MBATYOTI Peliwe Yvonne PROFILE

Peliwe Mbatyoti's study examines the social status of married amaXhosa women, as depicted in isiXhosa literary texts. The study was undertaken within the framework of postcolonial literary theory as well as feminist theory. Her study is aimed at the identification of practices that discriminate against amaXhosa women, including the practice of forced marriage (*ukuthwala*). The aim of the study was to recommend measures that will contribute towards the eradication of such practices. For the purposes of the investigation, a selected number of isiXhosa literary texts were identified and analysed. The main focus of the study was on the analysis of texts that were published during the pre-1994 era as well as the post-1994 democratic era. The study noted that instances of discrimination against women are still a frequent occurrence in amaXhosa society. This includes practices such as forced marriage, violence against women and even cases of human trafficking. The study recommends that all stakeholders should work together to curtail these malpractices. This includes, *inter alia*, the

organising of more effective public awareness campaigns as well as greater empowerment of the country's police services and the social work profession

MYOLI Ndileka PROFILE

Ndileka Myoli's study examined the level of pragmatic competence of isiXhosa home language high school learners in the East London district. The focus of the study was on pragmatics, a branch of linguistics that focuses on the appropriate contextual use of a particular language's resources. The aim of the study was to recommend appropriate teaching methods that will contribute towards the improvement of the pragmatic competence of high school learners. For the purposes of the investigation, data was collected from a sample group of 108 learners and nine teachers. The sample group was identified through a process of random sampling and evaluation took place by means of a written teachers' questionnaire and an assessment test for the learners. The study noted that the pragmatic competence of isiXhosa high school learners is not satisfactory. The study also noted that high school language teachers

lack the basic skills that are required for the teaching of pragmatics. The study recommends that specific pedagogical measures should be put in place to address these challenges. This includes, *inter alia*, the enhancement of teachers' language teaching skills through the offering of regular in-service language teaching workshops on pragmatics competency development

PROFILE

The study projected 'reconciling' of SeSotho (equating with) and English as media of instruction in Gwanda, Matabeleland South, Zimbabwe where English is officially used as the medium of instruction. It has placed beyond doubt that SeSotho has to be part and parcel of package of languages selected for use in the classroom. Exclusion of SeSotho from learning processes has negative effects on learners. The main finding has been the necessity of establishing a system of instruction which equates SeSotho with English. The study established that using

L1 as a medium of instruction did not interfere with learning of L2. In fact, reliance on English (L2) as a medium of instruction is established in the research as acting as a barrier in accessing education to the Sotho community of Gwanda South. The study recommends policy development which recognizes co-existence between L1 and L2. It has established that the use of mother tongue could lead to educational success in career development for multilingual learners. Language development and promotion of all varieties used only needs trained teachers and requisite resources.

The thesis interrogates current ESL teaching practices with a view to contribute new insights and knowledge on ESL teaching. Through a comprehensive literature review and adoption of the mixed method research design, the thesis unravels the weaknesses of current practices; secondary school graduates who lack sociolinguistic competence. This is attributed to the negation of the inclusion of sociolinguistic factors in ESL teaching and the apparent promotion of test-centric methods at the



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expense of communicative competence skills. The study critiques current ESL teaching trends, teacher attitudes, beliefs and values against emerging SFL theoretical perspectives. Based on these, it suggests a bold, thought-provoking paradigm shift towards the elaborate inclusion of sociolinguistic factors in ESL teaching. The thesis thus makes major contributions to the body of knowledge and challenges the focus of future research to inform the status, corpus and acquisition planning so that ESL teaching is contextualised to different learning settings to achieve communicative competence

PROFILE

His thesis critically analyses the diction of music as it attempts (or fails to) reflect and represent the Zimbabwean historical narratives for the period that spans from the early 1990s to 2010. The study tries to semiologically fracture the musical lexicon and the ideological stance to show the extent to which music communicates by way of reflecting and representing the Zimbabwean historical narratives and thus reflecting how popular music has become the most prominent signifier. The study utilises a qualitative research approach, specifically an interpretive prism as some selected songs were analysed and in-depth semi-structured interviews were conducted with purposively selected informants as well as two

of the selected musicians. Research findings indicate that interpretive semiotics aid to unpack the philosophy of meaning making through song, and that music has the reflective effect of a mirror as well as a photographic effect of a camera to enunciate ideological innuendo in the leader-led dichotomy. As a new academic trajectory, this study recommends a thrust and a slant in the analysis of the philosophy of meaning making through popular music that is rooted in the signs (language/diction).

PROFILE

His thesis looked at Social Media as Human Rights Watchdog: A critical Analysis of Facebook and WhatsApp use by Citizens and Civil Society Groups in the Run-up to the 2018 Elections in Zimbabwe. Qualitative content analysis was applied to study texts shared on WhatsApp and Facebook about human rights violations across the country. Three WhatsApp groups and seven Facebook pages were selected for the study from which posts and responses from participants were extracted for analysis. The findings of the study revealed that social media can effectively strengthen democratic practices by exposing government's unconstitutional practices, while



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also offering ordinary citizens a platform for engagement with civil society groups as they discuss issues that affect them. The study recommended that the government of Zimbabwe should go back to constitutionalism and abide by international human rights treaties to which they are signatory. The study also recommended that Zimbabwe Human Rights Commission and other independent commissions be empowered so that human rights are fully enjoyed in Zimbabwe, not just during election campaign periods but all the time.

