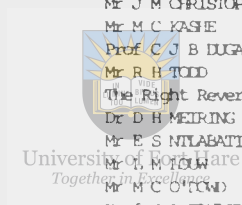

AMENDED RULES FOR THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF EDUCATION

Delete Rules E 11, E 12 and E 14 on pages Edu 16 and 17 and insert the following :

E.11 Admission

- (a) A student shall not be admitted as a candidate for the degree unless he:
 - (i) has obtained an approved Bachelor's degree and a post-graduate teacher's diploma or an approved four year composite degree in Education or an approved Bachelor's degree and any other approved teacher's diploma or certificate; and
 - (ii) has at least two years teaching experience; and
 - (iii) passes a written admission test, which may include an interview.
- (b) Specific admission requirements apply to certain papers. Students must acquaint themselves with these requirements before registration.



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E.12 Duration

- (a) The full-time curriculum shall extend over at least one academic year and not more than two academic years.
- (b) The part-time curriculum shall extend over at least one academic year and not more than two academic years.

E.14 Examination

- (a) Examination
 - (i) Examinations for full-time students will be written in two block periods.
 - (ii) All examinations for part-time students will be written during the January/February sessions.
 - (iii) All examination papers will be three hour papers.
 - (iv) In order to be admitted to the examination in any paper, a student shall have obtained a year mark of at least 40 per cent in that paper.

- (v) There shall be a subminimum of 40 per cent for each examination paper written.
- (vi) In order to pass a student shall obtain a combined year mark and examination mark of at least 50 per cent in each of the six papers.
- (vii) A student shall not qualify for the award of the degree unless he completes all the papers prescribed in Rule E.13 (Curriculum).
- (viii) Re-examination without reattending the course will only take place at the next academic year's sessions and the previous year's mark will be used in determining the final mark notwithstanding the provision of Rule G.12.
- (ix) Re-examination will be allowed in a maximum of three papers.
- (b) Distinction : A student shall pass with distinction if he obtains 75 per cent or more in at least four papers in the examination.

Determination of Year Study

- (1) A student shall be deemed to be in his first year of study until he has obtained credit for the two Music Courses; in his third year of study when he is taking courses which enable him to complete the requirements of that year of study; otherwise he shall be deemed to be in his second year of study.
- (2) A candidate shall be deemed to be in his final year of study when he is engaged on all the options of his final year course or when he has obtained credits in these final-year courses, but has still to obtain credits in other courses to complete the requirements of the degree.
- (3) A sub-minimum mark is required not only for the two Music Courses, but also for their respective components.
