1. DR KHOTSO MOKHELE

Dr Khotso Mokhele is among the notable alumni that have gone yonder and spread the gospel about the University of Fort Hare.

He was born in Bloemfontein on 12 September 1955 where he also obtained his early education. He later matriculated from Moroka High School, Thaba Nchu, in 1973.

Khotso Mokhele first enrolled at the University of Fort Hare in 1974 to read towards his BSc (Agriculture) degree. His student days were marked by activism in sports which included representing the university in Football and Softball. He was also an active member of the Agriculture Students Society which he served as Chairperson in 1996. Upon graduation in 1979, his academic achievements were recognised through winning the Massey-Ferguson Award for the best student in Agriculture. His studies at Fort Hare were punctuated by involuntary leave in 1977 during which year he served as a teacher in Mathematics and Physical Science at Goroyane Secondary School in Thaba Nchu.

As a recipient of a prestigious Fulbright Scholarship, he entered the University of California, Davis, where he later obtained MSc and PhD degrees in Microbiology. Subsequently, he was awarded a Post-doctoral Fellowship at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, Baltimore, USA, working in the laboratory of Dr Hamilton O. Smith, a Nobel Prize Winner. His second research fellowship was at the University of Pennsylvania.

In 1987, he returned to Fort Hare where he took up a teaching and research post in the Department of Biochemistry and Microbiology. His second tenure at Fort Hare was again marked by activism which included, inter alia, his service as the General Secretary of the Black Staff Association in 1989. He subsequently moved on to the University of Cape Town where he taught from 1990 to 1992.

Khotso Mokhele joined the Foundation for Research Development (FRD) in 1992 as Vice-President and became the President and Chief Executive Officer from 1996 until 1999 when the FRD was succeeded by the National Research Foundation. He was subsequently appointed as the Founder President of the NRF in the same year and currently still holds that position.

His 10 year tenure at the FRD/NRF saw him provide leadership in the drive for the transformation of the science and research enterprises in South Africa. He was responsible for identifying the need for capacity development at historically black institutions and technikons and provided both these types of institutions with special programmes dedicated to their research capacity development. Through his foresight and commitment, these programmes had a major impact on research development at HBU's and technikons.

Khotso Mokhele has also been characteristically engaged in his usual activism. He served as the Founder President of the Academy of Science of South Africa from 1996 - 1998. He also served on councils of three universities as well as on the Council for Higher Education. His membership of private sector boards includes Iscor Limited and Genbel SA Limited. He currently serves as the Chairperson of the Premier's Economic Advisory Council in the Free State Province.

His service to international organisations includes representing South Africa on the Executive Board of UNESCO, membership of the General Committee of the International Council for Science, and in 1999, chaired the Salzburg Seminar on Scientific Development and the Democratic Process held in Austria.

Khotso Mokhele is a proud recipient of the prestigious French Legion of Honour awarded by the President of France in 2000. In 2001, he received the Tribute Achievers Award for Science and Technology. He was recently awarded a Doctor Technologiae (Honoris Causa) by the Port Elizabeth Technikon.

2. Dr Ntombemhlophe Brigalia Bam

Ntombemhlophe Brigalia Bam has deep roots in her association with the Eastern Cape. Born in Tsolo, she did her initial schooling at Shawbury Methodist Institution near Qumbu, graduating in 1950. She completed a diploma in teaching Primary Higher Education at Lovedale Teachers' Training College in 1952. She obtained a diploma in social work from the Jan Hofmeyer School of Social work in 1957, and thereafter furthered her studies abroad in Communications at the University of Chicago and a Diploma in Management from Switzerland.

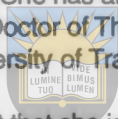
Dr Bam worked extensively in the education, health and welfare sectors in South Africa in the late 1950s and early 1960s. Dr Bam worked for the World Affiliated YWCA in KwaZulu-Natal as Youth Programme Co-ordinator, Regional Director and later Deputy National Secretary. The World Council of Churches in Switzerland recruited her as one of the Programme Directors, with specific focus on women's youth, and human rights issues. She travelled extensively in Africa, Asia, Europe and the Americas, organising world conferences and seminars pertinent to these issues. In addition Dr Bam has also served as the Africa Regional Secretary and Co-ordinator of Women's Worker Programme for the International Food and Allied Workers Association in Geneva.