OGUNNUBI Adeyemi Abolanle ✓ **PROFILE**

Adeyemi's study examined barriers that exist among diverse individuals from opposing ethnic, cultural, and religious backgrounds who connect/interact within virtual communities. The study noted that majority of the participants agreed that certain communication barriers like differences in cultural backgrounds and opinions, lack of politeness, prejudging and filtering, name calling and insults do exist when people communicate in virtual communities. The study concluded that people need to be civil in responding to discourse in virtual communities while also avoiding certain

inflammatory, religious or ethnic-laden utterances that could aggravate issues of national interests. The study proposes that social media platforms as virtual communities should be regulated with full implementation of the law so that vulgar languages, hate speeches, incitements, bullying and other offensive comments would hopefully be curbed to the barest minimum if this intervention could be implemented.

CHINDOGA Melody ✓ **PROFILE**

Melody Chindoga's study explored populism in the form of the nativist strategies used by dominant political parties in Africa when faced with escalating opposition, and responses to nativism in the rural areas that it targets. Located in two sites in South Africa and Zimbabwe, the research was of a qualitative nature that comprised, firstly, an analysis of nativist strategies and discourse used by both ZANU-PF and the Zuma-led faction of the ANC, followed by in-depth interviews with a sample of twenty inhabitants in each of the Engcobo and

Chegutu rural areas respectively. Guided by the principles of an interpretivist approach and a postcolonial theoretical perspective, the findings revealing that nativist discourse resonated with the older generation of rural inhabitants in both South Africa and Zimbabwe, due to their past experiences of racism and domination. However, there was a distinct generational dissonance, as the youth reacted with cynicism, identifying nativism as fundamentally a political strategy. Given that interpretivist studies do not claim universality in terms of the findings, the recommendations were for more extensive use of a post-colonial approach in political studies to foster the emergence of specific and unique findings such as these that cannot emerge from within western paradigms

NDLOVU Sitembiso Irene PROFILE

Sitembiso Ndlovu's study investigated selected South Africa-based Diaspora movements and their pursuit of democratic consolidation in Zimbabwe. South Africa was selected as literature showed that Zimbabwean Diaspora movements have been on the rise due to the mass exodus of its citizens to South Africa following economic collapse and civil strife. The study revealed

that the selected diaspora movements have employed various strategies such as submitting petitions, advocacy, lobbying, dialogues and utilisation of social media platforms in their quest of democratic consolidation in Zimbabwe. In spite of these, the study found out that challenges encountered such as donor fatigue, infiltration by Zimbabwean state agents and undocumented Zimbabwean immigrants, made the task of democratic consolidation in Zimbabwe daunting. The study recommends amongst others, the need for greater synergy among diaspora movements both at the national, continental and international spheres.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY IN SOCIAL SCIENCE IN PSYCHOLOGY

MAKUPULA Mahlodi Monica Rebecca PROFILE

Mahlodi explored how Xhosa mothers experience the initiation period of their sons. Her interest in the study was inspired by the initiation of her first son and her being the mother of three boys. Afrocentric theory and Interpretative Phenomenological Analysis (IPA) dictated the study interpretation and design. Data was generated through semi-structured interviews



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with eight purposively sampled participants. All the participants were the biological mothers of the initiated sons. The major challenge that participants reported experiencing during this period, was the lack of feedback on the health of their sons. This led them to experience psychosomatic symptoms, especially lack of sleep. All the participants depended on their spirituality to cope during this period. The study calls for the mother's voices to be listened to in a cultural practice that is still largely patriarchal. The study further recommends that women be included in decision making policies, especially when it comes to cultural practices.

AGERE Leonard Munyaradzi
PROFILE

This thesis is grounded in both the interpretive and positivist research paradigms, using mixed methods to examine the psychosocial functioning and experiences of child headed households. The findings of the study reveal the nature and extent of the psychosocial quagmires experienced by children in child headed households and how their deftness to cope in debilitating circumstances impede a negation

on the quality of "normalised" childhood. He postulates a psychosocial model to child-headed households care that provides parameters for good practice to social care practitioners, to embed in developmental practice underpinned by robust and SMART planning.

Mr. Agere has two papers presented at two international conferences and has published five articles in different international journals with two currently under peer review.

PROFILE

Nontsikelelo Majola's study focuses on the perceptions of the local and foreign citizens on xenophobic attacks. Qualitative research method and explorative research design were used to get a comprehensive and deep sense of the required information.

The findings of the study revealed that participants define xenophobia as hatred; anger; fear and discrimination. For the participants, lack of delivery from politicians; business competition; poverty; unemployment and culture are the main causes of these conflicts. The findings revealed that xenophobia can be related to crime and misunderstandings between the locals and foreigners. Finally, strategies that



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can fight xenophobia are services by politicians; police officers; business fraternity; as well as families. Social service practitioners were also seen as the important social support that can combat xenophobia.

MAKOSA Nigel PROFILE ✓

Nigel's doctoral study aimed at undertaking a comparative investigation of the gendered nature of intra-household decision making in the use of social grants and to ascertain its impact on selected households in Zimbabwe and South Africa as a comparative study. It emerged from the study that the decision-making roles for men and women in both Zimbabwe and South Africa were determined by income and economic activities, food security and basic needs; marital status, family and social structures. Overall, it was revealed in the study that it is the responsibility of the head of household to provide leadership and make crucial decisions such as using social grants money. It also emerged that in most households in these two countries, decision making on the use of social grant money was arrived at after consultations particularly between spouses. More so, a conceptual framework was also suggested to explain intra household decision dynamics.

This thesis employed a case study to focus on the implementation of a Learner Teacher Support Material (LTSM) policy in two education districts in the Eastern Cape province of South Africa. For the study, the researcher adopted the interpretivist paradigm and followed a qualitative research approach. From the data it emerged that there were gaps in the implementation of the LTSM policy, which did not explicitly specify related strategies for use in different contexts. This policy was used only a tactic and not a strategy to address LTSM challenges. Furthermore, the data showed that the implementation of the policy was characterised by mismanagement, a lack of clarity and insufficient communication regarding roles and responsibilities, weak coordination, the poor distribution and allocation of resources, and the absence of effective implementation strategies. The researcher subsequently proposed a framework delineating how the aforementioned challenges may be addressed in diverse contexts within the department.

