Secondary Teachers' Diploma (STD) in Mathematics and Physical Science from Maluti College of Education in 1987. She obtained her FDE and B.Ed. in 1999 and 2001 respectively from the University of Port Elizabeth (UPE) and B.Ed. (Hons.) in Mathematics from Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University (NMMU) in 2006. She did her BA at UNITRA in 1997 and Master's degree in Education Management from Walter Sisulu University (WSU) in 2013.

Ngibe's study used a case study approach within an interpretivist paradigm. The study revealed that frequent changes in curriculum affect the process of teaching and learning

negatively and most teachers prefer the old system because they believe that the new curriculum has no direction.

The study concluded that the curriculum must make allowance for schools in urban, semi-urban, rural and deep-rural areas. Teachers should be trained for at least one year for the curriculum to be implemented effectively. She has published an article from her thesis and is preparing to submit two papers for review.