Since her return to South Africa in 1988, Dr Bam gained national prominence through her work as General Secretary of the South African Council of Churches. She has furthermore served on numerous boards within South Africa and abroad. For example, as Deputy Chair Board member of the South African Broadcasting Corporation, on the Board of Murray & Roberts Engineering, as a Commissioner on the South African Human Rights Commission, as Chairperson of the Open Society Foundation, and as a member of the Governing Council of the Society for International Development, as board member of the Institute for Global Dialogue and recently the board of ABSA. She is also a founder and president of the Women's Development Foundation. Currently Dr Bam serves as Chairperson of the Electoral Commission (IEC).

Dr Bam has distinguished herself in public life as being of service to the people of South Africa, and of Africa, both here and abroad. This flows from her courageous commitment to values of democracy and human rights, especially the rights of women. Over the years she has received a number of awards in recognition for this commitment. This includes the Order of Simon of Cyrene, the highest award given to a lay person in the Anglican Church. She has also received honorary doctorates from the University of Durban-Westville (Doctor of Theology), Victoria University in Toronto (Doctor of Sacred Letters) and University of Transkei (Doctor of Laws).



It is on the basis of this illustrious past that she is nominated for honorary doctor of Arts Degree in Philosophy.

3. Mr Andile Abner Ngcaba

Andile Abner Ngcaba has worked extensively in the communications field. The military communications being the most celebrated. While in exile he rose through the ranks of Umkhonto we Sizwe as both communications specialist and commander. He currently holds a Master of Commerce qualification from the University of Witwatersrand specialising in Information Systems. A prolific writer, Mr Ngcaba has published more than 30 papers in scientific journals. He is a member of the editorial board of a prestigious journal - the International Communications Journal.

He played a pivotal role in the processes that led to the creation of the policy and legal environment that characterises the current dynamic communications industry in South Africa, the continent and the world.

His leadership role contributed in a meaningful manner in the restructuring of the communications organisations such as Telkom, SABC, Post Office and others.

Mr Ngcaba is an active member of many international communications organizations and commissions such as the International Telecommunications Union, Internet Corporation for the Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN), E-Africa Commission, G8-Dot Force etc.

He is a scholar and he dedicates his life to the advancement of knowledge. He served, for example, in the Council of the University of South Africa and he is currently an advisor of the Digital Inclusion at Harvard University Law School.

He is the founder of the Institute for Software and Satellite Applications (ISSA) and the Centre for Development of Information and Telecommunications Policy (CDITP).

He is the Co-Chairperson of the Presidential Commission on Information Society.

He has achieved many awards in recognition of his service and contribution to the development of science and communications technology. In 1993 the Computer Society of South Africa bestowed Andile Ngcaba with an award as the best computer person of the year. In 2001 he achieved the Eastern Cape Information Technology award. In the years 1999 and 2000 he scooped the Black Information Technology achiever's award.

4. Mr Khaya Ngqula

Mr Khaya Ngqula is the CEO of Industrial Development Corporation, and an outstanding example of a thriving businessman who has come from the Province of the Eastern Cape and the University of Fort Hare.

Khaya Ngqula joined the IDC as Managing Director in February 1997. Before that he was Managing Director of Norwich Unit Trust who business he helped grow from 23 million South African Rands to over 1,2 billion South African Rands in just under three and half years. Khaya started his career at IBM in New York in 1981. In 1986 he was promoted to Administrative Assistant to the IBM CEO. Khaya also held a senior management position at South African Breweries (SAB) before joining Norwich Life.

Since joining IDC in 1997, Khaya has spearheaded the unprecedented improvement in both the financial performance and position of this organisation. Loans and equity has doubled over the past four years from approximately 230 per annum to more than 500 per annum. Capital and reserves has grown from 18,5 billion Rands as at December 2000 to more than 24 billion Rands as at December 2001. Khaya also led the IDC negotiation team in the unbundling and restructuring of Iscor. The total value of the transaction was in the excess of 10 billion Rands and this was the biggest steel transaction in South African steel history. The restructuring of Iscor Steel and Kumba mining resulted in the companies becoming the most sought after investment in the world.

Khaya is well placed nationally, an astute businessman, and is extremely influential on issues of transformation within the economy, development and empowerment. In the view of many in the region he has been a shining model and is an advocate of development and empowerment in the new era. He is tremendously enthusiastic on

transformation and growth within the region and Fort Hare. Recently, in Port Elizabeth, he was one of the provincial awardees being involved in economic development in areas across the Province stretching from Port Elizabeth through to Port St. Johns. He has been involved in development of his Alma Mater the University of Fort Hare through fundraising, encouraging the establishment of a chair of the SA Savings Institute and promoting funding for Post Graduate research.