Mkosi's research investigated the integration of indigenous knowledge (IK) and indigenous knowledge systems (IKS) in the Intermediate Phase school curriculum. The main findings revealed that a significant number of teachers did not integrate IK (those who claimed to do so, were unsure about the exact way in which they did this). The majority of teachers, HoDs and subject advisors were either poorly trained or had not received any training in this respect; and support for, and the monitoring of, IK integration in classrooms were poor to non-existent. The researcher thus proposed a model, the *Integrative Indigenous Knowledge Integration Support and Monitoring Model (IIKISMM)*, which could serve as a framework for coordinating the support and monitoring of IK integration in the South African Intermediate Phase school curriculum.

This research investigated the utilisation of teaching and learning centres (TLCs) at three state universities in Zimbabwe. To this end, the social constructivist paradigm was employed, guided by the theoretical lenses of Social Practice Theory and the Concerns-based Adoption Model. The findings showed that the TLCs were not being optimally utilised, and were therefore not facilitating the improvement of teaching and learning in any meaningful way. It also emerged that the functioning of these units was not fully understood, given that different stakeholders (both groups and individuals) at various levels expressed divergent interpretations of the constitution and role of the centres. The lack of a shared understanding, an embargo on staff recruitment at state universities, and the assumed superiority of research over teaching (for tenure and promotion) explained the poor positioning and inadequate staffing of the TLCs, as well as their consequent poor utilisation. An alternative framework was proposed for how best to position such centres and align them with other university units.

Nonso Nnolim's research focused on the valorisation of recalcitrant keratinous waste biomass emanating from the poultry processing industry into high-value amino acids and functional peptides. Valorisation of the keratinous waste biomass was achieved with autochthonous microbial species isolated from some dump sites in Raymond Mhlaba Local Municipality. The degree of feather bio-recycling into peptides and basic protein units with the simultaneous production of bacterial extracellular keratinase were high. The optimisation of the process variables that enhanced product yields was achieved in the study. The valorisation strategy resulted in the development of an enzyme cocktail with unique properties and the value addition of waste biomass into high-nutrient agro-feed. The enzymes demonstrated appreciable stability in an array of chemical solvent and commercially available laundry detergents; thus, affirming their potentials in many sectors of the bio-economy. Some of the research findings have been presented in conferences, and seven manuscripts from the research are under consideration in,

high impact factored, peer-reviewed, DHET accredited journals.

Odeyemi Akinwumi Sunday's thesis investigated six single imputation techniques (2NN-proposed, LD, MAB, MEI, MA and OD) for estimating missing values in risk factor of high blood pressure and Framingham risk scores for cardiovascular diseases (CVD). MCAR and MAR missingness mechanisms were considered in four different percentages (5, 10, 20, and 30%) of missing values. Five performance indicators, MAE, RMSE, SE, R² and Adjusted-R², which are Goodness-of-Fit (GOF) measures, were used to assess the performances of these methods. The study developed a Risk model based on Framingham Risk Scores (FRS) for predicting chance of developing CVD in patients. Also, predicted logit of hypertension model, with Receiver Operating Characteristics(ROC), were developed, which correctly discriminates (index

of discrimination c) between those patients who experienced the disease and those who did not. 2-NN proposed in the study was found to be better than any of other methods at 5% and 10% levels of missing values. Two manuscripts have been submitted for publication from the work. Odeyemi Akinwumi Sunday is a lecturer at UFH with 19 publications.

SEMENYA Sebua Silas **PROFILE**

Sebua Silas Semenya identified medicinal plants used by Bapedi traditional healers in the Limpopo Province to treat and manage respiratory infections (RIs). He also determined the types of RIs, diagnosis techniques, harvesting practices, availability and conservation status of documented medicinal plants. Data was collected via semi-structured questionnaires, supplemented by field observations, laboratory phytochemical screenings and biological activities evaluations. A total of 224 plant species were used to treat and manage six types of RIs, tuberculosis (84.1%), sore throat (65.0%), asthma (58.3%), sinusitis (55.0%), pneumonia (53.3%) and rhinitis (43.7%). Phytochemical analyses of

four most used plants: *Clerodendrum ternatum*, *Cryptocarya transvaalensis*, *Encostema axillare* and *Lasiosiphon caffer* revealed the presence of various secondary metabolites such as alkaloids, anthraquinones, cardiac glycosides, flavonoids, phlobatannins, saponins, steroids, tannins and terpenes. The extracts of these species offered protection against growth of microbes such as *Mycobacterium smegmatis*, *Klebsiella pneumoniae*, *Staphylococcus aureus* and *Pseudomonas aeruginosa* and free radicals. Future studies should identify the bioactive components, molecular modes or mechanisms of action, pharmacokinetics and physiological pathways of the extracts and compounds isolated from medicinal plants used against RIs.

DODO Charlie Marembo **PROFILE**

Charlie Dodo's research was on the possible use of waste material in the form of lignocellulosic bagasse and sugarcane trash in the production of biofuels. The objective of the research was to find methods of adding value to the waste

material. A variety of chemical pre-treatment and biological pre-treatment methods were studied to find optimal conditions for producing hydrolysates in sufficient quantities, with few inhibitors of downstream processes. Combining chemical pre-treatment with enzymes and yeast proved the most effective method for bioethanol production. This research showed that it is possible to use bagasse and sugarcane trash material to supplement biofuel requirements with good yields at a reasonable rate. He has published a research article from the work in a DHET accredited journal and two more research articles are currently under review.