Currently he is the Chairperson of Foskor Group and African Media Entertainment and finally, he sits on the board of directors of Worldwide Investment Holdings, Engen South Africa, and Iscor.

5. Mrs Masechele Khaketla

Caroline Khaketla was born in Lesotho in 1918. She completed both her primary and junior education in Lesotho before travelling to the University of Fort Hare; where she matriculated in 1937 and went on to obtain a Bachelor of Arts Degree (1940) and Diploma in education (1941).

In the late 1960's she co-founded, Iketseseng Primary School in Maseru with the intention of setting standards for primary education in Lesotho. The school became so famous that it was upgraded to a secondary school. She is among the first renowned Sesotho writers with twelve publications to her credit. These include drama, poetry and short stories. She also contributed a chapter in the "Teaching of Southern Sotho" (edited by James Walton).

Throughout her life, Mrs Khaketla has fought for the rights of women. Her passion for Women's rights is reflected in many of her books and she is herself an embodiment of Women's rights, by pushing the frontiers of Women's rights in her life. Among her outstanding achievements is that she was the first Mosotho woman in Lesotho to obtain a university degree and later the first woman to be appointed assessor of the Lesotho High court. She broke ground again by being awarded an Honorary Degree by the National University of Lesotho.

6. John Kgoana Nkadameng

John Kgoana Nkadameng was born in 1927 to a family of five in Sekhukhuniland at Mangwaneng village where he spent his childhood years. He lost his father when he was a toddler and grew up in the care of his uncle, Chief Sepeke Nkadameng who he credits for his formative education. He completed Standard VI at Jane Furse Anglican School. From an early age, Nkadameng had to fend for himself. He began work as a domestic worker for a rich Jewish family that owned a clothing company in 1944. His summary dismissal from employment a year later for frivolous reasons introduced him to trade union politics. It was while working for the Rand Tobacco Company that his political baptism came by way of a struggle for higher wages. He won the struggle but paid dearly with his job, which he lost in the name of downsizing. He later joined the

African National Congress and became its active operative at branch level.

In 1951, Nkadimeng joined the Defiance Campaign and signed and up in the ANC led effort at publicly renouncing the introduction of the first part of racist legislation that over the next decades became the cornerstone of apartheid rule. In 1955, he and others formed the South African Congress of Trade Unions (Sactu). Sactu was to become the vanguard of South Africa's trade union activities, mobilising the international community for support of the worker's struggle in South Africa. He served as the organizations Executive Committee Member from its inception till 1990. Simultaneously during this period, Nkadimeng also served as National Executive Committee Member of the African National Congress. In December 1956, was one of the 156 Congress Leaders arrested for high treason, the marathon trial known as Treason Trial and he was one of the last 28 that was released in 1960.

He shuttled between Swaziland, Mozambique, Botswana and Lesotho on ANC underground errands during the dark years of apartheid rule and was imprisoned for two years in 1964. He was charged for sabotage, but when this charge could not stand he was charged for ANC activism.



Following the unbanning of political organizations in 1990, Nkadimeng led the ANC's 12 Aside Team for peace talks with Inkatha Freedom Party in Kwa-Zulu Natal. His delegation included President Thabo Mbeki, Deputy President Jacob Zuma, Minister of Intelligence Joe Nhlanhla and Minister of Local Government Sydney Mufamadi. The ANC further assigned Nkadimeng to the ANC Organising Committee for Elections from 1990 to 1994.

After South Africa's overwhelmingly successful first democratic elections in 1994, Nkadimeng was elected into parliament and later recalled by President Nelson Mandela for a diplomatic assignment as South Africa's Ambassador to Cuba

Currently Executive Director of Zonkizizwe Investments (Pty) Ltd, this proud husband and father of six continues the fight for empowerment of his people through his black-owned empowerment investment company whose strategic positioning is accessing and leveraging investment opportunities across a wide range of South African business sectors.

7. Joseph Rajaratnam

Joseph Rajaratnam is the group executive of the Centre For Learning in Telkom South Africa. He is responsible for all employees and Human Resource development programmes for all employees of the company. He was seconded to Telkom South Africa on the 14th May 1997 when Telkom Malaysia together with its consortium partner SBCI of the United States formed a joint -Venture Company called Thintana Communications and became the strategic equity partner of Telkom South Africa.