OLISAH Chijioke PROFILE

Chijioke Olisah's PhD thesis investigated the occurrence of selected organohalogenated compounds (OHCs) in environmental matrices from selected estuaries in Eastern Cape Province, South Africa. The study revealed that HCHs isomers, tri-BDEs, tetra-BDEs, tri-CBs and tetra-CBs were the prevalent homologues in the study area. Hazard risk analysis performed on *P. commernossii* and *M. cephalus* showed that based on these OHC congeners, the consumption of these two fish species does not pose a cancer risk. It is recommended that

continuous monitoring of other OHCs should be carried out in these estuaries. One article has been published and four are in advance stages of review in DHET accredited journals. This study has been presented in several conferences and he was awarded the joint best oral presenter representing the Department of Chemistry, UFH at a SACI regional conference. Part of this study was also accepted for oral presentation at ACS Spring conference in Orlando Florida in 2019.

Mr. Tinarwo proposed a computational ontology as a solution to address the problem of unstructured indigenous knowledge, the Xhosa Beadwork in particular. He developed a Web Ontology which organises and preserves indigenous knowledge for Xhosa Beadwork as a reusable computational body of knowledge in the Semantic Web. The Ontology was developed using the NeOn methodology and the iterative-incremental development life cycle, within the

ambit of Action Research. The study produced an Ontology that is shareable and reusable semantic solution that can support the standardisation and preservation of indigenous knowledge in the domain of Xhosa Beadwork. The outcome of the study has been disseminated through a journal article.

PROFILE

Mxolisi Arnold Stemele's study examined the ecological genetics of stem borers, an important group of insects that feed on various monocotyledonous plants. The research interrogated factors influencing ecological preference, species composition, and the distribution of host plants and stem borers between different ecological zones in South Africa. The study also investigated the effectiveness of the use of mitochondrial DNA gene, cytochrome c oxidase subunit I (COX1), as a DNA barcode to identify economically important stem borer pests of cereal crops, and unravel the genetic diversity and potential impact of geographic isolation

between stem borer populations within South Africa. There was a high variety of known and unknown stem borer species found in surveys, including two stem borer species reported for the first time in natural vegetation in South Africa. The results also indicated that preference for host plants; host plant distribution and altitudinal gradients strongly influence the distribution of stem borers. Molecular studies revealed the COX1 gene as an efficient DNA marker for DNA barcoding, phylogenetic and gene flow studies between the populations of *Busseola fusca* (Fuller) in three major maize producing provinces South Africa. Three manuscripts from the thesis have been submitted for consideration in DHET approved peer-reviewed journals.

PROFILE

Peter's research focused on characterization of thermal aquifers in the Soutpansberg Basin in Limpopo, South Africa. The use of geological and geophysical techniques identified heat source depths and temperatures as well as their distribution in the Soutpansberg Basin. The aquifer geology and depth of circulation of thermal water was inferred from water chemistry results.

The study identified an area in the central part of the Soutpansberg Basin that has shallower heat source depths and relatively high temperatures. Furthermore, geophysical results unraveled the basin architecture and the existence of an anticlinal geological structure in the central part of the basin. The study identified an area in the Soutpansberg Basin with geothermal potential and a target for future energy exploration.

To date, he has published six peer-reviewed journal articles and one book chapter from his PhD thesis. The findings have also been presented at eight local and nine international conferences.

Peter is grateful to the Council for Geoscience, National Research Foundation and Water Research Commission for funding the research.

Adeniyi Oladele Vincent is a medical specialist with an interest in HIV care. His PhD study

examined the genetic diversity, resistance profile of HIV and risk assessment of Mother-To-Child Transmission in pregnant women on antiretroviral therapy (ART) in the Eastern Cape, South Africa. The study showed that peripartum viral suppression in pregnant women on ART was about 82% and the in-utero transmission of HIV was about 1.3% in the cohort. Among pregnant women delivering their index babies at high viral load, the prevalence of drug resistance mutations was 72.5% with K103N, M184V and K65R being the predominant mutations in the viral isolates. HIV-1 Subtype C accounted for 97.5% of the circulating virus in the Eastern Cape. Also, recombinant CRF02_AG and mosaic form of a unique recombinant form; A1/C/D/K/B, were identified. The study recommends a nationwide surveillance system for tracking high-risk pregnant women on ART for interventions before delivery. Three manuscripts are currently under consideration for publication in DHET accredited journals.

Onele Gcilitshana's study was designed to assess the incidence of pathogenic *Vibrio* species in surface waters of a river and its two effluents feeder wastewater treatment plants in Raymond Mhlaba Local Municipality. The study confirmed that the river contained high doses of pathogenic *Vibrio* species (*V. cholerae*, *V. mimicus* and *V. parahaemolyticus*) with wastewater effluents as potential sources of these pathogens. The study further detected high incidence of antibiotic resistant *Vibrio* species, thus presenting a health threat to the communities using the river water downstream. The findings of this study have been presented at national and international conferences and three manuscripts are at different stages of preparation for publication.

IGERE Bright Esegbuyota PROFILE

Bright Igere's thesis focused on vibriology; pathogenic determinants and the antimicrobial resistance factors in the *Vibrio cholerae* isolated

from the hospital effluents and receiving water bodies in the Eastern Cape was evaluated. The study revealed the emerging genotypes of the pathogens with peculiar virulence factors and multiple antibiotic resistance to drugs of choice in the combat of the disease posed by the pathogen. A noteworthy finding from the study was the observation of dual and atypical phenotype amongst some of the isolates. Isolates were also shown to harbour the *ctxB* gene as well as the satellite phage (*RS1*), CTX-phi (CTX ϕ) phage and *RS2* which belong to both classical and El tor *V. cholerae*. The study espoused the need for the pretreatment of hospital wastewater effluents before discharge into the municipality wastewater treatment plants. To add, regular surveillance of the various niche constituting a puddle for the evolution of pathogenicity has been advanced in the study. This approach would aid to forestall the scourge of antimicrobial resistance, which is a global threat. Six manuscripts prepared from the thesis are at different levels of review consideration in, high impact factored, DHET recommended, peer-reviewed journals.