Mr. Rajaratnam as the co-chairperson of the Thintana Corporate Citizenship Committee worked tirelessly with the office of the Vice Chancellor in ensuring the successful planning and implementation of the Thintana Technology Centre Project that carried a grant of R 5 million from Thintana Communications. The project provided for the upgrading of the network infrastructure for the entire campus and the establishment of six new computer laboratories with a total of 350 computers, for both undergraduate and post graduate studies, for the benefit of students who will pass through the university.

His career in the telecommunications industry spans over 36 years and has had a major role in the development of the Telecommunications networks, products and services in Malaysia since 1964. He has served as director to numerous Telekom Malaysia subsidiary companies and sits on the board of Telekom South Africa and a number of its committees.

Mr Rajaratnam is a Chartered Electrical Engineer: MIEE (UK), MIEM (Malaysia). In 1983 he was awarded the AMS by the Sultan of Selangor for his service to the state of Selangor, Malaysia. In 1995 he was awarded the K.M.N. by the Federal Government of Malaysia for his services to the country.



8. Nosimo Balindlela

Former President of the South African Women's association (Alice branch) in 1983. Nosimo Balindlela is a phenomenal woman of many achievements.

She is well renowned for her numerous contribution to the Education scene of South Africa. She received her Bachelor's degree from the University of Fort Hare in the Eastern Cape in 1976. She then taught in a teacher's college for a few years. Thereafter she obtained her Master's degree in Early Childhood Education from Columbia University Teachers College in New York, USA after which she acquired her Honours degree in Psychology in Transkei in 1987.

She then opted to give back her knowledge as a lecture in Education psychology at the university of Transkei after which she worked her way through different institutions to her current position as Member of the Executive council in the department of Sport, Recreation, Arts and Culture in the Eastern Cape Province.

She published different works to help aid the growing society of South Africa, among her works are: The Journal of South African Association for Early childhood education, 1982 which deals with child education and The Journal of Nursing Association, 1983 which deals with early intervention programmes in Education.

DOCTOR'S DEGREE DOCTOR OF SCIENCE IN STATISTICS

GUDRUN ANITA HEEREN - A PROFILE:

Gudrun Anita Heeren grew up in German, where she received her first degrees as a Technical Draftsman and later studied Medicine at the Universities Heidelberg and Berlin. She continued her education in computer science at the Computer Institute in Wiesbaden, Germany.

She arrived in South Africa and worked first with the Department of National Health in the Department of Epidemiology and later at the Medical Research Council.

Three years later she went to the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, London, UK, where she obtained her Master of Science. After returning to SA in 1995 she first started working at the University of Natal in Durban and later joined the Department of Public Health at Cecilia Makiwane Hospital.

Her doctoral thesis is: "AGRICULTURAL CHEMICAL EXPOSURE AND BIRTH DEFECTS IN THE EASTERN CAPE". The research is focusing on rural African women. Since this is the first work of its kind done in a developing country, this work is seen as a milestone. Miss Heeren is a Permanent Residence of South Africa since 1991.

Ms Heeren is single and has one son aged 9.

CHRISTIAAN MAURITZ MURRAY LANDMAN - A PROFILE:

Christiaan Mauritz Murray Landman was born in Somerset East on 27 October 1950. He attended primary school at Waterford, a farm school in the Jansenville district and matriculated at Jansenville High School in 1969.

After working for a number of years in a local bank, he saved sufficient money to enroll at the University of Stellenbosch where he completed his BSc. Agric. degree, majoring in Animal Science at the same University in 1978.

He started his career as researcher in the Department of Agriculture at Grootfontein Agricultural College and in 1981 obtained his MSc. degree, entitled "Nitrogen utilisation by young Angora goats".

His doctoral thesis, entitled "VOEDINGSTRES INDIKATORE AS MAATSTAF VAN VOEDINGSPEIL IN BOKKE" (*Capra hircus hircus*) (Nutritional stress indicators in



goats] provides an objective evaluation of a wide range of indirect measures of feeding level in goats. This has eliminated speculation in this field and also opened the possibility to develop new methods for the measurement of nutritional status. One of the external examiners regarded this study as a reference work on the subject of nutritional stress and the ways in which the magnitude of its influence of the performance of goats can be measured.

Mr. Landman is married to Jessica and has two sons.

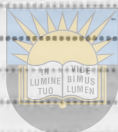