Msolo Luyanda's study examined the Molecular and antibiogram characteristics of aetiological agents of gastroenteritis in some selected rural hinterlands of the Amathole District Municipality, Eastern Cape Province, South Africa. The findings of this study revealed multiple aetiological agents that contribute in clinical manifestation of gastroenteritis among children and elderly individuals. The study further elucidated the presence of antimicrobial resistant determinants among the bacterial agents which suggests an increased health risk associated with gastroenteritis and a major hindrance in medicine. The living and environmental conditions of most rural areas in the province are spartan, and often support the ecological niches of these microbes, therefore; the study recommends urgent multidisciplinary interventions from higher authorities and policy architects so as to provide basic services, improved sanitation and organized awareness campaigns as to educate the public about the risks of these endemic infections and implement safety strategies in controlling such incidences. Three manuscripts have been generated from this study for publication in DHET accredited journals.

SOGBANMU Olufunso Oladipupo PROFILE

Olufunso Oladipupo Sogbanmu examined the genetic characteristics of HIV, pattern of primary drug resistance to antiretroviral therapy in use, the determinants of late presentation to care; and the prevalence of diabetes mellitus amongst newly diagnosed HIV positive patients. The study identified low levels of primary drug resistance mutations against the protease inhibitors in about 3% amongst the study population who were infected with the HIV-1 sub-type C virus. Despite the adoption of the test and treat policy, more than 60% of patients living with HIV are still presenting late for care with AIDS defining conditions with the male gender and low levels of education contributing significantly to this. The study also observed a low prevalence of diabetes mellitus amongst newly infected HIV patients presenting for care and recommended the need for the strengthening of surveillance of primary drug resistance to antiretroviral therapy in use; ensure improvement of policy to encourage men prompt access to health care services and improve education; and develop appropriate screening tools for diagnosing diabetes mellitus in HIV patients. Some of the findings have been published in DHET accredited journal whilst two other manuscripts are under various stages of review.

Gilbert Osayemwenre studied the electrical, photo-thermal and mechanical degradation analysis of degraded single junction amorphous silicon solar modules. His study was motivated by his quest to understand the fundamental principles behind the degradation and the low stability that is usually experienced by amorphous silicon solar (a-Si:H) modules. The electrical performance parameters of a-Si:H modules were investigated under both outdoor and indoor conditions. The study also involved the characterisation of defects and mechanical degradation analysis of the a-Si:H modules. Indoor characterisation was used to investigate the effect of degradation on the intrinsic properties of the a-Si:H modules using Kelvin Probe Microscope at nano-scale level to measure the surface contact potential. The study established that the degradation of the mechanical properties of a-Si:H modules is a major contributor to the electrical degradation of the modules as oppose to the other way around. 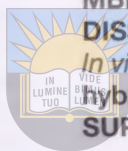

Thandoluhle Kwanhi's study examined obstacles to market access for smallholders on irrigation schemes in the Eastern Cape Province of South Africa. The motivation for the study is the unrelenting pauperization of smallholders despite favourable policy environment as part of the efforts to restructure and transform the agricultural economy. Data were collected from farmers on two irrigation schemes in Qamata and Tyefu in the Province. The study confirmed that smallholder farmers continue to face severe credit constraints which combine with the absence of managerial and organizational skills to pose serious obstacles to market access. Support targeting scheme farmers should incorporate measures to address these obstacles.

MAFUSE Never PROFILE

Never Mafuse's thesis evaluated the role of institutions on maize production and marketing among the A1 resettled farmers with main aim of identifying institutional obstacles affecting maize production and marketing. A simple random procedure was used to select four hundred A1 maize farmers. The study showed that, maize production and marketing is affected by various institutional factors. Furthermore, the study noted that, formal markets are very popular in the resettlement areas. The study therefore recommended the government to improve institutional environment and arrangement that has direct link with institutional innovations necessary for sustainable maize production and marketing.

Currently, Never has co-authored and published 14 articles in peer reviewed journals and a book chapter. Never is also involved in teaching and research and has presented 3 papers at different conferences.

Saul Ngarava's study evaluated the Kaonafatso ya Dikgomo (KyD) Scheme in KwaZulu-Natal, Limpopo and Eastern Cape Provinces, focussing on the benefits, participation and risk. The study

utilised a cross-sectional survey through multiple sampling of 164 KyD Scheme-participants and 81 non-participants from the three provinces of South Africa. The study identified the Scheme exhibiting low qualitative benefits. Various socio-economic and institutional factors were significant on the participation decisions. The Scheme had significant impact on production risk. The study recommends targeting livestock farmers with prescribed distance from market; promoting dipping services-based training; enhancing awareness of the Scheme at various stock feed outlets; and extension cooperation. Furthermore, the scheme should also promote qualitative benefits and incorporate production risk in livestock programme policy formulation, implementation and evaluation.

A paper produced from the thesis won first prize at the 56th Agricultural Economics Association of South Africa (AEASA) conference in 2018. Saul has 13 journal publications and 1 book chapter.

Seyi Olalekan Olawuyi's PhD thesis examined the effect of social capital and information acquisition on the adoption and benefits of conservation

agriculture among Cassava and Maize smallholder farmers in South-west Nigeria using cross-sectional data, and a number of econometric techniques for analyses. The study showed that full-adopters, partial adopters, and non-adopters of full CA were distinguishable in terms of farmers' consumption expenditure per-capita, crop yield, and farm income. The study found positive influence of farmers' personal attributes, plot-level characteristics, institutional engagements, social capital components, and other exogenous factors, on the count of CA practices adopted by farmers. These factors also contributed significantly to the quantum of perceived benefits enjoyed from CA adoption. These important dynamics were also identified to predict farmers' production output with the estimated selection bias control parameter being significantly different from zero. The results also indicated that farmers' decisions to acquire CA information and adopt CA practices were jointly made. The study recommend that peer group networks should be strengthened among the farmers.

Two articles have been published, one accepted for publication, while 3 others are currently under peer review.

RUKASHA Conscience Tanyaradzwa PROFILE

Rukasha Conscience's study examined the impact of adoption of drought tolerant maize varieties on yield in the face of climate change. The data was collected from three districts in Malawi; Karonga, Chikwawa and Salima through a combination of purposive and random sampling. The objective of the study was to analyse the impact of adoption of drought tolerant varieties on yield factoring in intra seasonal weather variability as opposed to season averages. The study noted that maize yield was affected more by the intra seasonal distribution of rainfall rather than the total seasonal distribution. Furthermore, the study showed that the adoption of drought tolerant maize varieties increased the yield for the farmers in the face of climate change. The study, recommends that there be an upscaling of awareness about DT maize varieties among the smallholder farmers to increase adoption. The study also recommends increasing availability of input subsidies. Access to input subsidies reduces financial strain and can be the difference between adoption and non-adoption.

TATSVAREI Simbarashe PROFILE

Simbarashe Tatsvarei' PhD thesis focused on land rental market in Zimbabwe and implications on farmer decisions, efficiency and equity. The study showed that perceptions of farmers on rental policy was inferred as fair with significant differences existing between land rental market participants and non-participants. Household characteristics, land endowments and transaction costs were significant in influencing the decision to rent-in land while the former two were strong in influencing renting-out decisions. Efficiency was higher for A2 farmers than for A1 farmers and participation in land rental markets resulted in higher efficiency and reduced inequality in land holding. The study recommended that government consider formal acceptance of land rental markets. In addition, production should be based on compatibility with the natural regions and defined minimum size of land.

To date, Simbarashe has co-authored and published 12 articles in peer reviewed journals and contributed to a book chapter. Simbarashe is involved in teaching and development research and has presented 5 papers at different national and international conferences.

OYEAGU Chika Ethelbert PROFILE

Oyeagu Chika's PhD study focused on the complementary effect of dietary mannan oligosaccharides and enzyme complex on growth traits, nutrient digestibility, gut examination, haemato-biochemical profile and carcass quality of broiler chickens. His research explored the complementary use of mannan oligosaccharides and enzyme complex to reduce the use of antibiotics growth promoters that causes contamination of meat products (with antibiotics residues) which might be toxic to sensitive individuals or consumers. The study showed that the application of these additives (mannan oligosaccharides and enzyme complex) significantly eliminate the contamination of meat products, enhanced overall meat safety, improved growth performance, nutrient digestibility and utilization. Again, the additives also accelerated the development of immune organs as it promotes the clinical and nutritional health status of broiler chickens. Chika has published three research articles from his thesis while three more of his manuscripts are currently under review with different peer reviewed Journals.

SOJI Zimkitha PROFILE

Zimkhitha Soji's study determined the muscle nanostructure, fat colour related fatty acids and Check-All-That-Apply visual profiling of South African A2 beef *longissimus*. The notion of her study was based on the hypothesis that the classification system used in South African abattoirs to characterise carcasses, only includes a small number of general indirect measurements of meat quality. Consequently, the interests of the current consumers in terms of eating quality are not sufficiently met. Thus her study proposed a set of quality indicators in addition to those currently used in the SA system, to characterise beef carcasses in a more precise way that considers more of the interests of the current consumer. The study noted that meat from beef animals within the same feeding regime has different fatty acid composition owing to different breed synthetic pathways and feed ingredients while non-uniformity of the beef muscle nanostructure is the major cause of meat tenderness complexity. Her study also noted that organoleptic and health related quality of meat assumes more importance in consumer preferences. Thus, the SA classification system should include more credence aspects that support credence quality of meat.

Thuthuzelwa Stempa's study determined the effects of pre-slaughter stress, sex and breed on blood stress indicators, glycolytic potential and meat quality of lambs. The study was conducted at a commercial abattoir in the Buffalo City local municipality of the Eastern Cape Province, South Africa. Data was collected from 100 Dorper and Merino lambs. The results indicate that sex and breed have an important influence on the stress responsiveness of lambs during the pre-slaughter period. Plasma cortisol, lactate, glucose, lactate dehydrogenase, creatine kinase and heat shock protein 70 levels at exsanguination cannot be used as useful indicators of the dark cutting condition in lamb. Reduced glycogen reserves and low glycolytic potential at slaughter resulted in high ultimate pH in lambs. The study recommends that exposure to stress pre-slaughter period should be avoided to prevent excessive loss of muscle glycogen since it will have a negative impact on the welfare and meat quality of lambs. Findings generated by this study are of importance for animal welfare organisations, animal scientists and the meat industry worldwide.

In 1976 he established Saldru, the Southern Africa Labour & Development Research Unit within the School of Economics which co-ordinated research from around the country on such vital topics as Farm Labour; the Economics of Health Care; and Poverty. As Director of the Second Carnegie Inquiry, Francis Wilson led the national process, which led to the major research conference of 1984, which focused on Poverty & Development. Subsequently he and Mamphela Ramphela together wrote the book, Uprooting Poverty, published in 1989.

PROFILE

Prof Francis Wilson grew up in the Eastern Cape. He was at school in Alice and in Makhanda [then Grahamstown] and graduated from the University of Cape Town with a degree in Physics. Subsequently he studied Economics at the University of Cambridge where he obtained his PhD. His thesis focused on wages in the gold mining industry and its migrant labour system. As a student, he travelled up Africa with David Russell. He began teaching in 1967 at UCT, which remained his teaching base until he retired. Sabbatical leaves enabled him to work in a number of universities around the world including Yale, Princeton, Harvard, Virginia, Cambridge, Oxford, Sussex and

With the unbanning of the ANC, PAC and the SACP in 1990 and the release of political prisoners' preparation for a new democratic government became urgent and Saldru was requested to help with relevant and up to date statistical information. From 1992-1994 South Africa's first integrated household survey was organised to gather data from a national sample of all those living in the country, including the former Bantustans. At the same time a training program was initiated in collaboration with the University of Michigan, to teach scholars from South African universities [including Fort Hare] and from government departments how to analyse the rich data.

Some years later, when the hopes of an early victory over the dragons of poverty, ignorance & disease were not being realised Wilson was asked to bring together a national research gathering focused on poverty and inequality. Not only academics were invited but also government decision makers as

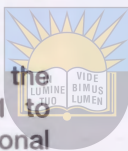

well as NGO's working in ways that brought them closer to the coalface of poverty than any other type of organization. A book was written and disseminated on the internet. Attention now had to be focused not so much on analysis as on Action Dialogues around the country. He was a member of the team that led this process as the Mandela Initiative until 2018.

From 1990 to 1999 Francis Wilson was chairperson of the new, post-apartheid, Council of the University of Fort Hare

In 1996, he was appointed chairperson of the National Advisory Water Council. From 2001 to 2006, he was chairperson of CROP, the international Comparative Research Programme on Poverty based in Norway.

For many years, 1995-1993 he was editor of the South African Outlook, published from Lovedale. He is married to Lindy Wilson, a filmmaker: They have three children and two grandchildren

He is a renowned scholar whose extensive publications have contributed immensely to the community of practice.

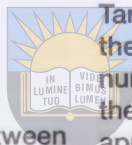

His thesis examined the interconnection between macro-prudential banking regulation, interest rate spread and monetary policy in South Africa by utilising the VEC mechanism with the NKDSGE model as the framework of analysis. The systems equation provided evidence that a short run causality running from macro-prudential regulation to monetary policy is prevalent in South Africa. Evidence from this study further suggest that interest rate spread has a dampening effect on monetary policy, but in the long-run this effect seems reversible in South Africa. As a result, this study recommends that caution should be taken on the appropriate selection of measures of macro-prudential regulation and its tool-kit as it can be used to disguise the symptoms of a lax monetary policy.

Tarisai Chikungwa - Everson's thesis examined the meaning and experience ascribed by male nurses within contemporary career management theorising. An interpretivist, qualitative research approach using the exploratory research design was utilised. Based on the research findings, a theoretical framework of dirty work experiences and meaning of work by male nurses was proposed. The framework represents a departure from traditional career theories espoused in the work of Holland and Super as it illustrates the role of intersectionality and marginality in shaping career development. Further, the proposed framework founded from the findings of the research, (though supporting modern career models such as the Systems Theory Framework and the Career Construction Theory) uniquely shows:

- a) drivers towards dirty work experiences (positive and negative);
 - b) the processual work that accompanies dirty work involvement; and
 - c) the meaning ascribed to dirty work.
- The study through the developed model and the

three findings becomes the first within a South African Industrial Psychology context to make such a contribution.

Clifford's PhD project investigated the human resource management competencies that are key for employability and career success in South Africa. This comes about due to identified and glaring gaps within the literature and the human resources profession. The study made use of an interpretivist philosophy and relied on interviews with senior and leading practitioners in the human resources profession affiliated with the South African Board for People Practices. The study through its findings heighten focus on enhancing sector-specific employability attributes that can be a stepping stone in not only professionalising the human resources profession but even bring some credibility to the sector. Based on the findings, a model for employability within the human resources profession is proposed.

PROFILE

Tatenda Shaleen Mhlanga's study examined personality and psychological conditions in relation to job engagement among municipal workers in the Eastern Cape Province of South Africa. This was a pioneering effort as no similar study had previously been conducted in the Eastern Cape. The researcher used highly sophisticated statistical methods to produce an impressive new model of the relationships among the main variables. The model reveals, inter alia, that enhancement of job engagement is possible when organizations focus on individual personality and psychological conditions thereby focusing both on individual and organizational factors. The study recommends that managers should switch from an intervention-based focus to a selection-based focus as municipalities can maximize their resources by being able to better predict job success early in the selection process and promoting psychological conditions as opposed to trying to maximize performance on a continual basis through interventions. The study yielded three articles that were submitted to reputable journals for publication.

NWOKOLO Echezona Emmanuel **PROFILE**

Echezona Emmanuel Nwokolo's study examined the moderating influence of psychological empowerment in the relationship between job insecurity and organizational citizenship behaviour (OCB) among employees in the Eastern Cape Department of Health. This was a pioneering effort as no similar study had previously been conducted in the Eastern Cape or in South Africa. Data was collected through convenience sampling, and the researcher used new-generation statistical methods to produce a new theoretical model on the relationships among the main variables. The model reveals that psychological empowerment can be used as an organizational tool to significantly influence the effect of job insecurity on organizational citizenship behaviour. The researcher recommends that managers should adopt the principles of social exchange and demonstrate concern for their employees' wellbeing and career development in order to secure long-term commitment and organizational citizenship behaviour from their employees.

TICHAGWA Tendai **PROFILE**

Tendai Tichagwa's study investigated quality of work life and job embeddedness as predictors of turnover intentions among academic staff. The findings revealed that quality of work life and job embeddedness had significant negative correlations with turnover intentions. Job embeddedness did not moderate the relationship between quality of work life and job embeddedness. Quality of work life and job embeddedness combined explained significantly more variance in intention to quit than each of the two variables separately. The study therefore, recommends the development of sectoral and institutional policies that enhance quality of work life and job embeddedness, thereby mitigating academic staff turnover in institutions of higher education. It further recommends that particular focus should be directed towards reducing turnover among newer academic staff as they are more likely to leave their institutions than their longer-serving counterparts.

Lufuno Reginald Kone's study examined the "Administration of the socio-economic aspects of mine closure: A Case study of Exxaro Tshikondeni Mine in Limpopo province South Africa". This study's attempt was to examine how best socio-economic aspects of mine closure can be administered. Data was collected from former Exxaro Tshikondeni Mine's employees, stakeholders, administrators and mine managers. In this study, it was found out that the future of the mining industry is dependent on the legacy which it leaves (in as far as Exxaro Tshikondeni Mine is concerned), and industry reputation is grossly affected when mines are closed or abandoned without proper rehabilitation having been done. Usually this will lead to long term detrimental environmental impacts.

MBAMBO William Bongile **PROFILE**

William Mbambo's study assessed the contribution of SMMEs to job creation in the

Eastern Cape, South Africa. The study was designed to assess whether SMMEs had the capacity to create employment opportunities in the Eastern Cape Province. Surveys were conducted with fifty owners of SMMEs in the Eastern Cape Province. The study noted that SMMEs in general, particularly in the Eastern Cape Province, do not necessarily generate substantial employment. The study also noted lack of financial support and business skills as major contributing factors to slow job creation. Therefore, the study recommends that the government should provide more financial support, while organizing entrepreneurship workshops, seminars and training workshops for SMME owners. The study also suggests that efforts must be made to influence the education system towards more practical and entrepreneurial development in order to improve business operating skills of young enthusiasts and visionaries.

This study was motivated by the desire to search for a solution of teacher development versus learner performance in basic education. Findings confirmed that the analysis of the exit grades

results revealed that teacher development programmes did indeed improve learner performance in the district; the teachers as custodians of teacher development programmes are excluded by the system in the development of their training programmes, which makes them not to provide a meaningful contribution in their own practice.

The findings of the study will not only provide the much needed techniques towards improving teacher development programmes on the research site, but also in South Africa and elsewhere in the world of teacher development projects and programmes.

The thesis evaluates the initiatives for improving financial sustainability in the South African local government. Using a meta-synthesis as a principal technique in content analysis, the study revealed a lack of suitable financing models, poor strategic financial planning and budgeting and lack of effective models for managing equity. The study also found that the trends influencing the concept of financial sustainability in the local government sphere arise from the emergence of a developmental state, changes

in demographical trends, financial optimisation regulations, and stronger financial controls and oversight exercised by regulatory institutions. The study proposes a model consisting of four main pillars which include strategic financial planning, income diversification, sound financial administration and management, and own income generation. The model also has three foundational constructs; financial risk management, financial good governance and financial ethical leadership as well as three foundational non-financial constructs; political stability, fiscal and economic stability and forecasting.

Finally, the model advocates a measurement of the overall maturity of the financial sustainability of municipalities using four perspectives of liquidity, resilience, service and fiscal responsibility.

The study was motivated by the component of the human settlement delivery in the country with the focus on the best customized model for Duncan Village and Reeston informal settlements. Hence the research questions focused on “What are the beneficiaries’ narratives about the projects (and the overarching policy/institutional framework), and what socio-cultural and/or economic factors, if any, mediate those narratives”.

The research findings confirmed the low level of satisfaction, dwelling attributes, neighborhood issues, environmental issues for consideration in the housing development as a form of dwelling. It further provides solution and the ideal model to the provision of housing development in South Africa, especially the Duncan Village as a prime site for development for Buffalo City Metropolitan Municipality.

PILUSA Khosi Khashane Lucas PROFILE

The study of Kgoshi Kgashane Lucas Pilusa analysed the capacity of Limpopo Water Services Authorities in providing access to clean drinking water and decent sanitation. The study raised concerning issues of the state of access to clean drinkable water and decent sanitation. It was found that all Water Services Authorities are heavily indebted largely due to financial mismanagement, unauthorised, irregular and fruitless expenditures as well as skills incapacities that triggered violent service delivery protests. These situations prevailed under the nose of well-established chapter nine oversight institutions that are against violation of human rights and social justice during the

former President Jacob Zuma Administration. One of the major drawbacks of the current institutional arrangements arose from the overlapping mandates of the government water sector institutions. The structural design of the intergovernmental system is problematic and should be restructured and synergised. There should be an attempt to introduce an effective integrated water and sanitation governance structures, monitoring and evaluation mechanisms, under robust public scrutiny in order to inform immediate and long-term interventions.

MAKHALA Nombuyiselo PROFILE

This thesis assessed how a Board of Directors ensures good corporate governance in the state-owned entities. It evaluated the role that should be played by the Board of Directors in the implementation of corporate governance in the state owned entities of the Eastern Cape Province. In-depth interviews were conducted with the selected Chairpersons of Boards, CEOs, Executive Management and the Executive Authorities. The study found that in most instances, the appointed Board Members lack experience and competencies; there is

no prescribed and standardized performance management system for the Board of Directors; there is also lack in enforcement of accountability by the Boards and insufficient budget to ensure the proper implementation of corporate governance in these entities.

This study recommends amongst other things, the development of the standardized performance management system and accountability framework for all the Boards. Appointment of skilled Members and provision of sufficient budget to ensure implementation of good corporate governance in these entities.

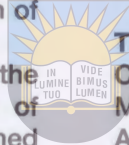

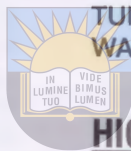
